

SCOOT CROSS AND TURN


Starting Formation(s): Box circulate Foursome or Parrallel Ocean waves with boys facing in. From right hand box, with the boys facing in and the girls facing out, All Scoot Back, Girls then pull by with right hands extending the left to the boys who reach back and to the right for a courtesy Turn. (Ends in Facing Lines if started in parallel waves, or ends in an Eight Chain Thru if started from columns.) Timing 10-12.



TAX INFORMATION for Clubs & Organizations..

We are all well aware of the fact that income tax time is not too far away, and the question has been asked how some of the clubs are reporting the revenue paid to their callers/cuers. Vic/Peg Wills (Past Gen. Chr. of the Philadelphia NSDC) wrote about an interesting article published in the TEXAS STAR . It says

the two most frequently asked questions are: Does our Club need to obtain an Employer Identification Number (EIN)? And Do we have to file a Form 1099 on the caller/cuer? The article went on to say that any organization will need an EIN if it has any of the following:


- 1. A Bank Account.
- 2. A Savings Account.
 - 3. A certificate of Deposit.
 - 4. Pays an individual \$600 or more per year for services, and is required to file Form 1099.

To obtain an Employer Identification Number from the IRS, you file a Form SS-4 with the IRS Center. If a question does not apply, write in the space N/A. To obtain a blank form SS-4, call toll free 1-800-442-1040 & ask for one to be mailed or stop in at your local IRS office.

The article goes on to say that if the caller/cuer is paid \$600 during a calendar year, a Form 1099 should be filed....for each person it pays \$600 or more. Failure to file can result in a penalty.

NOTES FROM GRANNY'S HOUSE. SLEEVES

Sleeves have taken on a new look this season. Full, soft longer, graceful and flattering to every arm.

One of the prettiest I have seen and made, I call the ultra puff. Being a fashion narrator one can take liberties nam-

ing things.



This sleeve is easy to make. The first step is a sleeve pattern that fits you well. Remember, a longer sleeve must not bind when you raise your arm. Lay the sleeve pattern on a piece of paper and draw your new pattern. See example:



The new lengths are being worn at the elbow, 3/4 of the way past the elbow or just about three inches above the wrist. Very puffy. Once you have your pattern made you have the choice of which length suits you.

After you have drawn the length desired — cut out the paper pattern. Place new pattern on your fabric and cut two sleeves. The top of the sleeve is gathered to fit the dress or blouse armhold. The bottom is then gathered or drawn in with elastic. The bottom can also be gathered, hemmed and trimmed with lace or a self ruffle. This same technique applies to all three lengths.



For a trim and dressy look, the 3/4 straight sleeve with wide lace or self ruffle, should not be overlooked.

The purpose of a Round Dance Rating System is to provide for rating round dances according to complexity. The system should be one that can be readily used and understood by all those involved in Round Dancing.

In 1985, ROUNDALAB adopted the "ROUNDALAB Phase Rating System". This system identifies a dance relative to the ROUNDALAB Phases with a plus of no more than two to indicate steps in a dance in Phases beyond the Basic Rating or unphased steps. For example: ROUNDALAB Phase 11 + 2 would indicate a dance including ROUNDALAB Phase 1 & 11 figures but with two figures in Phases above Phase 11. Since the system is simplified and leaves little room for error the committee feels each choreographer should assume the responsibility of rating his or her own dance before publication...but it can easily be accomplished by any person using the ROUNDALAB material.

At the recent ROUNDALAB Convention in AL more figures were placed in the Phases. The committee realizes there are still figures that have not as yet been phases and that this will be an ongoing project. Presently there are Six Phases in Round Dancing. The 1986 Phase Rating System pamphlet – an alphabetical compilation of figures in the Six Phases, enabling all interested persons to rate dances is now available from the ROUNDALAB office.3 Churchill Road, Cresskill, NJ 07626.

ROUNDALAB will hold its 10th annual Convention in Indianapolis, IN June 22-24, 1986. A Round Dance Teachers Seminar-Clinic will be held on Wednesday, June 25. While primarily for R/D teachers, any interested dancer, upon payment of the registration fee, may attend. ROUNDALAB will also sponsor a two hour daily seminar at the National S/D Convention in Indianapolis. These seminars will be open to all interested persons who have registered for the NSDC. More information may be secured from the ROUNDALAB office.



Now that fall S/D classes are well along, it might be a good time to measure our tearing efforts against the yardstick of dancer comments on the LEGACY survey.

Dancers consistently have told us that t ginners are being taught (or exposed to) too much, too fast; that a large number of Spring graduates are not prepared to dance in their clubs; & that there is too much rough & discourteous dancing. All of these are correctible in a class which is of sufficient length & well taught.

Both caller/teachers & club officers should realize that a well-taught dancer is more apt than a poorly taught dancer to find success and pleasu in the S/D world, &, therefore more apt to be a longer term dancer. It is short-sighted to graduate dancers who are almost certain to become confus & frustrated and to drop out of S/D. It is equally short-sighted for clu officers to insist upon a hurry-up course of instruction and early graduation just to increase the size of a club & its treasury. What all teach ers & club officers should be promoting in classes is the development of happy, long-term dancers who will be contributing to the club for many years. LEGACY encourages caller/teachers and club officers to teach not only the basic steps and maneuvers of S/D, but also to take time to teach the beginning dancer proper styling, proper dress, courtesies of square dancing, history and heritage, club responsibilities, and other important, non-choreographic subjects which contribute so much to the pleasure and friendliness of square dancing.

From all over we hear of the need to stop pushing class members - to give them time to relax & enjoy the Basic & Mainstream Programs before pushing them into the Plus Program. CROSSFIRE echoed LEGACY's concern, devoting much thought to this subject...as will CALLERLAB in March. But Dancers - Officers - Teachers - Y O U may be part of the problem. Make a New Year Resolution n o w to start right now to correct this problem.

CROSSFIRE - preliminary report:

About 55 leaders met in Dillard, GA, at our own expense, to come up with possible solutions to the many concerns that have been expressed about the S/D activity. To give focus to our discussion, a concept of a wheel was developed. At the HUB was the purpose & reason for our activity with the definition, "Square Dancing offers people a wholesome recreational option that stresses friendliness, cooperation and equality."

Spokes in this wheel were narrowed down to: new dancers (beginner Classes); clubs (veteran dancers, sociability); support organizations; programs (music, style, programs); callers, cuers, prompters; communications; leadership/education; facilities/cost.

Solutions & suggestions were to be the rim-the grease to keep the wheel rolling. No concrete resolutions emerged for every area is different, but many on the rim can be adapted to fit the area.

Major suggestions included: 1- Classes 25-30 weeks long (perhaps 60 calls) & include teaching of courtesy, styling, history, costumes, smooth dancing; 2- Stagger classes so all do not begin in Jept.; 3- Resist the rush to new programs. CALLERLAB wants dancers to dance at MS regularly for one year before moving on to another program. Not to push dancers to new programs; 4- have more MS clubs. Buddy system for new dancers; 5- establish a recreational dance program of perhaps 22 basics for those who cannot get fully involved. A feeder program; 6--Emphasize clubs have "purse power" to be sure a caller follows the prescribed program; 7- better training for callers, cuers-with steps for certification. A continuing Ed program with possible proof of this certification. Develop scholarships for better training; 8- Dancer mobility created with the programs in that dancers may visit other areas with confidence; (continued on page 18)



Many dancers will tell you that "challenge exists at any dance program," but some refuse to believe that dancing exists in the Challenge program. Let us share an experience from the National Advanced & Challenge Convention this summer that convinced us that CHALLENGE DANCING IS DANCING.

"We're going to dance to Winchester tapes at midnight," the couple from

Massachusetts told us. "Come and watch if you'd like."

What's a Winchester (no comments, computer people!)? It's a who -- Stan Winchester from North Carolina, who records singers using C-3 calls. Because of the extensive effort required to prepare these singers (exact timing of the sometimes complex movements is crucial), this man only calls on tape & not live. These dancers apparently thought highly of him & were enthusiastic over the opportunity to dance to these tapes at a convention featuring many "name" callers.

we entered the hall & saw 6 or 7 sets eagerly anticipating the challenge of dancing to Stan's latest tape. After a minute of two for tape adjustment, the dancing began and those Challenge stereotypes (solemn faces engaged in military drill) started to disappear as well. The calls may have sounded unfamiliar, the movements a bit strange, but these squares were dancing as though they were at a Mainstream or Plus dance. All the styling elements that cynics think disappear at this level were there:swings, twirls, "proper" do-sa-dos. Except for a few same-sex promenades that dancers were warned may happen (and were correct), the uninitiated wouldn't have known there was a difference in program, such was the FUN evident on the floor.

Although we have been Challenge for four years now (though not the level danced here), we too have wondered at times whether we're dancing or drilling. This one hour settled the issue for us. If you get a chance to attend a multi-level convention, take a break & visit the Challenge Hall. Perhaps you'll see for yourself what we learned that late night: The combination of proper styling, smooth choreography and good danceable music equals FUN -- AT ANY PROGRAM!!!!! 




