NNJSDA BLOOD BANK NEWS

The number of donors we have been able to obtain from each club has been too small to warrant the Red Cross setting up a special donor date just for that club. Thus we have been forced to ask our members to participate in nearby open, community drives. Every month as we get the location of BLOOD DRIVES, letters are sent to the area club presidents, giving the date, time and location of the Blood Drive. Members area asked to donate, under our group #9192, and let us know.

To make it easier to disseminate the information, a flyer is being distributed at the Delegate's Meeting with all the information needed, except the date and location. That vital info will be mailed monthly to club presidents in the hopes they will enter the proper dates, etc. & publicize the drives at their dances, in their newslatter, etc.

While it is sometimes possible (but never desirable) to run a club's business with a few volunteers. it's totally impossible to run a Blood program with only a few people participating. If we can get some dancers to volunteer to be part of a committee to help set up donor dates, with groups of clubs participating together on a regular basis, that could make the whole process more personal and social. But, since the bottom line is we need blood, and need it now, we can only hope that the club leadership will do all they can to publicize the program and encourage donations.

SEWING NOTES FROM GRANNY'S HOUSE.

AVE A PIT, YOU DESERVE IT! ritting is not altering, it is more of an adjustment of your outfit to your filture!

SCRE FINE TOINTS.

Be sure the underthings you are wearing for the fitting are the same ones you will be wearing with the finished garment.

GTEP 1. Your garment must always be fitted on the wrong side. Stand erect before a full length mirror, in good light. Check side seams first, are straight and even? If not this will be your first adjustment. Your waistline must be balanced evenly. A simple

measure is to tie a piece of string around your natural waistline, over the garment. Raise or lower the seam at the front or back as needed.

STEF 2. Shoulder line and sleeves. Do the sleeves hang smoothly from the shoulder? Do they touch the natural shoulder line of your body? If not, adjust by raising or lowering the sleeve in the armhole setting.

STEP 3. Allow your full or circle skirted dress to hang evenly on a padded hanger, unhemmed for two or three days. This allows the bias of your skirt to fall more evenly. If you are one of the lucky persons

who has someone to mark your hem for you, then proceed with this method. However, there are many of us who have to depend on ones self. I have devised this method, it's simple and effective.

STOP4. Locate a table you can stand next to. Mark with a pin the spot on the skirt that touches the table. Turn, marking each new spot with a pin. Continue around until you have marked the entire area. Remove the dress carefully. Measure from pins down to the length you wish. Hem as usual.



WHAT'S THIS I HEAR ABOUT

NEW CALLERLAB PROGRAMS?

For several years the S/D world has been very concerned about drop-outs, club-to-class transition problems, etc. Leaders

have met to seek solutions. From these meetings have come the thought that the current CALLERLAB Mainstream Program of 68 families (suggested 41 sessions of $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ hours) may be longer than some areas can handle. An alternative entry level program that can be taught in 25 weeks has been suggested. From intensive work at 1986 CALLERLAB Convention came a mandate to develop suitable entry programs with a shortened "Learn to Dance".

In areas where the current MS Program is alive and well, they suggest ${\tt NO}$ CHANGE - just "Keep up the good work".

In areas where MS is the predominant dance program upon graduation, a suggestion - use a shortened MS program with fewer moves that can be learned in 25 weeks, with other moves deferred for subsequent workshopping. The basics that could be taught effectively in 25 weeks referred to as "Bold Face Type Basics"; the deferred as "Italicized Face Type Basics". The proposed plan- teach the Bold Face Type Basics first in the 25 weeks. Dancers will have reached a destination where they can join clubs in their area USING JUST THESE MOVEMENTS. Some areas may choose to workshop the deferred moves in subsequent dances/workshops.

In areas where the predominant dance program includes some number of calls from the existing Plus Program, a shortened MS program with fewer moves that can be taught in 25 weeks and which may include some Plus Calls is suggested. This, too, is a DESTINATION Program and $\underline{\text{NOT}}$ a Stepping Stone.

A "Community Dance Program" is geared towards a limited repertoire of calls that can be effectively taught in a 6 week time frame. This, too, is a DESTINATION Program, NOT a Stepping Stone to some other existing program. It is for those who do not wish to devote their time and energies to learning the MS Program but rather want a system of social outlets for recreation and exercise.

As these programs are completed, callers & dance leaders will be advised and they will be made available to ALL interested persons through the CALLERLAB Home Office. CALLERLAB emphasizes that NONE of these proposals is designed to replace the current MS Program in areas where it is now working. "IF IT AIN'T BROKE, DON'T FIX IT."

It also stresses that NO Program will work magic. It is not the lists that cause problems, but rather the dance and caller leaders that use or fail to use the designed programs. By working together for a common good, we will be able to strengthen the entire movement of square dancing in all of its forms. People CAN and DO make the difference. Let's make it work for ALL of US!


So, you want to become a caller?

Many of the most accomplished callers are convinced that a pre-requisite of no less than 3 years of dancing is necessary before a person takes the plunge into calling. "It's not all as glamourous as it might appear," one caller veteran of 30 years said. "If it were just a case of standing in front of the microphone and singing a memorized call to a familiar tune, a person could probably handle it with no dancing background at all. But to understand the responsibilities of the caller/teacher and to sense what it's like to be on the receiving end of the calling, there's no substitute for being out on the floor, dancing, reacting, learning and growing in one's ability as a dancer."

Once, having been motivated to call, having discussed the pros and cons with members of the family, weighing the advantages against the sacrifices, you begin to realize that a commitment to becoming a caller is not to be taken lightly. As an example, for every two hours of calling in front of the mike, many callers spend 5 hours of planning, practicing and programming prior to each dance.

The apprentice system of learning is one of the oldest, proven learning methods. Popular today are the callers' schools. If you are thinking of becoming a caller, why not talk it over with your caller, your local callers association or you may write CALLERLAB.

Some recommend "get your feet wet before you enroll in a callers' school ..." Trying your wings can tell you rather quickly if you want to go further. Others feel that signing up for a caller education program first to insure good calling habits is a better way to go. The right stuff is a combination of natural ability plus a willingness to work and study hard. There is always a need for individuals who, putting the activity first & themselves second, will contribute to the future of American Square Dancing.







