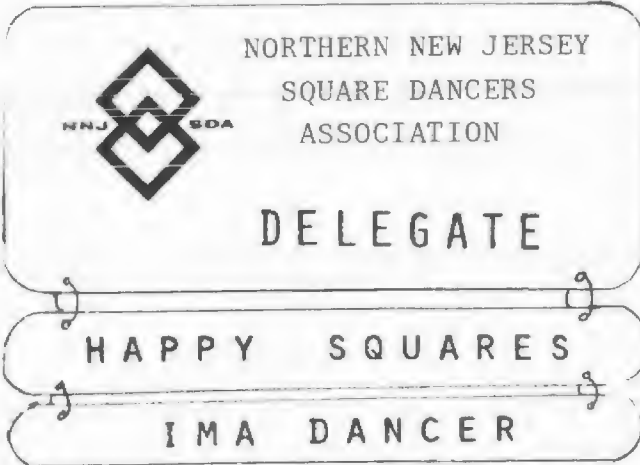


### BLOOD BANK

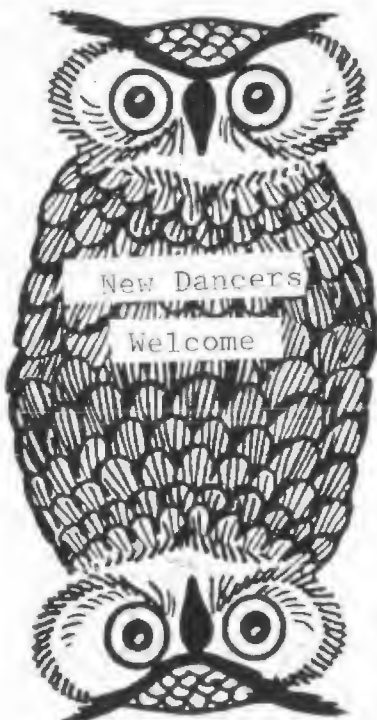

From a well-known travelling man come these serious questions: "Where would we who travel be without the home club caller? Who would train dancers to make our trips possible? Who would put the material we create into actual practice? Who would encourage the area dancers to dance to us when we come to town if it weren't for the caller-on-the-spot?"

Undoubtedly some club callers have been discouraged when they have spent countless months in teaching classes and preparing new dancers for the pleasures of club dancing, sometimes with minimal financial returns, only to have a "big-name" caller come to town and receive a high fee and glowing publicity for a one-time appearance.

If he'll think back, our local club caller will remember the times his dancers have come up to him to say, "You know, if it weren't for you we wouldn't be here having fun today. They've brought in a caller we've never danced to before but you taught us so that we can dance to any caller. He's just as great as you said he was. But, confidentially, you're still our favorite!"

Sometimes dancers may forget to tell their caller these things. Occasionally callers themselves are overly sensitive. But, remember this, the success of any program in American Square Dancing depends to a great degree upon the callers and teachers at the local level. They are the heros, the "Stars" in this game of square dancing. At the same time, it is the wise club caller who recognizes the fact that he is merely the link that brings together the dancer and his activity, square dancing.

Any caller's true reward cannot be based alone upon dollar value or upon applause. He gets his thanks by a feeling of accomplishment, by recognizing the fact that he has contributed to the happiness of those he has taught and called for.

# CALLERLAB

The International Association  
of Square Dance Callers

A monumental task developing a program designed for those who have requested a 25-Week LEARN to DANCE Program using the most popular calls from the Mainstream & Plus

Programs was developed by a Special Committee chaired by Red Bates. Calls from the MS or Plus lists which are not included should be taught through workshops following the formal instruction period. This program is designed as a "feeder" program for Plus clubs. Individual modifications to suit local conditions are anticipated. NO effort should be made to pressure anyone into teaching with this experimental program unless the sponsoring organization makes that decision. 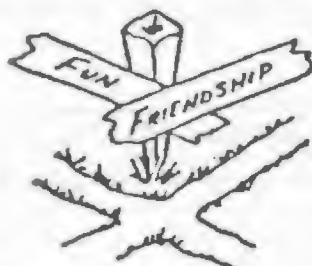

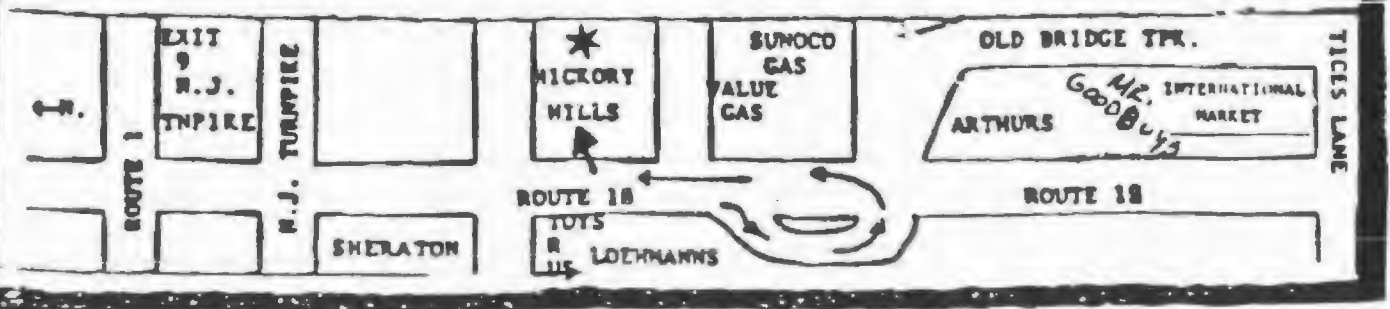

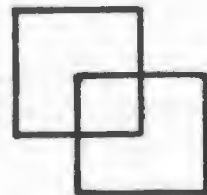

## EMERGENCY CALL for MEDICAL AID

The following was introduced at the National S/D Convention in Baltimore in 1984.....

1. When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
2. Remaining couples join hands and take a step BACKWARDS. This will allow the injured person and attendant air and room.
3. Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
4. On seeing this signal, the caller or hall monitor will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

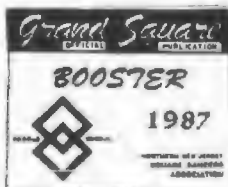

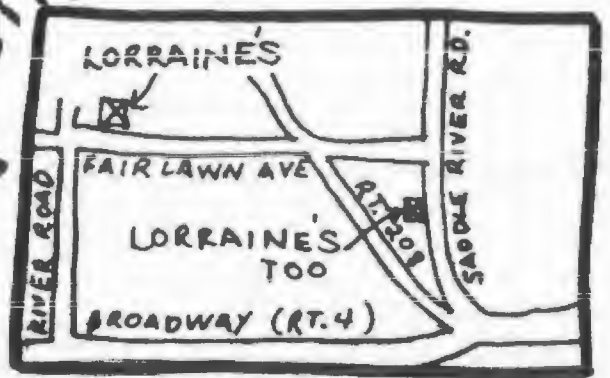

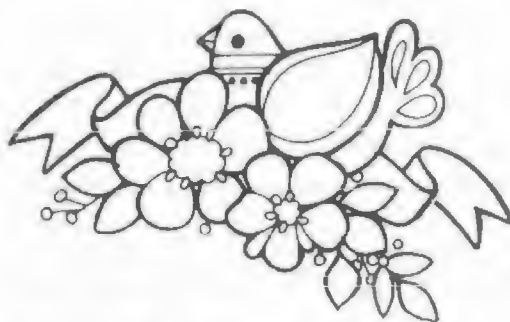

# AS I SEE IT

BOB OSGOOD - LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

Something to ask yourself: Does square dancing have a "star" system? Some seem to think that it does. Others say "no." If there is a "star" system, who are the stars?

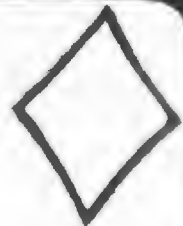
When you stop to look closely at the S/D picture you discover the emphasis is, as it should be, in the local club. A great number of these club dancers may never dance anywhere but with their own group of friends. Consequently, the person who taught them to dance is their "hero"...their "star." He is the one who introduced the activity to them and who, in their eyes, is "Mr. Square Dancing." Try to tell them differently and you're in for an argument. Mention the name of an outstanding traveling caller and they may give you a blank stare. Tell them of some topnotch recording caller and they're likely to come back with, "Who needs records? We have our caller -- in person!"

If there were to be a "star" in the activity, it would have to be the club caller. When he does his job successfully, supplying the needs of the dancers in his community, training new dancers, retaining the old ones, providing variety within the programs that please the great majority, then he is the "super star."

What then is the place of the traveling caller and of the recording artist? They provide inspiration for the area callers. But, while the local club caller/leader is dependent upon them for inspiration, the reverse is also true. (continued on page 55)

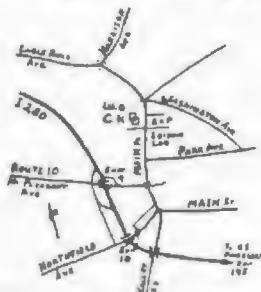

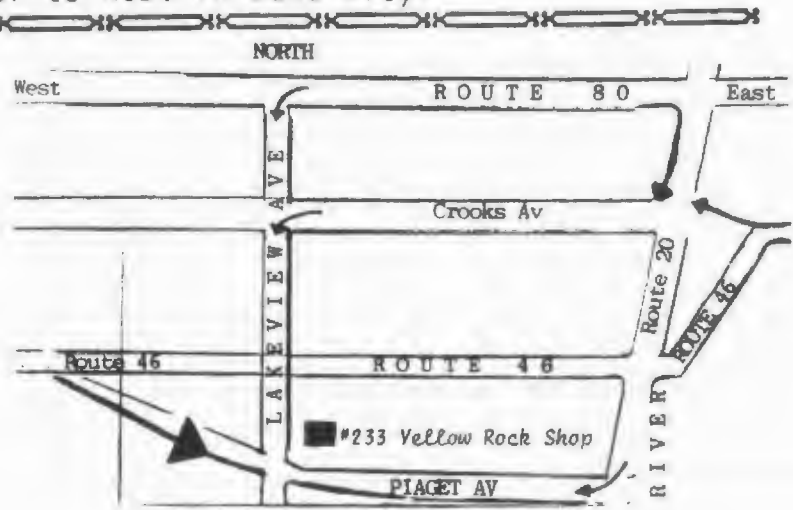

Dangles are very much a part of the S/D world. Every club has its own special badge which members proudly wear. Little discs (dangles) can be earned for a variety of reasons. Usually each dangle has a line drawing denoting its reason. Some of the ones NNJSDA awards to dancers include:



1. Awarded by NNJSDA to graduates of member clubs with perfect class attendance; class administrators keep the records. Given out at graduation.
2. All current grads who attend 8 of 10 NNJSDA summer dances become FREE-LOADERS. Awarded at the last summer dance, recipients are entitled to a certain number of free admissions to NNJSDA dances in an 18 month period.

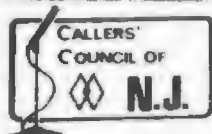

# As I Saw It - BOB OSGOOD - LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

Just as in the game of golf where there is the all-important "duffer," or the occasional bowler, sailor and amateur sportsman, so also are there those who come into square dancing for some simple, uncomplicated enjoyment. To keep them in square dancing we must stop somewhere -- give them a basic set of rules and say, "This is it. Learn how to do these and you can have evening after evening of friendly enjoyment."

However when you say, "Learn these as fast as you can, for as soon as you learn them there will be more, and more, and more..." then see how many people we are able to keep in square dancing.

Every person who comes into the activity and gets discouraged is probably lost to square dancing forever. That fact alone is disastrous enough but unhappily it doesn't stop there. The bad publicity resulting from one unhappy dancer is virtually impossible to repair.

Somewhere in the list of basics is a point to which an individual may wish to progress. There are also those dancers who have the time and inclination to dance more often. By their very hi-frequency they want and are able to master more material. That's great too. It's a large and growing activity and, let's face it, we're not all the same when it comes to preferences and time flexibility. These enthusiasts include many who have been great boosters for the activity. Now their enjoyment stems partially from the use of more basics and, because of the greater frequency of their dancing, they are able to master more than just the foundation material.

It's important to understand that no judgement be placed on a person's ability simply because of how he decides to progress. Many who could master any fundamental actually prefer to be low-frequency dancers. This is their prerogative and should in no way reflect on their ability. There are hi-frequency dancers. Fine, but again it does not prove they are better dancers simply because they dance more often.<sup>1</sup>

We have paraphrased an article Bob Osgood wrote in 1960.



Classes have turned out many thousands of dancers. Many who felt comfortable with square dancing stayed. Others looked for a "home" in the activity but, finding none that fit them, moved on. There's no telling how many might have stayed if they had found places to dance that met their particular "frequency" requirements.

Dancers, concerned about the state of square dancing, last year took their concerns to Callerlab. As a result, three new programs designed for quicker access into the activity have been produced. Two of them, one that offers a quick entry into Mainstream and a second that speeds up the new dancer's entry into the Plus program, have been completed.

A third program, responding to the need for an uncomplicated form of the activity, could very easily aid in the recruitment and retention of many hundreds of non-dancers. This Community Dance Program is designed to be taught in six 2-hour lessons. It is loaded with realistic possibilities and features unlimited variety, yet it contains only 24 basics. With the support of capable and experienced callers, backed by strong dancer leadership, it's very possible that these new programs could lead to that upswing of square dancing that we've been promising ourselves.

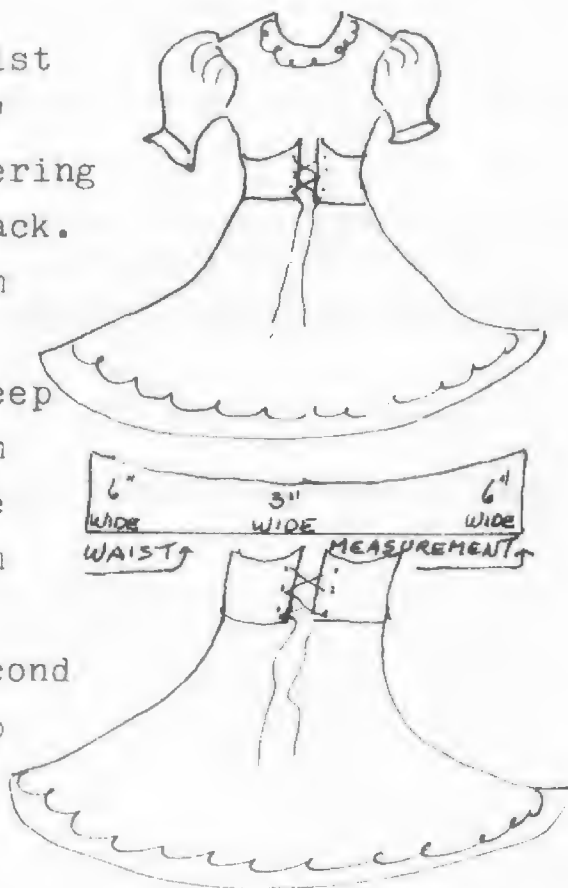


## NOTES FROM GRANNY'S HOUSE

Freshen up an older Square Dance outfit with a new belt. Try a Tyrolean girdle belt. This is also nice for a blouse and skirt combo as it keeps the blouse neatly in place.

### Directions:

1. Cut a paper pattern to your waist measurements. This should be 6" wide in front and gradually tapering down to 3" around the sides & back.
2. Cut three (3) layers of buckram and two (2) of your fabric.
3. Stitch buckram together, (to keep from slipping). Now sew buckram onto the wrong side of one piece of cotton. Trim buckram to seam edge, clip curve and press.
4. With right sides out, baste second piece of fabric in place and top stitch, folding in raw edges as you go. Turn in front edge and stitch. Punch eyelets up front edge and lace belt with a fancy shoelace.

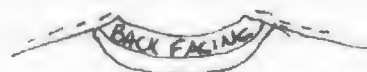


### Finishing touches:

So often a neckline facing does not stay where it belongs, inside the dress!

Next time, try a "Stitch in the Ditch," using the shoulder seams as your ditch.

Machine stitch on the right side with matching thread right along the seam, thus anchoring the facing. This works well on any facing, as long as there is a seam to ditch in.

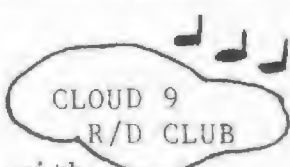

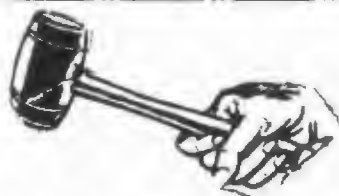

In December, we had more than 19 squares of students and angels at our annual class dance. Joe Fioretti, Dan Koft and Barry Serebnick called for us.

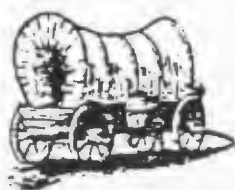
