summer, are all rested up and ready to get into the full swing of our Square Dance season. Are you ready to got into your Square Dance clothes? For those of you who may have gotten too full from not dancing and indulging in too many edible treats, or couldn't pass up a great sale on a dress just a little too small with the hope of losing weight to fit into it, or have inherited a dress just a little too small, here is a solution that I have us d successfully for several friends.

The zipper seam in the center of the back is hiding some extra fabric, hopefully, enough for an extra 12" to 2" in width running the whole length from shoulder

through waist.

Carefully, so as not to rip any fabric or do damage to the zipper, remove the zipper. Next, open the seam below the zipper opening about 6" more. (On most styles this is almost all the way to the skirt ruffle. Try not to open any stitches into this ruffle.) The tiny holes left by the removed stitches can be eradicated somewhat by "scratching" them with your fingernail. Press both sides of the zipper opening out flat.

Norking from the right side of garment, replace the zipper by laying the raw edge of each center back on top of zipper edge and stitching. There is no folding under of any raw edges or covering of zipper teeth in this proceedure. You will have to taper the seam from the bottom of the opening up to the new zipper width. Don't worry about "holes" or "spaces". The new trim should cover thin.

Splect trim similar to trim already on the mass ot least 1 to 2' wide. If your fabric print or texture doesn't show telltale old stitch lines you can use a narrout rim. Buy double the length of the seam you're covering plus extra for turning under raw edges at neck and bottom.

If the new trim won't get snagged in the zipper, stitch it on flat, covering the zipper on each side llow-ing for the zipper slide. It bottom of zipper the two cen-ter edges of new trim must be stitched together flat, covering those aforementioned "holes" or "spaces". Stitch outer odge too. If the new trim might get zinner snagged, try;

1.) not covering zin er tooth at all, just stitch new trim
close enough to not snag; 2.) stitching somm binding (that
matches dress) under both zinner edges of trim; .) iron-on interfacing under sit or od as of tria.

AS I SEE IT BOB OSGOOD -'LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

This month we want to talk with all of you, dancers and caller alike, who are about to embark on a new season of square dance classes. Few phases of our activity deserve more attention, deserve more words of encouragement than the class periods and the metamorphosis of the non-dancer into a happy, enthusiastic regular. Perhaps the reason we place such emphasis on this plateau of the activity is because there is no other phase that deals with so many people.

Somebody once said that the most difficult movement is the movement it takes to get Mr. and Mrs. Average Citizen out of their comfortable chair beside the TV set and through the door of the hall for the first time. If this is so, then the rest of the job should be a snap. We all know square dancing can be an enjoyable recreation; now, during our coming class period, is our opportunity to prove it.

Callers and dancers alike need to understand what the non-dancer is looking for when he comes into that first night of beginners' class. Let's review what we have promised him. Square Dancing is fun!... A friendly activity... Is inexpensive. Failure to deliver on any of these "promises" will cost us potential dancers.

To say that square dancing is fun means that it should be enjoyable From the first day of beginners' class and continue right straight through into club and workshops. The word fun needs to be understood. It refers to the exhilaration of satisfactorily following the calls, of moving to the music, of being able to react automatically, The joy of dancing must be present in the square dance activity if we are to expect the newcomer to "hang in there" and become a member of our community.

Square dancers are friendly. This just doesn't mean that we are friendly to those whom we feel are the quickest to learn, but to ALL those who answer our invitation and come into our classes. Once class time is over the friendliness must continue. Sometimes, when newcomers come to our clubs, we still expect our callers to call for us on the level that we, the club members, have attained. We, perhaps, are impatient with the awkwardness of the new dancer, intolerant sometimes of their inability. However, if we are to retain these potential dancers as future club members we need to take a good long look at our own attitudes. We must make sure that the club is ready to provide the friendly atmosphere we have promised.

Square dancing is inexpensive. When looking at other forms of entertainment, motion pictures, stage shows and nightclubs, square dancing is a tremendous value and it is important that its cost be kept within an acceptable range. (continued on page 47)



Whether this is your first class season coming up or your twenty-first, each new class represents a different composite group personality. There is no stereotyped way of teaching as long as the journey through the learning period is enjoyable and the goal of retaining as many of new dancers as possible is achieved. Remember that class time is not just teaching a collection of basics. It is the transference of knowledge of how to dance, how to move to music, how to listen to the calls. The basics illustrate these things and as a result of attending class the new dancers should know how to move and react automatically to the calls.

It's painful to note that teaching the beginners is sometimes treated as a "chore" and that for this particular responsibility the new caller, the inexperienced teacher, is often the one who gets the assignment. It makes as much sense as saying that the horse that has never been ridden should first be ridden by a person who has never before ridden a horse. There's a proper time and place for the student-caller to practice the art of teaching but it should not be at the expense of the new dancer.

Despite all of this, however, whether you're reasonably new at teaching or are an experienced caller, as you approach your coming class, treat it as something special. Give considerable thought to your preparation. Keep good records of the progress of the class, making notes where trouble spots arise and going back to polish up before progressing. If your new class is a small one rather than the large one you had hoped it might be, don't allow your disappointment to show. Give your dancers just as much enthusiastic teaching, just as much in-depth preparation and just as much individual help and counseling as you might with a capacity crowd. You'll find that your positive attitude will accomplish much and that your present crop of new dancers will become your recruiters for your future classes. (continued on page 48)

Not all classes are alike. Sometimes a group will be brought together that has an unusually fast rate of learning. On other occasions the makeup of the class will require that the caller/teacher go slower, reviewing more frequently and covering the basics less rapidly.

Undoubtedly you are looking forward to the day when the class members can join you in your club dancing--but, be patient. Remember, it's one thing to teach, another to learn. A caller may teach the dancers all they need to know in just a few weeks. However, only by continued repetitive practice will they start to react automatically and truly learn to square dance. The caller needs sufficient time to thoroughly indoctrinate the new dancer. Let him have it.

About Being Helpers

Square Angels are those experienced dancers who help with the new dancers during their class time. If this is to be your opportunity during the coming months, then treat the responsibility with great care.

Remember that each class can have only one caller at a time. Your job is not to teach, to serve as a policeman while a square is in progress or to anticipate what the caller may eventually teach when he feels the time is right. Your job is to fill in a square so that all the new dancers may dance. It means using only those movements and styling points that the caller has already introduced to the group. It means being in the right place at the right time, moving correctly to the beat of the music and executing the basics in their standardized form.

Your manner of dress, your attitudes and your friendliness will serve as an important visible part of the teaching process. Be a good representative of square dancing and you will indeed be "an angel!"

Good luck to you all as this new year of square dancing begins. Make it your personal goal to help open the door of the wonders of square dancing to a new generation of square dancers.

QUARTERLY SELECTIONS

Beginning August 1, 1987, the PLUS quarterly selection is SCOOT AND RELOCATE From a Quarter Tag formation, all SCOOT

BACK. Those coming back to the wave now do a FAN THE TOP. At the same time, those who are now facing out, individually turn to face right (face left if the original wave in the center had been left-handed), Promenade 1/4 way around the square and face in to stand as a couple (Relocate Action).

Proper Usage of Quarterly Selections

- 1. QS call are not a mandatory part of any program. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present.
- 2. QS calls should be verbally mentioned and/or physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance. QS calls are to be used at the caller's discretion.
- 3. Conventions and festivals shall be encouraged to delete quarterly selections from all designated halls. For example, the <u>Mainstream</u> Hall should read MS, not MS + QS or MSQS.



NEW DANCERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

- 1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
- 2. To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.
 - 3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes prior to Graduation.
 - 4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.
 - 5. To instruction and practice with the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call.
- 6. To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.





117 leaders from 42 states & 4 Canadian Provinces met at LEGACY VIII last May in The purpose of LEGACY is to Nashville, TN. provide communication and to understand the operations of all the phases of square dan-

cing in order to promote, protect & perpetuate the future of the activity through mutual understanding & cooperation throughout the world.

Since its inception in 1973 LEGACY Trustees have conducted many Mini-Legacies Leadership Seminars enabling club officers to function more efficiently and enthusiastically; 5 biennial surveys have been taken with the results shared with other organizations; the promotion of S/D Month in September was assumed in the early 1980's with free promotion kits; and leadership seminars at NSDC's have been coordinated & staffed by LEGACY trustees for 5 years in cooperation with the Convention Committees.

Goals for the coming two-year period include -increased efforts in leatraining (Mini-Legacies); develop international contacts & also federation liaisons; initiate process for mediation/arbitration upon request; expand communication with S/D leaders; set guidelines for S/D activity (non-competitive status, dress, etc.); increase efforts toward cooperation with other S/D organizations (CALLERLAB, ROUNDALAB, NEC, USDA, CONTRALAB, etc.); encourage use of free interpretive folder for new dancers; and set up "American Folk Dance" promotional dances in US & Canada.



National Folk Dance Campaign



The campaign to have Congress declare the Square Dance as the American Folk Dance permanently is well underway. At the recent NSDC many signatures were gathered on petitions...which in turn were sent to various Congressmen. But there is still much work to be done.

H.R. 2067, the Bill to have the S/D permanently designated the American Folk Dance of the USA needs 300 Co-sponsors. As of July 20th, it had 83. All dancers are asked to become involved in writing their Congressmen to co-sponsor this bill.

Dancers - please get involved and have relatives and friends also write to their Congressmen to co-sponsor Bill H.R. 2067 and send the letters to Honorable (full name), US House of Representatives, Washington, DC 20515. NJ has 4 co-sponsors Florio, Howard, Dwyer & Guarini; NY has 2 Wortley & Horton (NONEfrom Brooklyn or SI or Long Island or Queens): & PA has 3 - Kostmayer, Shuster & McDade. Come on now, fellow dancers-let's get on the ball and start a writing campaign to get more co-sponsors for this bill. Former NNJSDA president Frank/Nan Habersberger are spearheading this national campaign with locally, Frank/Helen Cavanaugh (113 Stony Rd., Edison, NJ 08817) assisting. If you need petitions, assistance in your letter contact the Cavanaugh's or ye Editors. Together we got the state of NJ to designate S/D its American Folk Dance, let's work on this.

The start of the development of S/D in America can be traced back to 1651, 125 years prior to 1776 when the US was born. This truly American Folk Dance has now over 336 years of History and Heritage. It would be most fitting and proper to commemorate the Bicentennial year with Congress designating permanently the SQUARE DANCE as the American Folk Dance.

Dear Editors

"....We both greatly enjoy dancing & usually do-sa-do 5 times a week. As in camping we have met some of the nicest people. Most square dancers are very friendly & patient people..... In the last few weeks we have come across something that at times ruins an otherwise nice evening of dancing.....We dance Mainstream and search out MS dances....At one MS dance recently the caller called "coordinate" twice. I approached

him & told him that we enjoyed his calling but that we did not dance plus & would appreciate it if he could workshop the call....later he directionally talked us through a call & said, 'that is coordinate' ... and proceeded to call Track Two..... The following week another caller called 9 plus calls. When approached about the dance being MS, the caller's reply was that he was in charge & could call anything that he desired. When the President of the host club was approached & told of the problem his answer was, 'well they got through it anyhow'. It seems that the only way we can let these people know that we are unhappy with their dance program is to ask for our money back, explain why, & leave.....

In this day & age I have found that S/D clubs are having a hard time getting new members.....Calling plus moves at MS dances certainly won't encourage new mainstream dancers to continue their square dancing when they, through no fault of their own, continue to break down a square. eight months of hard work in class this is very discouraging and not fair to the new dancer. As for my wife & myself it will be a long time before we will consider dancing with that club & I will not go to a dance at which that caller will be. We will also tell all our S/D friends of our encounters in hopes that they can avoid this pitfall." Mickey/Cappie Lisak, NY

(ED: This long letter was edited to fit space requirements.) For years, to encourage, not discourage, new graduates the NNJSDA has run summer dance programs that are MAINSTREAM dances.


