

DANCERS WITHOUT PARTNERS

The ? was asked - what can we do about dancers who do not have partners. The many letters, phone calls & discussions that have ensued indicate a genuine concern by those who have partners as singles. Briefly, the comments: 1.) It was pointed out that we should be candid with the students letting them know that, while partners may be provided for lessons, they should not expect that "angel" to be their partner at club dances. 2.) Women learning the man's part and dancing it regularly. This is already done at some clubs and these women wear slacks and shirts. Not every club is enthusiastic about this approach, but does offer more women an opportunity to dance. 3.) Women who have regular partners "relinquishing" their partner for one tip an evening. One letter said, "There are some warm, understanding women who do this without being asked, but they are few and far between." 4.) Publish a list of "singles" s" that would identify them by general age bracket, program of dancing, nites available and areas willing to travel to. It is done in New England thru an organization that verifies the request is from a bona fide dancer.

5.) RECRUIT MORE MEN!

6.) An umbrella organization of "singles" for NJ/NY/PA, that could utilize the best local callers and national callers. 7.) Teaching line dances, contras and some folk dancing between tips at "singles' dances instead of the couple oriented round dancing. To make a dent in this situation is a monumental task but it certainly is worth it. The bottom line of swelling the ranks of square dancing with additional dancers is always worth the work. NECK TIE

Hi! How were your holidays? I hope you danced a lot at all those special square dance parties. As promised, here are instructions for one style of tie that can be made to match the sash I gave directions for in the last issue.

To rehash a little, you started with 1 yard of 45" wide fabric and, cutting from selvage to selvage, you cut (3) 10" strips 45" wide for the sash and you had a 6" strip 45" wide left for the tie.



Fold in half and, at selvage edges, cut both ends together on a diagonal, according to the sketch. Starting at the shorter long edge (A) roll edge to the wrong side and stitch (a sort of handkerchief edge).

when you are a few inches from the first corner, stop, and pre-roll the edge of the diagonal cut, then continue folding under the edge you are stitching on, and continue sewing so that turning the corner flows easily.

At the sharp point, follow the same technique but first, fold in the point on a diagonal so that no raw edge threads will stick out after the rolling and stitching.

fold up


Finish stitching around all sides and press.
Fold in half again with long points together and use a straight pin to mark the center on the shorter long side. On the same side use pins to mark 6" out from both sides of center. Keep right side of fabric facing you.



Now for the tricky part, the folding. This is an accordian fold with the last fold (of the longest long side) going over the back. The first fold is about 1" wide, and each successive fold is a little smaller, with the last fold over the back just meeting the inside edge of the rolled hem. Now slide the pins out where they are and re-pin the folds together in the same place. Stitch longways down the center of the folds between end pins making sure you catch the back folded edge.

That's it for the sewing. now make sure it is worn properly.




The ROUNDALAB Phasing System may not be 100% perfect but it is an excellent guideline by which Round Dance leaders and dancers can operate. In the past, the term "intermediate" meant something different for each section of the country. "Intermediate" in the Eastern states did not include the same level dances as "Intermediate" in the Western states.

Today as a result of the continued efforts of ROUNDALAB, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc., Phase III means Phase III wherever there are round dancers. The past two National S/D Conventions in IN & TX have used Phasing to determine the levels of teaches and of party dancing in various halls. The system really worked. The Canadian National S & R/D Convention in Calgary also used the ROUNDALAB Phasing System. Last August in Seattle, the Universal R/D Council used phasing for determining new choreography for teaches. A growing number of choreographers & record producers are utilizing Phasing to identify their dances.

ROUNDALAB encourages all to become knowledgeable with the system....to help ROUNDALAB to make any changes that are necessary so that dancing levels can become uniform everywhere. After all, the comfort and pleasure of the ROUND DANCERS are the most important points of our activity.

A pamphlet explaining the system and listing the rhythms & figures that have been phased by ROUNDALAB is available from the Home Office 3 Churchill Road, Cresskill, NJ 07626-1698. The price is \$1.00. Additional figures will be phased at the next ROUNDALAB Convention which will be held in Anaheim, CA June 1988.





SQUARE DANCE COUNCIL of NEW JERSEY



The Square Dance Council of New Jersey (SDCNJ) is presently composed of and supported by delegates from 7 organizations whose membership is primarily based in NJ - Callers Council of NJ, Dance Leaders of Delaware Valley, Central NJSD Association, NNJRDLC, NNJSDA, Penn-Jersey District of Federation of Delaware Valley Square & R/D and Delaware Valley RD teachers Association. Most dancers think of the SDCNJ in connection with the first NJ Square & Round Dance Convention held in March at Trenton State College in Ewing Township,

NJ. But bi-annually it publishes a statewide calendar of S/D related events and a roster of callers, cuers, etc. Current endeavors are the creation of flyers and publicity promoting S/D statewide and educational programs to further the growth and enjoyment of our activity.

Bi-annual meetings are held in February & October. While delegates are the only one who may vote, any interested persons are welcome to attend Council meetings. Their next one is Saturday, Feb. 20, 1988 at 2 PM in Room 201A at Trenton State College. Student Center.

Elected Chairman at their annual meeting last October were Doc/Peg Tirrell from the NNJRDLC; VP's Don/Pat Stephens from CNJSDA, Secretary Burris/Meryl Plummer from P-J district, with Gary Potts of Sykesville, NJ continuing on as Treasurer.



Have you noticed how our lives often seem to revolve around big events? For the pro football enthusiasts it's the Super Bowl; for baseballers -the World Series. Vitually every major sport has its colossus, be it golf, basketball, bowling, or yatching. Whatever the activity a season's play usually funnels into one BIG EVENT. With a few major differences, this also has become the tradition among square dancers.

Our National S/D Convention was a natural descendant of the early club "round ups" and festivals. At the height of the boom period in the late 1940's early 1950's, the concept for a National was dreamed up by several dancer & caller leaders in the Redlands area of Southern CA...who in 1952 joined together to produce the first National S/D Convention (NSDC). By today's standards, the fewer than 3,000 who attended this initial venture would seem small, but back 35 years ago it was a master achievement.

The NSDC has come to be known as the "showplace" of square dancing. More than another festival, it is truly a convention in every sense of the word where those attending meet and dance with their counterparts from all parts of the world. They can participate in panel discussions and workshop conducted by callers, teachers, & leaders whom they would have met in no other way.

One of the prime achievements of the NSDC is to provide visitors an opportunity to enjoy not only the local hospitality, but to become aware of some of the area history and background. In Detroit participants were invited to visit a submarine tied alongside the convention hall, in San Diego to dance on an aircraft carrier; in Seattle to dance on the football field where more than 18,000 dancers earned themselves a spot in the Guines Book of Records. In Denver they presented a pageant tracing the history of S/D honoring the late Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw, In Anaheim in '76 they gave a similar pageant exhibiting the Mexican influence on our western S/D.

If you have never attended a NSDC before, or even if you have, you'll find that by sharing this experience with thousands of others coming from all parts of this S/D world, you'll gain a feeling hard to duplicate in any other way. It isn't too late to plan. Registration forms may be secured by writing 37th NSDC, PO Box 8549, Anaheim, CA 92802 or contacting the Editors of GRAND SQUARE. 


