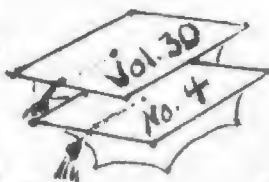

WHAT is this NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs send delegates to three meetings a year where subjects of membership and interclub interest are discussed. ANYONE may attend a meeting (usually third Sundays in Sept., January & April) but only delegates vote. Each club has one vote. Every Spring delegates elect officers to conduct the business of the NNJSDA.

NNJSDA Guidelines for CLUB VISITATIONS

Club visitations, raids, orbiting squares, visiting cousins, rambler, banner stealers - there are many different names for the same basic idea - that of one club visiting another - not only for fun and fellowship, but to also help financially.

Square dancing is an expanding friendship that is limited only by the number of people one meets and joins on the dance floor. Since visiting between members of clubs acts as a means of dancers meeting new people & renewing acquaintances with those they have previously met, clubs are encouraged to plan visitations along with their other club activities.

What constitutes a legal visitation (or raid as some other areas prefer to call this type of activity)? For club with a membership of 5 sets or less, One Square Is Fair. For those with 5 or more sets, two squares would be fair - BUT circumstances may require modifications of the above by the visited club. (It is suggested that once a visit is scheduled, it should not be cancelled because of poor response.) Since fun and fellowship is the essence of visiting, both visitors and club members should be encouraged to mingle and mix.

All clubs planning a visit, **MUST** always tell the club to be visited ahead of time. (e.g. Club President, Visitation/Raid Chr, Social Director, GRAND SQUARE reporter)

A visited club may wish to give or do something special for a "visiting club". (e.g. visitors, with advance notice, to pay members' admission fee)

A visiting club may wish to leave a memento of its visit. (e.g. club badge, dangle, picture, etc.)

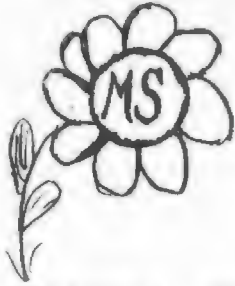
We **DO NOT** encourage the practice of stealing a club's banner. A club, at its own discretion, may have a traveling banner to do with as they wish.

Clubs that are visited are strongly urged to return the visit during the same year.

Clubs may wish to recognize its members who participate in a certain number of visits with special dangles, etc.

It is suggested that the Association recognize its member clubs who have made 5 or more and 10 or more visitations in a year at the Warm-Up dance and in GRAND SQUARE.

Go dance at each and every one - gain confidence - form new friendships - mingle, mix and travel. THEN, after a year or two, when you feel comfortable, if you want to branch out - join a plus workshop, a Round Dance Class, or clogging - if YOU so desire. You will find there are many nice folks in every facet of our activity - just do not be in a hurry to meet them all in just a few months.

Attend the NNJSDA summer Wednesday dances - all are MS. Meet graduates & other dancers from all over the area. And for NOW - attend as many as possible Open House & Graduations mentioned on the cover. ALL of these were planned with you the graduates in mind.

The NNJSDA 2 VP's worked diligently to assemble a packet full of vital information concerning this new activity of yours (& ours). Read it thru & then save it for future reference. There is a whole new world out there waiting to greet you. We welcome you. Happy traveling AND Dancing!!!

- NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (NEC) - Past Chairmen of NSDC.
- NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CAMPERS - A non-profit organization that combines camping with dancing. Our Garden State S/D Campers is chapter 001 and hosted the NSDC Camporee in July 1987.

- SQUARE DANCE FOUNDATION OF NEW ENGLAND - Dedicated to the promotion, preservation & perpetuation of New England Square, Round, Traditional & Folk Dance Heritage. Write Kramers Hayloft, South Weymouth, MA for info.
- UNIVERSAL ROUND DANCE COUNCIL (URDC) - Membership open to teachers and to dancers. Sponsors an annual R/D Convention in July.

### PETTICOAT LENGTH PONCHO

Spring is just around the corner which means no more snowed-out dances. Hooray! This sewing page might have been more useful back in the fall, but I didn't think of it as a column idea then. However there are still some chilly evenings ahead and you can be prepared for next winter by taking advantage of fabric clearance sales now.

New graduates, as well as some "Old-timers", are having trouble wearing coats over their full skirts. You know, you try to button up and you wind up with this ridiculous protuberance of fabric leading the way out the door.

Two winters ago I was facing this problem for the first time and made a long wool poncho to cover my skirts and keep me warm. I have since added two more to my wardrobe in different colors and with hoods. I am only going to give you directions for the scarf neck poncho to save space.

Measure your length from shoulder to hem. Double this number and add  $\frac{1}{4}$  yd. for scarf neck. Use 60" wide fabric that doesn't need hemming, such as coating fabric.

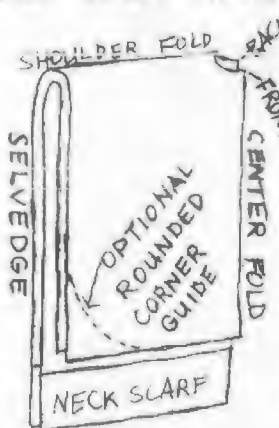

Following the drawing in Fig. 1 fold at the center of both front and back. Cut off the  $\frac{1}{4}$  yd. for the sewn on neck scarf and put aside. Now fold in half at the shoulder. This way when you cut the neck hole (about  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " out from center fold on the shoulder fold), you cut the front together on the fold (about 2" below shoulder fold), and the back together on the fold (about 1" below shoulder fold). (Did you get all those "folds"?) If you have a shirt or a high neck blouse or dress pattern you can use that for a guide. The hole should only measure about  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " wide and 3" top to bottom.

While you still have it folded for cutting, slit the center front zipper opening 1" shorter than your zipper. I use a 12" zipper, 10" would do fine. If you want the corners rounded it is easiest to cut when folded like this.

Sew in the zipper. Then, mark the center back of the neck opening and the center of the neck scarf, pin together and sew, with right sides together, from zipper opening to zipper opening. Fold the neck scarf in half the long way, right sides together, and sew. Clip corners and turn right side out. Fig. 2. Folding in seam allowance, hand stitch the inside neck opening.

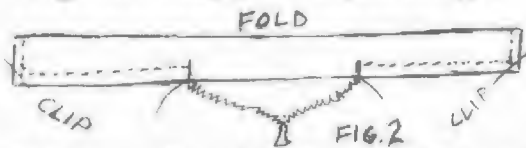

If you haven't used a non-fraying fabric you will have to bind or hem the edges. You can also button, snap or use ties at the wrists. Be creative, embroider them, applique them, use fancy trim around the zipper and edges, anything that strikes your fancy!

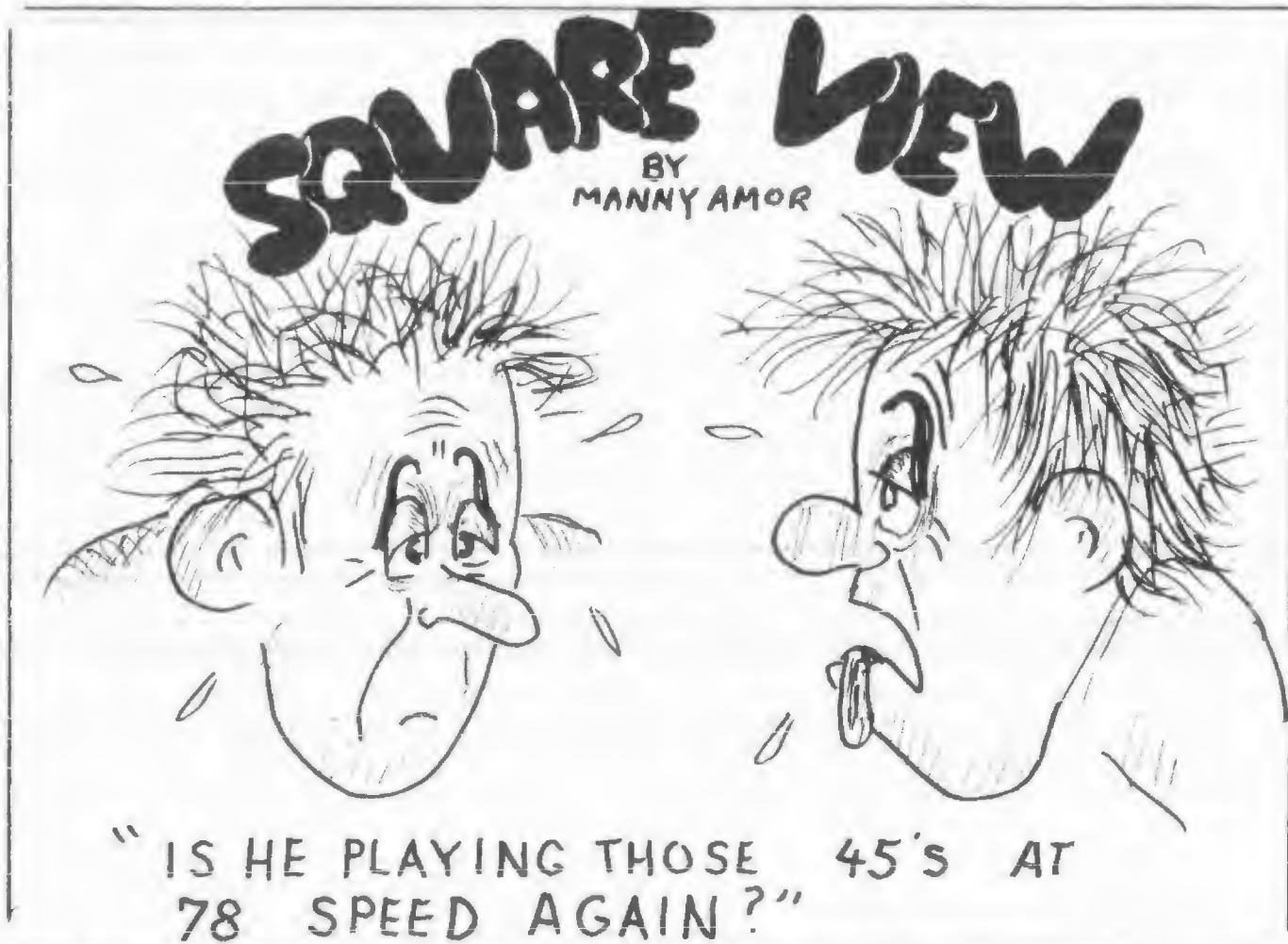
## QUARTERLY SELECTIONS.....

For the MS program, beginning Jan - it was "RETAIN YOUR LANE". Starting formation(s): Parallel two faced lines or parallel ocean waves. Timing 8 - 10.

Ends circulate twice (two positions) as the Centers Hinge. The very Centers Trade to Cast Off 3/4's with the awaiting Ends. Note from author: "May be used from 3 & 1 lines. In such instances, the Hinge is danced as a 'Partner Hinge'." Ending formation(s): Two faced lines end in two faced lines; ocean waves end in ocean waves.

For the PLUS Program, beginning Feb. - it was "CROSS THE OCEAN". Starting Formation: From Facing Couples (assume normal couples for ease of description), women diagonally pass right shoulders & then face right to become ends of right hand waves. As soon as the women clear the center the men diagonally start to pass left shoulders, but when they meet, they join lefts & single hinge to become centers of the final waves. The timing: 4-6 beats.

The R/D Committee announces that the Round for the first quarter of '88 is "Aint't She Sweet". Previous selection for 1987 were: Kewpie Doll, Wonderful One, Sam's Song & Sunday Afternoon. CALLERLAB hopes that most clubs will use these selections in their dance programs. Square & Rounds do belong together & CALLERLAB encourages full participation in the R/D Program. Cue Sheets are available by request from the CALLERLAB Office.



LEGACY is a support group, a part of the whole S/D program, set up to encourage & facilitate communication within the activity. It is an information & education source that offers knowledge, education, leadership & service. Members & Trustees are primarily concerned with the healthy growth & preservation of the total S/D activity. Concerns include proper publicity to & education of the general public, promotion of S/D month, S/D as the National Folk Dance, information & promotion of leadership seminars, a Hot Line for communication of important issues & a biennial survey of dancers' feelings & comments. Anyone who has served our activity for 3 or more years in some form of leadership & believes in the concerns of LEGACY may join. Contact the Tirrells or Cavanaugh's for more info.



ROUNDALAB members, at their last convention, had an opportunity to examine the newly compiled ROUNDALAB Reference Manual assembled by Richard & Jo Anne Lawson of Birmingham, AL. This notebook has 101 articles (or 275 pages) on Cueing Techniques, Figure Execution, Leadership, Teaching Techniques, Cue Sheet Reading and Writing, Partner Relationships, and other topics. It also lists existing teacher training opportunities, professional organizations, publications, suppliers—as well as books and other available educational materials.

So many attendees expressed a desire for their own personal copy that ROUNDALAB members Pat & Leroy Rardin of Yorba Linda, CA offered to chair a committee to undertake this project.

ROUNDALAB has developed a "MANUAL for New Round Dance Leaders" to aid them in starting their teaching programs. This Manual is separate from, but similar to, the "CALLER'S MANUAL for Using Rounds in Square Dance Programs" which was updated in 1987. Both Manuals include sections on the Five Elements of Round Dancing, The Cue Sheet, Cueing, Teaching Techniques, Suggested Teaching Sequences, Cues for the Dances in Teaching Sequence, Selecting Round Dance Routines and Round Dance References. Both come with the Appendixes of the ROUNDALAB Glossary and Phase I & II Booklets. In addition to the above, the Manual includes a section on ROUNDALAB membership and the ROUNDALAB Cueing Guidelines. The Caller's Manual includes a section on "Including Rounds in the Square Dance Basics Class". These Manuals may be purchased from the ROUNDALAB Home Office at: 3 Churchill Road, Cresskill, New Jersey 07626-1698.

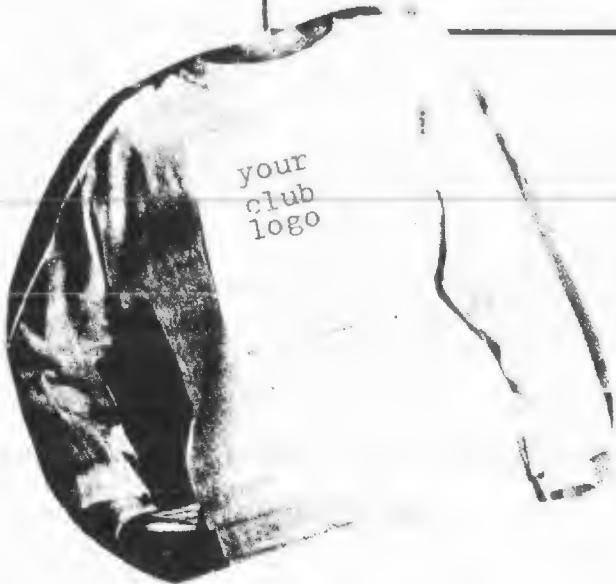

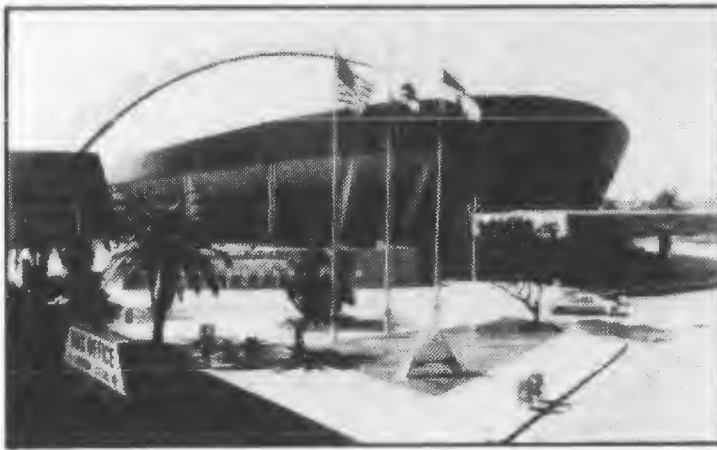

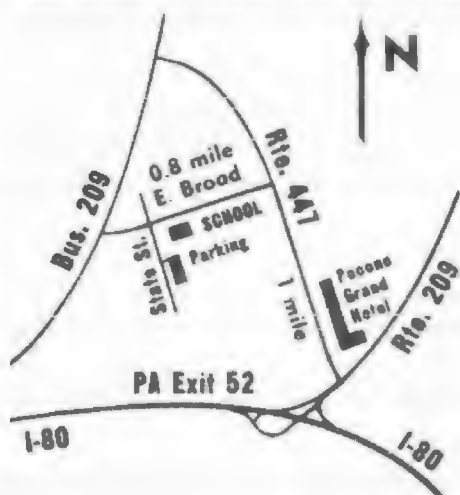

## AS I SEE IT

BOB OSGOOD -LOS ANGELES, CA

The term "comfortable dancer" is reserved for that individual who has given thought and consideration to the seven (7) other dancers in a square. One of the main failings of an insecure or "uncomfortable" dancer is a tendency toward roughness. A rough dancer, ignoring the all-important fact that the caller must have a one or two beat lead on the dancers, often gives the impression of being in a hurry to complete whatever it is that he is doing in the hope of somehow catching up with the caller. The result is a jerking, pulling, grabbing, yanking dancer, who manages to move from the point A - to point B, but in the process tries the patience and sometimes actually injures the person(s) with whom he is sharing the exercise.

Hand and arm movements are often the ones that come in for the rugged treatment. A twirl need not be rough. The man must remember that a girl will turn herself and that his hand is offered merely a stabilizing factor (a support, not unlike a "streetcar strap"), which the lady dancer may hold lightly to steady herself during a turn. Some 'equal-turn' movements such as Box the Gnat, require an understanding of how the hands are to be held before, during and at completion. Essentially, Box the Gnat, is used to reverse direction and exchange places. To start, partners face and join right hands. The lady makes a left-face turn under the man's raised right arm as the man walks forward and around, making a half right-face turn. They finish facing each other. Hands have been held easily enough so that the man's hand may turn over the lady's fingers and, at the completion, they are in a hand-shake position. The entire movement takes four steps.



The starting position is a right handshake - hold, not too tight, not too limp. As in so many square dance movements, the man's part is less complicated than the lady's.

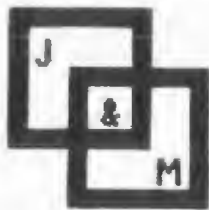

It is up to the man to raise his arm high enough...so that the lady may execute her half left-face turn under his arm without discomfort to her and without mussing her hairdo.

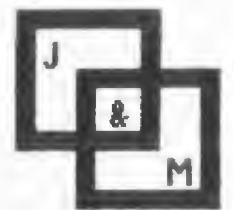


As in many turn-under figures improperly done, the procedure can be accomplished in a fast whirlwind movement that takes only one or two steps. But for a movement that is comfortable and which is danced to the beat of the music, four steps are necessary, ending with the dancers facing each other. This will set them in the correct position for whatever movement is to follow.

As the golfer who practices his swing, you might try working on Box the Gnat with a partner at home or on the sidelines between dances. For those who have yet to experience the satisfaction of dancing smoothly and to the music, you have a treat in store. However, to achieve this goal - it will take some resolve on your part. BELIEVE IT OR NOT, IT'S WORTH THE EFFORT.

It has been the dream of many to have the S/D designated as the American Folk Dance of the USA. It was so designated in 1982/83 with 265 members of Congress supporting the legislation. Now the United Square Dancers of America would like to have this designation made permanent and has been working most diligently under the leadership of FRANK & NAN HABERSBERGER (former NNJ presidents who retired (?) to FL). MUCH HELP is needed to win this National Folk Dance campaign. It cannot be business as usual - it HAS to be a sincere, deliberate effort on the part of everybody. WHAT can YOU do to help???

Contact your local Congressman at home here in NJ, NY & PA - and even in your second home state. Ask them to support or co-sponsor HR2067 the bill to have the S/D permanently designated the American Folk Dance of the USA. Mention that the S/D is truly the American Folk Dance which is called, cued or prompted to the dancers and INCLUDES SQUARES, ROUNDS, CLOGGING, CONTRAS, LINE & HERITAGE dances. Generally Congressmen only respond to constituents, but Olympia Snowe, ME, agreed with our request. A few NJ Congressmen have co-sponsored but NONE from BROOKLYN, SI, or LONG ISLAND. Contact FRANK/HELEN CAVANAUGH for latest lists - then write, WRITE, WRITE! We do need your help - and NOW. A hearing has been set for June 28th. Habersbergers are allowed 6 witnesses to present their case. BUT need 120 more co-sponsors. Please write your Congressman now. It is a very full afternoon - but we feel fortunate to be a small part in their operation. We'll look forward to seeing you at their dance in March.

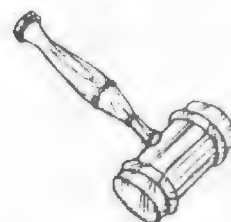

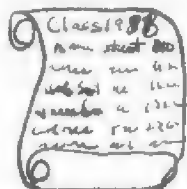

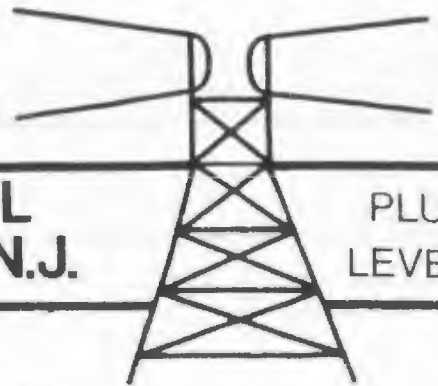
