DELEGATE'S MEETING

September 18, 1988

Opened with a short prayer for Corresponding Secretary, WALT JOHNSON, who had died earlier that week.

All clubs represented except Merrie 8's & Ocean Waves. 23 officers also present. Representatives from CCNJ, NNJRDL, Queens

Sqs, Garden State Campers, Masqueraders & Empire State Festival present.

1 VP - Summer dances averaged 21 sets; Richmond Dancers won attendance award; 38 FREELOADERS. 6 clubs won "One Square Is Fair" awards - Lakeland Sqs, Richmond Dancers, Hill City, Valley Sqs, Hix & Chix, Country Promenaders. Calendars for NNJSDA dates given to all delegates.

2 VP - Letters were sent to all clubs requesting class info. S/D posters distributed during summer. Mid-term to be Jan. 30; Spring Dance April 30.

3 VP - Thanked Bill Heyman for donating his services and the 5 sets who attended the Bergen Festival of Arts & Brian Fugere for sharing his talents & the 4 sets of dancers at Overpeck County Park. Rose Ericson was presented a dangle for designing a winning poster for S/D month. Proclamations received from Gov. of NJ, NY & PA declaring September S/D Month. Read a press release sent to all papers.

CLEARANCE (Recording Sec) - Kittatinny Rangers requested a change to 1/3 Fridays (Ironia gave them permission); Bee Sharps changed to 2/4 Fridays.

GRAND SQUARE - Printer had it ready early so distribution began at Warm Up dance Aug. 31. Warned people to observe deadlines and to double check all material submitted for accuracy. Thanked Porters, Andersons, Shirley Sherlock & Fugere's for assistance that HOT summer weekend.

Liaison- SDCNJ - Next meeting Oct. 16. Asked for volunteer for one more couple delegate. Robinsons to chair State Convention in 1990.

NNJRDL & CCNJ - Both organizations were presented with checks for for \$100 from NNJSDA for scholarship funds. Jean Kellogg, RDLC Moderator & Frank Riviccio of CCNJ thanked NNJSDA. Both groups have scholarships for members. RDLC gave scholarship monies to Rivkin & Raspa; CCNJ to Steve Forman for Caller/Cuers School this past summer.

INSURANCE - NNJ has paid the bill. Clubs will be billed as soon as all the paper work is completed. All clubs are covered.

MINI-Festival - Reminded all that IF we do not get the support of the MS dancers we may not have a MS hall next year. Two halls, reasonable, hard to find. This years in Blairstown.

NNJSDA-INFORMATIONAL Questionnaires - 8 Clubs not returned theirs; Info needed. John Aquino will make address labels for presidents, delegates, reporters - just give him a week's notice, please.

EDUCATION - Early hour on "First Aid until you get to LUST" - well attended. Give suggested topics for this early educational hour to Tirrells.

LUST - '88 - All Systems are go. Blood Donors signed up so far. About 100 signed up for all day Leadership Seminar on Growing S/D Leaders.

OLD BUSINESS - 1992 NSDC Convention awarded to Cincinnati, Ohio.

One Square IS Fair program to be continued. 10 clubs have received awards in last 4 years. 30th NNJSDA Anniversary dance on 30th all set with 2 halls - MS & +. Robinson's gave report on USDA meeting at Anaheim.

NEW BUSINESS - Jean Kellogg, one of founding couples of NNJSDA - spoke on beginnings of NNJSDA. Asked if now was the

time to make a list, by towns, of the membership so if a club needed this info to secure a school for dancing it would be available. Rose Ericson asked was it time for clubs to band together to own their own hall...or the NNJSDA?

Dancing Square has moved to Middlesex Rec. Ctr. in Middlesex. (Continued on page 4)

Reminded all to read thru their stack of flyers & literature. Stressed ECMA - Emergency Call for Medical Aid - and how to secure emergency service. Next meeting - Sunday, January 18, 1989 at VFW, Elmwood Park, NJ. 1 PM- Education Hour; 2 PM - Delegate Meeting. All are welcome to attend although only Delegates may vote.

The success of LUST can not be measured by the numbers in attendance (well over 150), but in the number of NEW LEADERS and the confidence given to those already serving.

Spearheaded by LEGACY Trustees Ken & Helena Robinson (pictured left), LUST '88 covered many new topics as they planted the seeds of leadership. Stressed over and over was the need for a new image of leadership.....a new packaging of leadership projecting fun and friendship

instead of work and drugery.

The wrap-up summaries were most informative and surprisingly concise:

ADMINISTRATION: stressed the need for knowledge of the duties and responsibilities of officers as well as good club management. And where to find this information and assistance.

CLASSES: Be honest with attendees & singles. Give more information on WHERE to dance. Callers are the teachers; Angels are only to HELP.

FINANCES: Explained need for insurance/incorporation. Fees should cover callers/cuers/rent; Dues the rest. How to get additional monies.

MEET THE MICROPHONE: Gave all a chance to use the microphone. Helpful hints to make announcement time less traumatic.

PUBLICITY: Getting the word out - many helpful hints - always thanking those who help - enthusiasm gets message across best - be visible.

CLUB MANAGEMENT: Discussed ways to get additional funding; halls and how to encourage guests, discourage conflicts, keep dancers happy.

TRANSITION OF GRADUATE TO CLUB MEMBER: Reminded all to be more friendly, encourage the new grad; refrain from giving them too much responsibility, but let them grow into leadership not thrust it upon them & scare them.

Stressed how to eliminate rushing the new grad from MS to PLUS.

BEYOND THE CLUB-WHAT?: Gave insight into state, national and international organizations - dancers may care to join.

SEWING HINTS: Judie Dahl continued discussing how to create S/D dresses shown in fashion show. Many helpful hints were shared.

SOLVING S/D PROBLEMS: Role playing situations of various problems often confronting officers - with solutions offered. Most enlightening.

HI TECH COMES to S/D: How the computer and Camcorder have become assets in the S/D activity.

These were just some of the highlights covered. More will be enlarged upon in the summaries to be published. Steve & Dorothy Musial, NSDC Chr. in '77 (Atlantic City Convention) gave all insight on putting on a National S/D Convention - a five year commitment! The Syling Clinic was well attended and the various displays & videos received much attention.

Poor weather discouraged picnickers, but many gathered to continue discussion in the student lounge while picknicking inside. The evening dance with LEGACY trustees John Kaltenthaler & Doc Tirrell was the perfect wind-up to a most productive and imaginative day long event.

LEGACY Leadership Manuals, donated by LEGACY, were used as door prizes. Ken & Helena Robinson are now reading thru and compiling critique sheet comments to help LUST '90 be even more helpful. If you have not returned your critique sheet, do so IMMEDIATELY. NNJSDA thanks the Robinsons, their Treasurer Dan Koft, the Rutgers Promenaders, the moderators, recorders & assistants for helping LUST to be so productive.

This year the NNJSDA 3rd VP (Joan/John Berg) were able to secure PROCLAMATIONS declaring September as Square Dance MONTH from the Governors of New Jersey, New York And Pennsylvania. Member clubs in each state were given a copy of their Governor's Proclamation to use with their club publicity concerning S/D & classes. Copies were also shared with the NY & PA State S/D Associations.

SQUARE DANCING DOWN UNDER by Jean & Gene Koenig

June '88, we flew to Sydney, Australia for their 29th National S/D Convention. Usually their conventions are held in their Spring but this year it was held to coincide with the Expo in Brisbane. It was an enthusiastic group of dancers that met for four days at the Sydney Sports Center.

Dancing is faster & programing different from the States. Only M/S is danced at the convention (there are few Plus clubs). There are four hours of dancing in the afternoon, which can be R/D'g, Plus Workshops or M/S. In the evening, only M/S dancing is from 7:30 (early rounds) to 11 P.M.

There are three tips to a "set". The first tip is a "Round Up". Women, singles at the head, line up on side-while the men line up on the other. When the music begins, four men & four women form a square. Those women not lucky enough to make this first tip are given tickets for the next - "Round Up", putting them at the head of the line. The second tip follows right away and is a Couples Square Up. Couples line up and grand march into squares. The third tip is a square-up. Couples form squares with other couples of their choice. In between sets, there is usually two rounds. Each tip has the usual Hash calls and Singers. (three hash & three singers to each set). The second night of the Convention is Banner Night. Each club marches with their banner and club outfits are worn at this time. Banners are placed around the Main Hall. The third night is the Parade of States, which includes Internationals - such as New Zealand, Canada & the U.S. They had one couple from England and 50 couples from the United States.

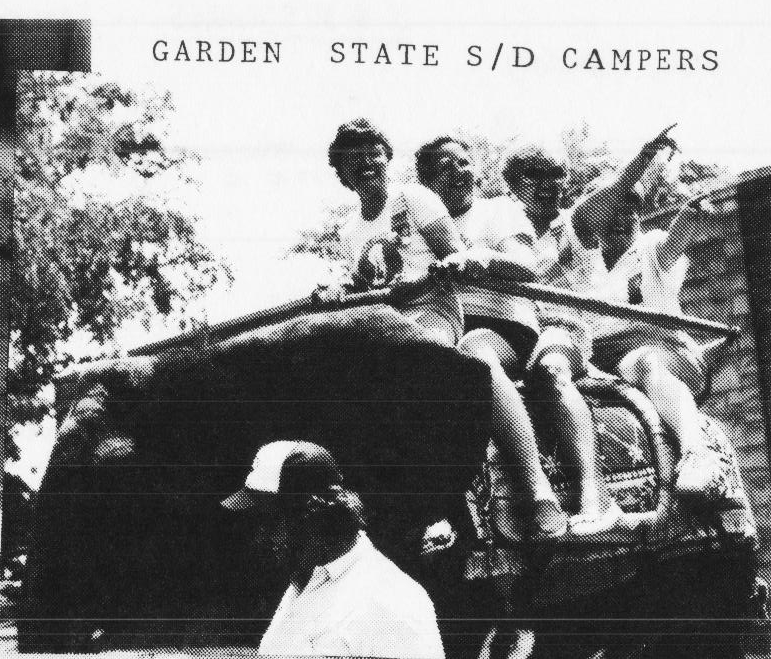

## APPLIQUES

In the last issue I mentioned using appliques to cover stains or fabric defects. Appliques are also used by many clubs for raid costuming. Or they can simply be used to customize a conventional outfit and make it unique. I didn't have space then to explain the how-to of an applique so here goes —

You should use a similar kind of fabric whenever possible to maintain laundering consistency. To eliminate shrinkage of one fabric and not the other, pre-wash both fabrics before sewing.

There are several methods of application, such as using a fusible iron-on bonding fabric between the applique and the garment or a fabric glue such as "Tacky" or "Sobo". If your applique fabric is felt or a fabric that can't fray that might be enough. If that leaves you feeling insecure, straight stitch or zig-zag the edges.

I don't bother with a fusible bonding or glue. My method is more old-fashioned and yet quite simple. I either draw the outline of the shape I want with chalk (either white or colored) on the applique fabric (which may be a print or solid going on a solid or print) and leave a couple of inches outside the entire perimeter - or - use the design already on a print (which I'm putting on a solid color) and leave excess fabric around the figure (such as a flower, floral group, animal, etc.).

Pin the applique fabric onto the garment outside the design, on the excess edges. You may also pin within the applique, but be sure to pin outside your stitching lines.

Stitch the outline edge of your design first, then any inner lines of the design, using a straight stitch.

Unpin, and cut away that excess fabric as close to the stitch lines as possible, without cutting the stitches.

If your applique fabric is unfrayable you can stop here. If the fabric is frayable then you need to zig-zag over the trimmed edges (and straight stitches). Use a medium to wide width stitch set short (close together). You may want to zig-zag on medium width first, then go over it again with a wider zig-zag stitch. This will give you a nice satin stitch edge.

Painted fabric and embroidered swatches are other options to applique on ready mades for a distinctive touch. I'll bet after you start to experiment you'll realize how creative you can be. And don't be afraid of "flops". I've had my share. They usually teach me something or remind me of something I'd forgotten. — *Judie*

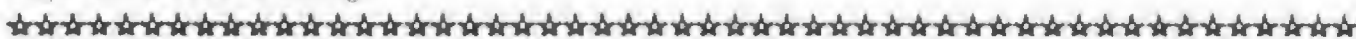

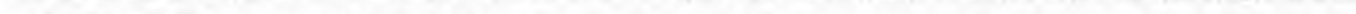

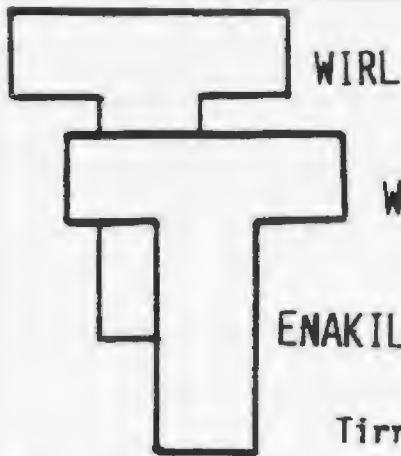
THE FUTURE

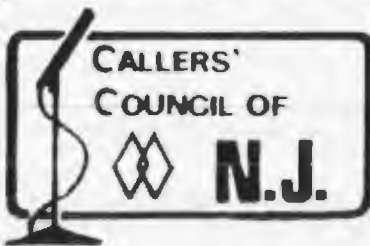

(One of the first people we met at the NSDC in Anaheim was displaced Jerseyite Bonnie Cooke. We asked her to send GRAND SQUARE her impression of square dancing in California...their new home. Here'tis.....)

#### DANCING IN CALIFORNIA.....

We started dancing soon after we moved here to CA and it certainly has helped us in getting to know people and becoming comfortable in our new area. Without a doubt, square dancers are the same friendly group here as they are back on the East Coast. After dancing with about 5-6 clubs, we decided the one best suited to us is the STARSTEPPERS in Carlsbad....a very active and fun club & the members so friendly. They were delighted we decided to join; as with most clubs all over they are always looking for new members.

We do feel it is important to belong and be active in a club. But we find so many people just do not want to join a club & are just as happy coming for the sole purpose of dancing. The big snafu, here, is that the insurance only covers dancers who are members of the club. Halls want assurance that only members who belong attend the club dances.

Beginners' classes start mid-Sept. and continue thru the 3rd week in June. Most classes graduate from the PLUS Program. If you move to this area, you had better be a Plus dancer. There is little chance for you to dance if you are not. However, Plus workshops go on all year at every club, some even before club dances. Once beginner classes end, they go right into Plus workshops. At the end of each MS class, there are Plus workshops for all the "angels" who are there to help out. Seems we are always learning! Consequently the dancers here tend to be all good dancers. Most of the callers we've heard are super and not too happy with the short shrift given to Mainstream in these parts.

Food is not a big priority, except for special club dances - then there is a buffet supper. Coffee is always in evidence - always brewed - never instant. There is punch, but no iced tea or water. There always seems to be a water cooler wherever we are so that suffices. Dancers are expected to "throw" a little money into the 'kitty" for refreshments.

Singles at the dances are not a welcomed entity. In fact, I'd say they are made to feel out of place and definitely discouraged. There are single clubs however.

Raids are carried on a bit differently here. They tend to be crazy and planned to create havoc and turmoil. The raiding club might pay their admittance fee in coins in a bowl of pudding, a block of ice or in ice cream even! They might decide to come in & take the caller hostage & hold him for ransom, which goes into the club treasury. Naturally, they are always assured there will be another caller to take over while he's held. It's a fun time to be sure & everyone loves it, callers included. Visitations to other clubs could be compared to "raids" in NJ. They are frequent and well attended.

Do-Si-Do is done entirely different. If the caller wants it done the proper way, he calls Do-Si-Do Without Hands. It has definitely caused us problems.

Square dance attire is very much the same, but the men are a bit more sloppy. Not all, but compared to the men back East, it is quite different. Many wear cowboy boots & hats, shirts open at the necks, sans ties or bolos and sleeves 3/4 rolled up!!!

Demos are the "in" thing. There are dances going on at all the malls around and fairs, fiestas held in the area. Some clubs even hold their club dances in the mall! It is good exposure and all seem to love and enjoy it. The San Diego Co. Fair not only had a booth for square dancers but had an entire Sunday as SQUARE DANCE DAY AT THE FAIR.

Round dancing is very popular and many participate. As with the square dancers, the round dancers tend to be excellent.

Basically the clubs here have the same headaches as back East...meeting expenses, getting more students, rising costs of halls and callers, etc.

It was great seeing so many of the people from NJ; we even "squared up" with several. We considered ourselves lucky, what with the crowds at a NSDC, we figured the chances of running into someone you knew had to be almost as remote as winning the lottery! 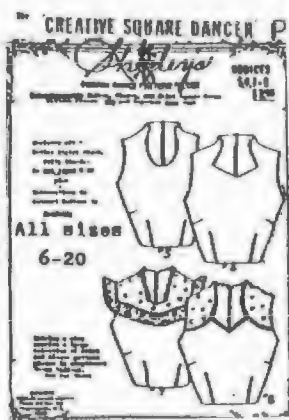

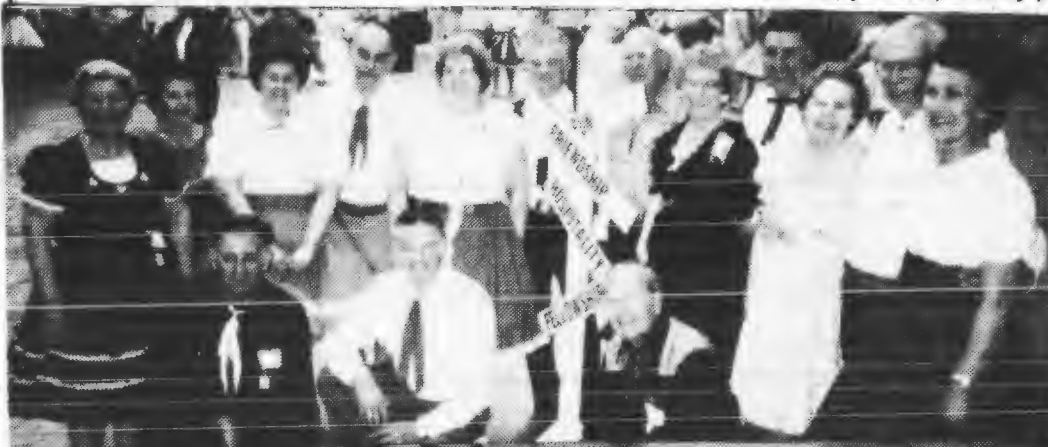

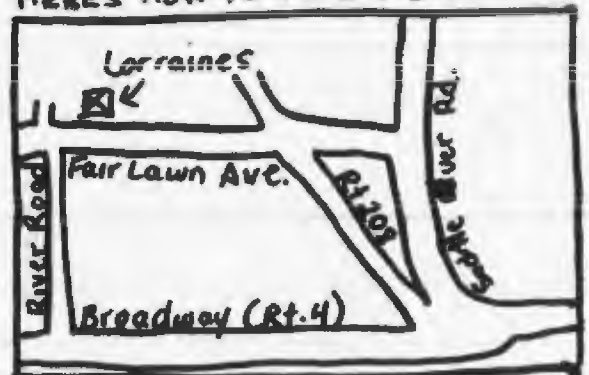
