Some NNJSDA Facts & Figures

NNJSDA is made up of 42 clubs in northern New Jersey, Staten Island, Brooklyn, and neighboring Pennsylvania. These clubs consist of approximately 3000 members from a population of approximately 2400 dancers. (Many dancers belong to more than one club.) Of these 42 clubs, 12 are Mainstream, 20 are Plus, 3 are Advanced (A2), and 2 are Challenge (C1). Also, there are 5 clubs that dance both

Mainstream and Plus on alternight nights.

Six clubs dance every week (two of these dance all year long). Thirty-two clubs dance biweekly and four clubs dance once a month. The number of dances each club has ranges from eight dances pen year through 75 dances per year (one club dances on two different nights). Including NNJSDA summer dances and specials, this comes

to over 950 club dances per year.
When you add this to the 24 club-groups that are teaching Mainstream of approximately 30 classes per year, you come up with an additional 720

dances" per year.

Now add in the non-member clubs and the Plus, Advanced, and Challenge teaching workshops and you have an additional 300 "dances". Add this to the Square Dance Weekends in our immediate area and you have over 2000 square dances during the year. We have not gotten the figures yet on Round Dance Clubs or number of Round dances in our area.

Club members are asked to give a donation ranging from \$2.50 through \$3.50 per person at each dance they attend. (The vast majority at \$2.50) Twenty-nine of the 42 clubs ask non-members for an additional donation of 25 or 50 cents per person per dance. (There are some variations.) Dues run from \$2.50 through \$5.00 per person per year for club members.

#### IT's A RAID !!!!

Club visitations, raids, orbiting squares...are different names for the same basic idea - that of one club visiting another not only for fun and fellowship, but to also help financially. NNJSDA delgates discussed "raids"



at three separate meetings and at the January 17, 1988 Delegates Meeting adopted the following guidelines for CLUB VISITATIONS or RAIDS.

What constitutes a legal visitation (or raid)? For clubs with a membership of 5 sets or less, ONE SQUARE IS FAIR. For those with 5 or more sets, two squares would be fair - BUT circumstances may require modifications of the above by the visited club. (It is suggested that once a visit is scheduled, it should not be cancelled because of poor response.) Since fun and fellowship is the essence of visiting, BOTH visitors and club members should be encouraged to mingle and mix.

All clubs planning a visit, MUST always tell the club to be visited ahead of time. (e.g. Club President, Raid Chairman, Reporter)

A visited club may wish to give or do something special for a "visiting club". (e.g. raiders, with advance notice, to pay member's admission fee).

A visiting club may wish to leave a momento of its visit. (e.g. club badge, dangle, picture, etc.)

NNJSDA Delegates  $\underline{DO}$  NOT encourage the practice of stealing a club's banner. A club at its own discretion, may have a travelling banner to do with as they wish.

Clubs that are visited are strongly urged to return the visit during the same year.

Clubs may wish to recognize its members who participate in a certain number of visits with special dangles, etc.

It is suggested that the Association recognize its member club who have made 5 or more and 10 or more visitations in a year at the Warm-Up dance and in GRAND SQUARE.

ED NOTE: Square dancing, and its related activities, is an expanding friendship that is limited only by the number of people one meets and joins on the dance floor. Since visiting between members of clubs acts as a means of dancers meeting new people & renewing acquaintances with those they have previously met, clubs are encouraged to plan visitations along with their other club activities... and then to mingle and mix and NOT dance in the same squares all night.



Some clubs have special raid outfits (then we know if they mingle and mix); some do a special exhibition entrance as their "raid" in announced; most in NNJSDA leave some momento of their visit.

ALL take pictures - we are happy to share some old, some new, with you.


We extend sincere sympathy to the families of member Frank Donnelly and former member Charlie Hunt, who passed away recently.

#### HOW DO WE TREAT OUR FUTURE LEADERS?

"We feel that one of the major issues facing the S/D community today is the role of young people in the activity. Sure, we see lots of kids taking part in 4-H S/D clubs & Youth rooms at National Square Dance Conventions. And how can we but adore those exhibition teams, i.e. Star Promenaders, Happy Tap-

pers, etc.? BUT...how many of these (mostly) excellent dancers continue to to dance after they've left their teens?

WHAT ARE WE DOING TO WELCOME THESE DANCERS? Probably little, we're afraid. It appears that "regular" (adult) S/D clubs are not making a great effort to welcome 4-H & teen club dancers into their groups either while they're still in their teens or (especially) after they've reached age 19 (4-H's maximum). We're draining a valuable supply of dancers and potential leaders by our indifference!

Square dancing must be seen less as an "old folks/retirees" hobby and truly as an activity for ALL ages. Dancers AND clubs need to welcome the younger dancers into their squares as DANCERS AND MEMBERS - not as "those kids". After all, active dancers of the future will have to come from SOMEWHERE.

What happens to the young adult dancer who chooses to offer his/her talents and ideas for the betterment of the activity. Remember, 4-H is also a LEADERSHIP organization - how many former club presidents with basic leadership skills have we been neglecting? While there have been scattered success stories, more often the younger dancer experiences some difficulty in gaining the respect of the "elders" of the group:

-- The younger dancer is seen as a "kid" - especially if he/she is the same age as an "elder's" son or daughter (or even worse, grandchild) and "kids" are supposed to respect their elders. The fact that the "kid" may be well over age 30 may not make one bit of difference.

-- The younger dancer's ideas may appear "radical", and he/she is considered a "young upstart" out to take over the world. This is probably the farthest thing from the truth!

-- These frustrations are likely to multiply in proportion to the difference in dance experience between the younger dancer and the "most vocal elder" - particularly if the younger dancer's experience is more extensive.


These issues that we've described will not lessen unless the talents and intelligence of younger dancers are taken seriously by associations/federations. Otherwise the S/D activity as we know it will unconsciously write its own death sentence. Think about it - where WILL square dancing's new leaders come from?"

I hope you all whirled through the holidays with the greatest of ease. Now we seem to want to snuggle up at home (whenever possible with all the dancing we do) in these long winter nights and tend to the little tasks we've been putting aside for months.

I'll bet one of those tasks is to figure out what to do about those uncomfortable, factory-made, short, tight, elasticized sleeves on those blouses and dresses. (Thank you to the lady I met at a S.D. who asked me for a solution to this problem. I should say "buy my designs and you won't have that problem. I make my sleeves fuller and longer than factory-mades and with adjustable elastic". However, I always need column ideas, so keep asking for advise whenever you see me. if I can.) The "sewing doctor" will be happy to help


A possible solution is to remove and replace the sleeve entirely, but you may have difficulty matching up or


coordinating fabrics or trims.

You could try lengthening the sleeve by cutting evenly, parallel to the elastic stitching, halfway between the elastic and the underarm seam and adding in a contrasting fabric or wide lace or trim or both ( see Fig. 1). But

again, matching or coordinating will be a challenge.

The simplest solution is to carefully remove the stitched-on elastic and sew on a casing for new elastic. The casing can be seam binding, bias binding or  $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 1" wide lace trim sewn on the inside of the sleeve, - or -  $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 1" fancy trim or lace sewn on the outside of the sleeve. Either way, using the old elastic stitch line as a guide, stitch on around the top and bottom of the casing, making sure to leave an opening for threading the elastic through. Use a soft poly elastic narrow enough to fit through your casing and long enough to be comfortable on your arm without letting the sleeve fall down. I usually just tie the elastic in a SQUARE KNOT (not a Granny knot). You could stitch the elastic ends together if you prefer. (See Fig. 2)






