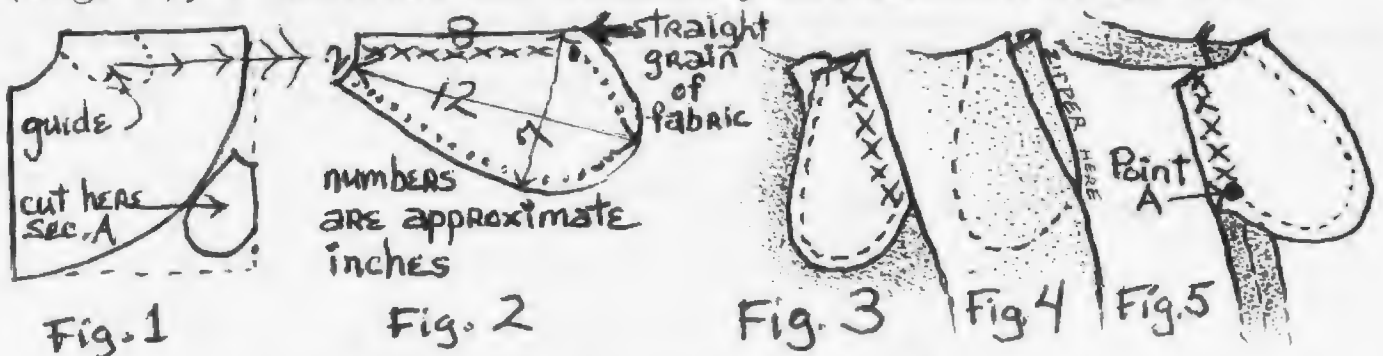


## From The Dahl House

### HIDDEN POCKETS

When I was commissioned to make the new costumes for the clogging team I dance with (The Blue Ribbon Cloggers, available for shows & lessons), they wanted hidden pockets. Other customers had also requested pockets. I thought this was going to be a royal pain of a project. But after making my pattern and mastering the procedure (and wearing the pocketed pinafore style skirt) I have decided to put pockets in as many new outfits as possible. I have gotten the process down to under 15 min. and I'm sure you can do the same.

Using the corner of my circle skirt pattern as a guide (Fig. 1), I sketched and traced my new pattern (Fig. 2).



Each pocket needs 2 pieces, right sides together, and usually these 4 pieces can be cut from scraps (Fig. 1, Sec. A). Stitch each pocket set, rt. sides tog., on round dotted line (Fig. 2). Do not turn right side out.

Determine the skirt piece that is the front zipper side seam and sew it to the one piece of the pocket that will put right sides of the fabric facing each other and lined up on the xxxx line. (Just fold under & back the other half of the pocket.) Stitch on the xxxx line (Fig. 3)

Now, without turning pocket rt. side out, fold pocket to wrong side (inside) of the skirt front and you'll see that the other side of this pocket will be part of the zipper opening (Fig. 4).

On the non-zippered side of the skirt, stitch (w. rt. sides tog.) skirt front to one side of the other pocket, and skirt back to pocket's other side on each xxxx line (Fig. 5).

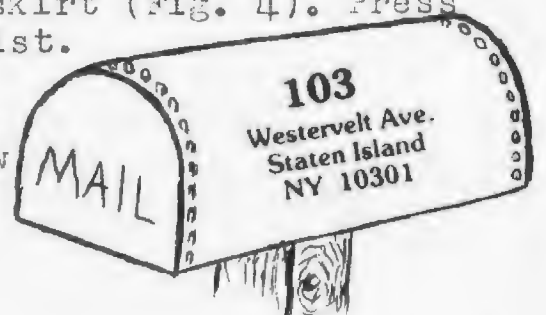
Sew both skirt side seams (rt. sides tog.) from the bottom of the pocket opening (Fig. 5, Point A) to the hem.

When you sew in the zipper just use the back of the pocket as you would the front of the skirt (Fig. 4). Press pockets to front inside & baste at waist.

Finish skirt as usual.

This is confusing at first but once you figure it out and do it a few times you'll be glad you did.

Held their annual meeting during the NSDC in OKC. Our congratulations to their newly elected presidents- NAN/FRANK HABERSBERGER, now of Pembroke Pines, FL - formerly NJ & NNJSDA presidents. Who said Frank & Nan went to FL to retire!!!!!! Know the organization will continue to grow under their leadership.





247 Round Dance teachers, representing 132 Teaching Units, from 34 states, 3 Canadian provinces, & New Zealand, attended the 13th Annual Convention of ROUNDALAB, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc., in Oklahoma City, OK last June. Even though ROUNDALAB is a round dance teacher organization, about half of the 3 day convention was spent attending to the business side of the activity. Phase committees carefully compared their phase descriptions with the video-taped figures. Additional figures were defined & 'West Coast Swing' was added to the Jive rhythm. A Teaching Progression by phases was developed; Mini-Clinic Master Teacher decided to concentrate its energies on Teacher Training; a Classic List was adopted; the Round-of-the-Quarter program strengthened; & the Wayne Wylie Scholarship Fund announced it was awarding 3 tuition scholarships to round dance teachers' schools. A number of educational sessions were scheduled. On Sunday the members attended round robin sessions on: taxes, leadership, and the use of computers in round dancing.

Much excitement was generated when the video committee gave a preview of the taping done at the studio in Calif. Final editing is now underway. It is expected the video tapes of the 6 Phases of R/D will be available early this winter! Members voted to freeze all permanently approved descriptions of figures in the 6 phases (most of which will be on the video tapes) until 1994. Monday afternoon members had an opportunity to participate & compare experiences in 3 Swap & Exchange sessions. Topics included: Writing & Publishing A Round Dance; First 6 Weeks of Basics; & The Single Teacher. That evening was an introduction to Phase IV Samba figures. Not being used to so much inactivity, attendees welcomed an opportunity Tues. eve. for an impromptu dance in the lovely Gold Crown Ballroom at the Lincoln Plaza. Wed. Teachers Seminar/Clinic, sponsored by ROUNDALAB, was a sellout & covered Teaching Teachers to Teach Tango and Jive. At the conclusion of the ROUNDALAB Convention, the annual meeting of the Exec. Comm. of ROUNDALAB & Universal Round Dance Council (URDC) was held. At the NSDC, ROUNDALAB conducted its usual daily 2-hr. seminars. Topics chosen were those most requested from prior year's critique sheets & included: The Importance of Basics & Hash Cueing vs Teaching Routines in Class; a 'You Asked For It' series of topics encouraging the marriage of squares & rounds; Ethics of the Profession; and Teaching Progression with a suggestion of Classic Dances to use. On Thursday, when a clinician became ill, ROUNDALAB was asked to provide a last minute replacement for the scheduled Phase I, II, III Clinic.

Elected Chairman were Ray/Anne Brown. Wilson/Ann McCreary were elected to the newly-created position of Vice Chairman. Continuing on as Exec. Sec'y. will be Peg/Doc Tirrell (NJ). ROUNDALAB's 14th Annual Convention will be held June 24-26, 1990 at the Omni Hotel in Memphis, TN.

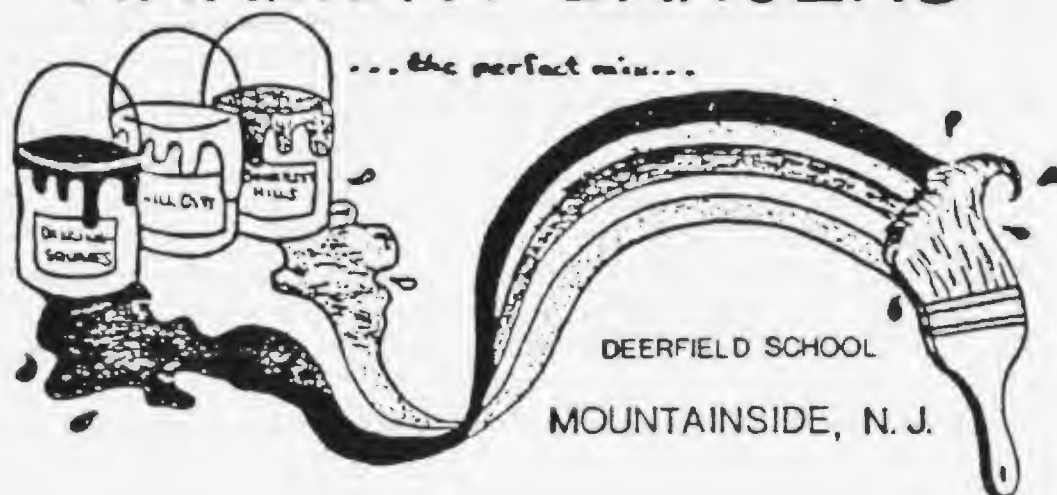

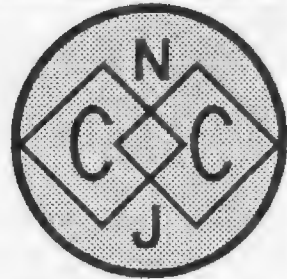

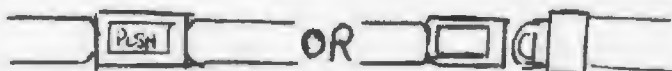

What does a seat belt have to do with square dancing? If you are in an accident & are hurt because you did NOT have your belt on, you'll probably miss out on some good times with your fellow dancers, PLUS we'll miss you! Returning from the NSDC, our 22 ft. travel trailer decided to come off the ball, swayed a few times, then spun us 210 degrees around on I-40, 50 miles west of Knoxville, TN at 2 A.M. I don't know if we could have handled the 'tow vehicle' if we hadn't been wearing our seat & over-the-shoulder belts. They held us in place as Doris handled the car & kept us on the road. WE WERE NOT HURT! Doris had a sore leg for a few days, probably because she tried to put the brake pedal thru the floor. The trailer ended up in the right-hand lane on its right side facing West in Eastbound lanes. We were on the shoulder - upright.

With the help of 2 truckers, state police, 2 wreckers (who set the trailer up without further damage) & a volunteer fireman, we were able to get back on the road & resumed our trip about 10 hours later. There's a saying I've used when operating steam propulsion plants aboard U.S. Navy ships: "Many hours of boredom, a few minutes of interest, and a couple of seconds of SHEER TERROR" (a casualty, accident, explosion, etc.) The sheer terror of our trip was when we were spinning around on a busy Interstate Highway. Those seat belts held us in place; Doris was able to control the vehicle & we were not hurt. Seat Belts: WEAR THEM!
