



As this is being written in mid-March, we have visited 32 of our 35 member clubs, and hopefully we can visit the last three before May. We have enjoyed these visits and want to thank all the clubs for their warm welcome and hospitality and friendship.

We believe the changes we have made this year will be for the good of the Association and our members:

1. Our convention display has been revamped to include some new attractive additions, such as: the mobile with a dancing square, a new banner with club attachments, flag poles with the state flag and the American flag, and a scrap book with pictures from the clubs in the NNJSDA. We hope you saw it at the New Jersey State Convention. We will be taking it to the National.
2. We have instituted a new attendance program at the upcoming Summer Dances. This program will make it possible for all clubs to obtain a "One Square is Fair" Award for the summer of 1992. To obtain this award, a club must have one square or more at each of the ten Summer Dances. This new program gives every club an equal opportunity to win a summer

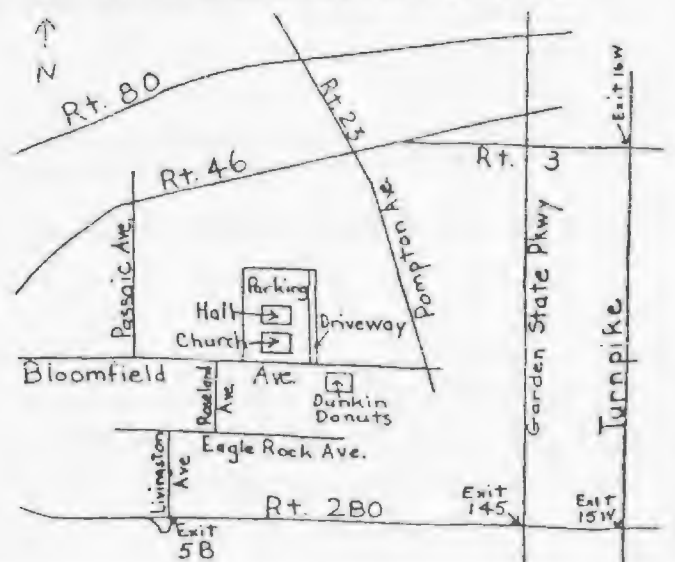

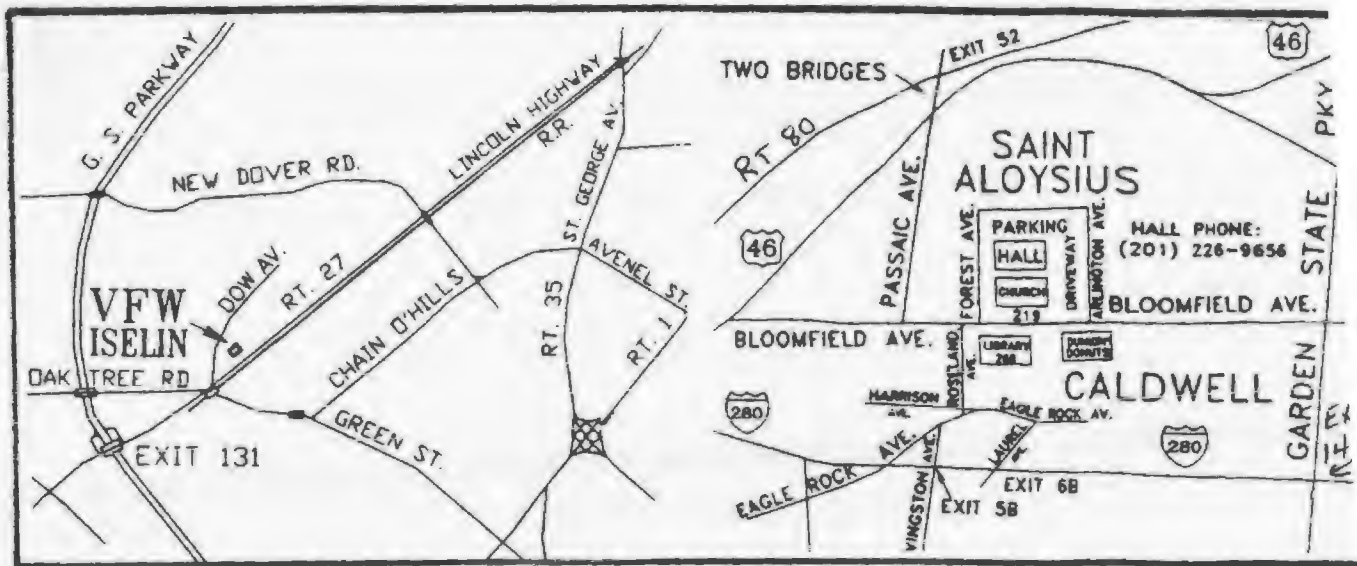

As I write this, I am looking forward to the State Convention at Trenton and the opportunity to get together with dancers, callers and cuers from all over the state in a festive atmosphere.

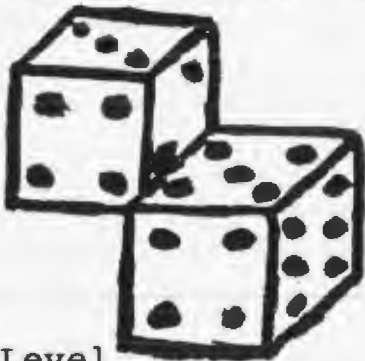

Suggestion: SIMPLIFY !!!!

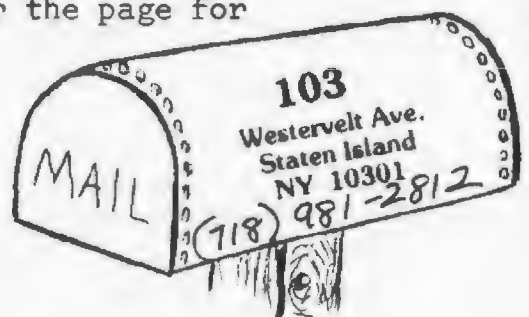
You don't need a frenzy of frills, bunches of bows, reams of ruffles, dozens of darts, scads of seams ---- get the idea ?

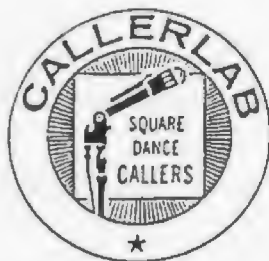

The Callerlab Foundation for the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing will host three Trail End dances at the 41st NSDC in Cincinnati on Wednesday, June 24, 1992, 8-11 pm. Three halls will be staffed with 36 prominent callers and Mainstream, Plus and Advanced dancing will be featured. Admission is free. Tax-deductible donations to the Foundation will be solicited throughout the

dance. Examples of Foundation projects, past, present and future as well as a history of the Foundation will be displayed near the Mainstream and Plus halls. A similar dance held at the 40th NDSC in Anaheim resulted in donations of over \$900.00 with dancers proclaiming it to the "best dancing at the Convention."

Donations to the Foundation have been used to provide hundreds of video tapes, featuring three professionally produced TV commercials, designed to recruit new dancers. These commercials have been aired over hundreds of TV stations and cable networks.

More recently, the Foundation has produced a deluxe, color brochure to be used in recruiting new dancers. Many dancers are already familiar with the "New Song & Dance Routing" brochures. Over 250,000 have been placed in the hands of callers, clubs, organizations, and associations throughout the U.S., Canada, and many foreign countries. 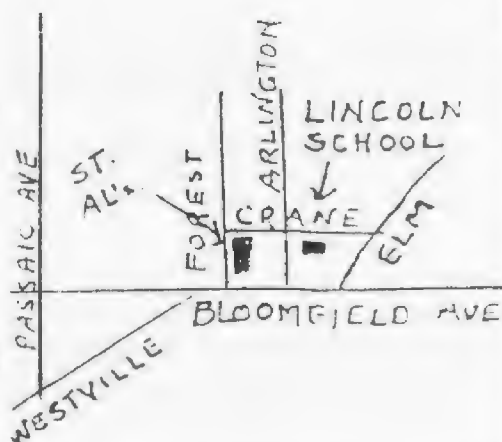

Roundalab will be conducting its 16th Annual Convention in Cincinnati, June 21-23, 1992. Almost 300 teachers and dancers from the United States, Canada, and Australia are planning to attend. Although the purpose of this annual Convention is to conduct the business of Roundalab, almost twice as many scheduled hours will be devoted to providing educational clinics and seminars on topics of interest to round dance leaders.

Both dancers and teachers are encouraged and welcome to participate in the seminars, which will be held daily between the hours of 11 am and 1 pm. Legacy is a non profit international assembly of "trustees" representing all facets of square dancing, including dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers and special-interest groups. The Legacy idea was conceived in 1973 by three editors/publishers of nationally known magazines: Charlie Baldwin, *The New England Caller*; Stan Burdick, *American Square Dance*; and Bob Osgood, *Square Dancing (Sets in Order)*. They envisioned a service-leadership organization and development of better communications among the many facets of the square dance activity.

Since its inception in 1973, Legacy trustees have expressed concern over rough dancing, non descriptive calls, lack of standardization of calls, too many new movements, teaching programs, competition, use of alcohol, styling, dress code, ethics, recruitment/retention of dancers, and social aspects of dancing. Legacy has been instrumental in encouraging the development of leadership training at the local and state level.

Legacy is composed of trustees and affiliates. Trustees are individuals who have been dancing for at least five years or served at least three years as an accomplished leader.

To become a trustee, the individual must be nominated by an existing trustee and attend a biennial convention. This convention is held in May in odd years for three days. These trustees represent one or more of the component groups, dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers, record companies, foundations, special-interest groups and organizations of dancers, callers, round dance teachers/leaders, and conventions. Many of the trustees have been involved in the activity for over twenty years. All trustees pay their own expenses.

SDCNJ

At the February meeting of the Square Dance Council of New Jersey, Roy Gotta reported that everything was on track for the Convention. The dates given us previously by Trenton State College conflicted with Callerlab or Easter. Roy negotiated hard and was able to get the following **new dates: April 17, 1993 and April 16, 1994.** The Council approved the new dates. Dan & Kathy Koft were chosen to chair the 1994 Convention. In its effort to upgrade the sound quality of the Convention, the Council approved the first of several planned purchases of Yak Stack sound systems. The system will be available for use by member organizations throughout the year. In addition, five Walkie Talkies were purchased and also can be borrowed.

The Student Newsletter Program is thriving with Bucks-Trenton and Penn-Jersey increasing their circulation substantially. The Council approved the establishment of an "800" number to piggy-back on the 609-298-8828 dedicated phone line that it shares one-half the cost of maintaining with the Del-Val Federation. Currently, the phone is manned by Jim & Doris Howatt.

The Dept. of Travel & Tourism will supply the Council with NJ Road Maps for distribution at the NSDC. Stickers with the 800 and 609 phone numbers will be placed on the maps. NJ State Pins will also be requested.

The Council approved a matching grant to the NNJSDA of \$100, which was used to produce the Association's Square Dance Video. Copies are available for use by member organizations. The Council also approved a grant of up to \$700 for the funding of L.U.ST. '92. L.U.S.T is a seminar for square dancers to share ideas about club problems and solutions, recruiting new dancers, advertising and many other subjects. All dancers will be admitted free of charge to the seminar and the Mainstream evening dance.



This is an undercover story! I really never thought I would be writing something like this and to be honest I wish I were not doing it now, but it is the type of subject that someone must discuss!!

Usually I think and write about the clothing that women dancers wear on the outside to look good for themselves and others. This is my love and joy. The problem occurs when the outfit is beautiful, the lady twirls and the undercover story is bad.

Most ladies are very modest and discreet, but there are a growing number who are less than modest, even tending toward the obscene. They refuse to wear any Pettipants, tights, or other cover, preferring to wear only pantihose, bikini briefs, or garters and regular stockings. They are Fredericks of Hollywood originals!

I am not against cheesecake, but really girls, this kind of dressing belongs on a runway or in the bedroom, not at a square dance.

Our leaders have lobbied the federal and state governments to make square dancing our National Folk Dance. How do you think this might affect our efforts if this trend continues?

Most of our clubs dance in churches or schools. Will the educators or church leaders be happy? They have been convinced that square dancing is wholesome, clean, family fun and it is up to us as dancers to keep it that way.

Every class coordinator and every club president must make it clear that modesty is a must. It is also up to callers and cuers to set a good example for the rest of the dancers.

I know there is a dress code and I am also aware that on occasion someone will forget Pettipants. I am not worried about this situation because usually the women will ask not to be twirled or will hold their skirt down.

I'm concerned about the women who think they look better or are trying to be really different. Please let this stop now before our wonderful activity finds scandal or gets evicted from our precious dancing locations.

**AT THE DANCE (Or More of What Mother
Would Like You To Do)**

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

So congratulations! You are a new dancer. You want to go to a dance. You've found one nearby on the night you have free. . . and you haven't a thing to wear!

"Square Dance Attire!!" the flyer says. What does that mean in this day of sartorial diversity and "Personal Envelopment Expression?" First of all, it does **not** mean going out and buying \$\$\$\$ worth of clothes (except in my wife's case). A skirt (square dance or prairie) and a blouse for the ladies, slacks and long-sleeve shirts for men will suffice. Top that off with a big smile and I guarantee you'll be welcome.

The reason for the "SDA" request is that long-sleeve shirts on men tend to ease H-S (hairy-sweaty) contact. Skirts on women are just so nice looking when square dance twirling and whirling go on, that they help everybody dance more smoothly.

A word of hygiene and common sense might be interjected here. Ladies or gents, if you belong to the SPG (sweaty palm group), don't hesitate to wash and/or dry hands between tips. And ladies, no matter how attractive you might think it looks to the contrary, the wearing of pettipants will cover a multitude of embarrassing exposures that are better revealed in the bedroom or the doctor's office than on the square dance floor.

In other parts of the country, you will often see dancers and callers alike wearing boots. Here in the northeast, we ask for "soft-soled" shoes. Actually, the expression would be better if we said "non-marking" shoes. Good dance

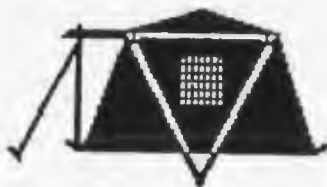

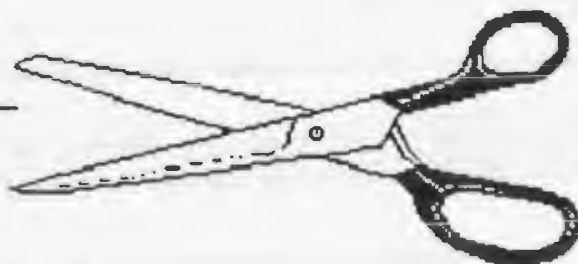


