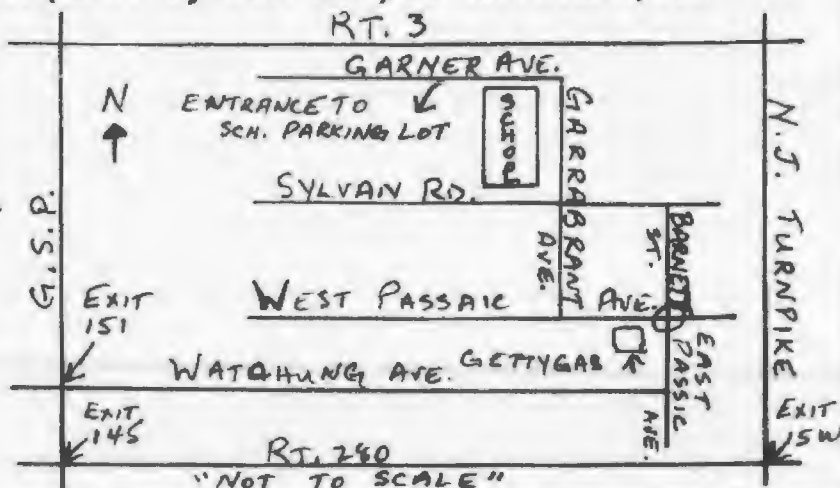

WELCOME NEW DANCERS

You are reading **Grand Square**, the Official Publication of the Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association (NNJSDA).

What is the NNJSDA?

It is an organization of dancers who belong to member clubs. These clubs send Delegates who attend 3 meetings a dance season, usually the 3rd Sunday in September and January, and the 1st Sunday in May. Anyone may attend a meeting, but only Delegates can vote. Each club has one vote. Every spring, the Delegates elect officers for the coming dance season.

What area is covered by the NNJSDA?

Half of New Jersey from its southern area, Mercer County, to its northern end, the county of Rockland in New York State, from the Kings (Brooklyn) and Richmond (Staten Island) counties in the east all the way west to the counties of Monroe and Pike in eastern Pennsylvania.

How do I become a member of the NNJSDA?

You automatically become a member when you join a member club. There are currently 36 member clubs.

What does the NNJSDA do for you?

1. Publishes **Grand Square** five times a year, which provides club and Association news, a dance calendar, interesting articles, as well as information on the many other facets of the square dance activity. Look for copies at your club.
2. Provides insurance for the dances and classes of member clubs (exception: New York clubs).

3. Holds a special Summer Mainstream Dance Program for new graduates, beginning the last Wednesday in June and continuing for 10 weeks.
4. Has a **Freeloader** Program for new dancers which is earned by attending 8 of the 10 Summer Dances. The Freeloader entitles you to attend 6 Association Dances **free** during the next 2 years. A blank Freeloader card is in your graduation packet. Have it signed by the Treasurer at every summer dance you attend.
5. Has a **Patron's Award** for visiting 26 member clubs on their regular dance night. A blank Patron's card is in your graduation packet. When you visit a member club, have the treasurer or president sign and date the card.
6. Has a *"One Square is Fair"* Award (presented twice a year) to member clubs who have at least one square in attendance at Association Specials and Summer Dances.
7. Holds Special Plus Dance Programs on the 5th Fridays or 5th Saturdays of the dance season, usually with national callers and cuers.
8. Holds a Mini-Festival, featuring Mainstream, Plus and Advanced programs, every November for a full day of dancing. Next Mini-Festival is Nov. 14th.
9. Sponsors a biennial Leadership Program, called L.U.S.T., in even numbered years. The next L.U.S.T. is scheduled for October 2, 1994.
10. The Association makes available instruction booklets for Mainstream and Plus classes and diplomas for graduation.
11. Assembles special packets of information for new graduates which are presented at graduation by an Association Officer. The Association also awards a special dangle for perfect attendance at classes.
12. The Association provides Dance Clearance, through the Recording Secretary, of all special club dances to prevent conflicts.
13. A Blood Bank Program, #9192, provides coverage for all members and their immediate families.
14. Sponsors a Poster Contest (see page 47) every year to foster interest in square dancing, and distributes publicity packets.
15. Provides a forum for discussion and dissemination of flyers at Delegates Meetings.
16. Has a NJ State Dress Chairman who has the pattern and the fabric for the green and white vest that is a part of the NJ outfit. This outfit is worn at the National Square Dance Convention for the parade of states as well as other special occasions to identify the dancer as being from NJ.

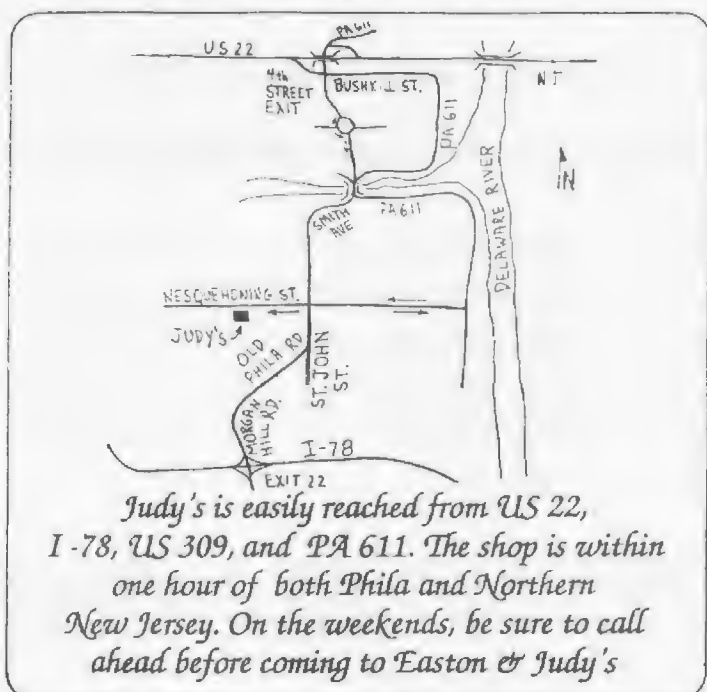
We hope that by spring 1994, See Saw members Dot Kuchar and Ray Sers will be back on the dance floor.

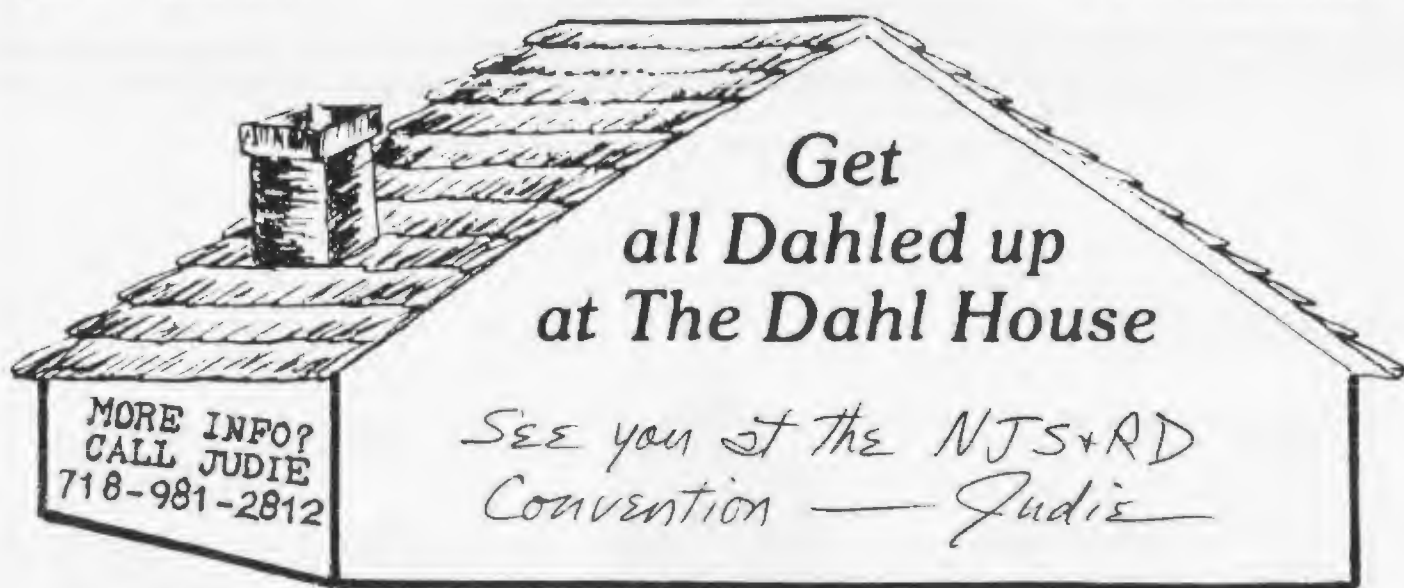
On a sad note, Cappy Maranino passed away in January. You may remember that he was our Mary Bray's partner and he will be missed by us all.

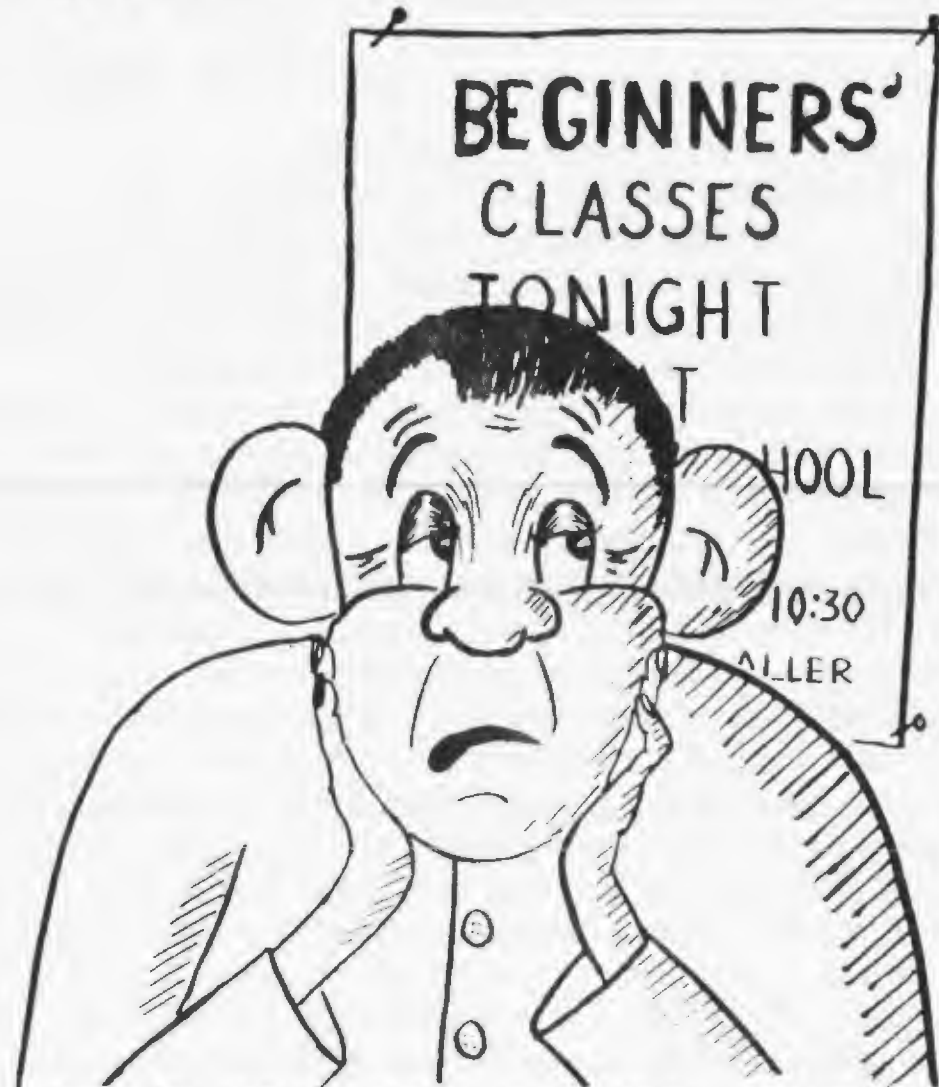

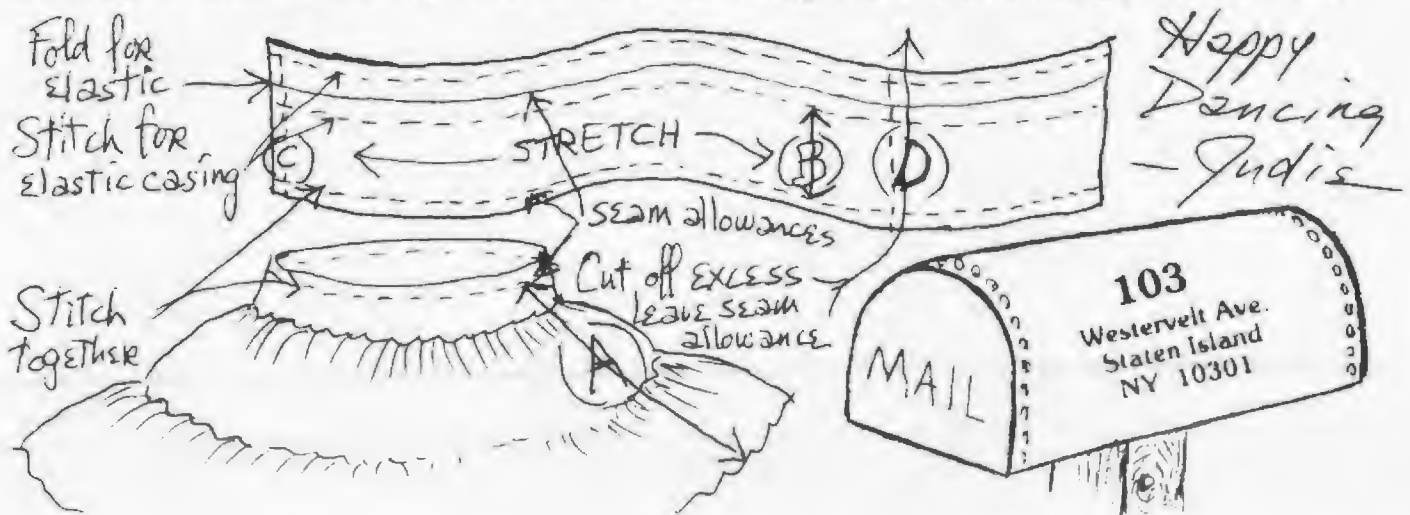

SPLIT SLIPS (Say that 3 times fast!)

Whew! What a winter! Well - did you spend all that time you were snow bound sewing new outfits, replacing dead elastic, repairing old outfits, weeding out the ones that no longer fit or appeal to you any more? No - me neither. Oh, well, it would have been a great accomplishment. Like my Aunt Peggy used to say, "The road to hell is paved with good intentions". Too bad good intentions can't just fill some potholes, nevermind paving roads. Anyway - I digress - O.K., you can get out and go dancing regularly again, without worrying about digging your car out of a snow drift first. You can even go shopping and find a parking place now that those mountains of snow are gone. Hey, you can do both - dancing & shopping - if you go to the N.J.S. & R.D. Convention.

O.K., you see a great new outfit and you figure you deserve a new slip too. Hm - you see just the right color that would add some fresh oomph to your collection but, wow, it's sooo full - and sooo expensive. May I suggest you shop with a friend & find a color you both could use. Now check the construction of the slip where it joins the ruffles to the flat hip section. Some slips are 2 layers & made so you could cut one layer off the hip section without disturbing the sewn gathers. (The orig. slip will be intact, with one less layer.)

To make a new hip section to sew to the separated ruffle, measure the cut off slip ruffle (A), not measuring the seam allowance, cut a stretch fabric strip the height of the hip drop (B), plus seam allowances, plus a fold down casing for waist elastic, to total the finished length wanted. I did not measure & cut the width, I just stretch-stitched my top strip to the flat part at the top of the gathered slip & when the fabric met, at the seam point (C) I cut it off (leaving a seam allowance (D)), stitched up to the waist (C & D sewn tog.) then folded down & stitched the elastic casing (leaving an opening to thread elastic through). Just be careful to cut the stretchiness in the right direction - it should stretch sideways, not up & down. Hm - that's been a winter problem that we can start correcting now - stretching out sideways, that is.

ON BEING A BIT "TOUCHED"

by Dick Mazziotti, Caller/Teacher

There once was an old caller. He lived in a shoe. His dancers screwed up, he didn't know what to do. So he got a magic two-by-four, applied to the sides of their heads. "Pay attention, my friends. It's easy," he said. "If you want to dance well, I'll give you a clue: **Touch hands with your neighbors and they'll touch with you.**"

We callers and teachers emphasize the correct definitions of calls, the music and the beat. But dancing is not all footwork and memory. Much of the success of square dancing can be attributed to the dancers' "positional awareness." This is the "Where am I, who am I, and what am I?" of square dancing. It is important to know if you are a boy or girl. Look down if this is a problem. Next you need to know if you are an end or a center, and then whether you are in facing lines, two-faced lines, waves, etc. These last two items = "positional awareness."

Where do we see lack of positional awareness? Here are some examples:

-The Wandering Square: This is a square that stays in motion. It looks like the science-class movies depicting Brownian movement. No recognizable formations intrude on the free form style embraced by this group.

-The Forever Lines: These folks remember they have been told to form lines when all else fails. So they form lines. The caller says, "Lines, go forward and back," and they don't move. The caller says, "Promenade," and they don't move. The caller says, "We're done, go home," and they don't move.

-The Exploding Square: Much free energy, usually accompanied by loud noise and a sudden going array of things.

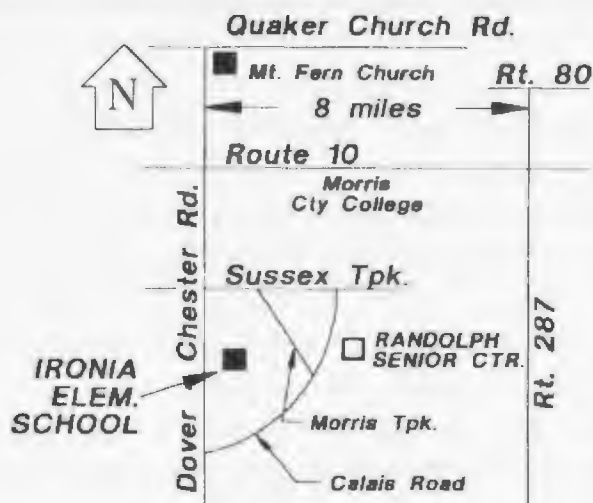

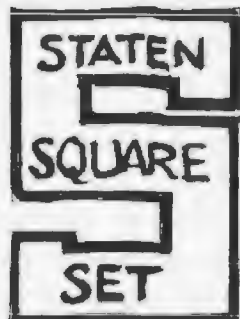

So Dick, you've told us what it isn't. What it is, to what portion of the anatomy is it applied, and how forceful should we be with recalcitrants? Answer: Grab hands, touch hands, finger hands, caress hands, wiggle hands, slide hands, slap hands, hands up, hands down, hands sideways. Remember, if you are not touching someone else, you are a free electron, doomed to wander about until you collide with another electron, thereby releasing enormous bursts of uncontrolled energy (see Exploding Squares above).

Watch the people who you know are REALLY GOOD dancers. You will see them lightly touching at every opportunity. It confirms their position, even if just in passing. They can navigate between lines and waves and two-faced lines and columns without ever once wandering into the next square. The hand that touches is usually connected to the arm of a dancer that dances.

Having said all the above, please do not leave permanent fingerprints in the hands and arms of those with whom you dance. Touch, don't squeeze. Touch lightly, don't hang on. Touch briefly, be ready to let go. The best dancers touch featherlight, but **they touch all the time**. I cannot emphasize this enough, not only for new dancers, but for those more experienced dancers who have developed bad habits as well. Remember our motto here at the Dance Ranch and Exercise Spa: **Dancers who touch hands, do it with feeling!!!**

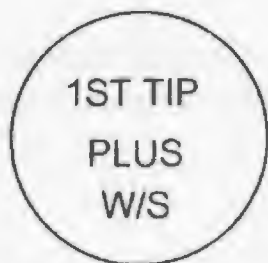

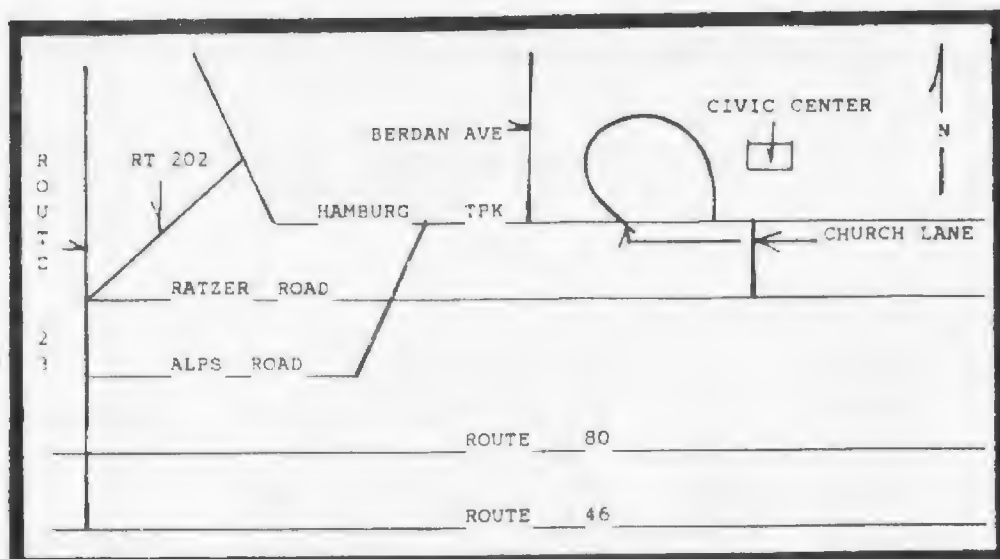

"STATE DRESS" -- WHAT IS IT, AND WHY DO I CARE?

Square dance conventions and other gatherings usually hold a Parade of States or a Grand March, during which the dancers from each state march together. Frequently the dancers from a state will wear the same outfit or the same color combination. This gives a dancer a sense of belonging, an opportunity to exchange information about each state, and frequently pins that are representations of the state are traded back and forth. (Note: NJ Division of Travel & Tourism makes the NJ pins available free to residents requesting them. Send requests to: NJ Division of Tourism, CN 826, Trenton, NJ 08625.)

Does New Jersey have a "State Dress?" Yes, hence the need for the NNJSDA State Dress Coordinators.

Where did the idea come from? Several years ago, NNJSDA dancers at a national square dance convention realized that there was no NJ state dress. They put in a lot of effort networking with the various regional NJ square dance organizations and designed an outfit that is both practical and flexible. It is not cost-prohibitive, and it is comfortable for dancing. Except for the vest, it can frequently be put together from a basic wardrobe. The colors are Kelly green and white, based on the concept of the "Garden State."

What does it look like? For both dancers, a green vest (with white stitching and a 9" green and white state emblem on the back) is worn over a white shirt or blouse. Either white or green pants or skirts are acceptable. Most skirted dancers wear a white underskirt with a green overskirt/apron trimmed with white eyelet, and this overskirt has the state emblem repeated on it. Also attractive is an all-white dress worn with the vest.

Some vests and skirts have been made reversible, with the club colors on the inside. This makes a nice raid outfit.

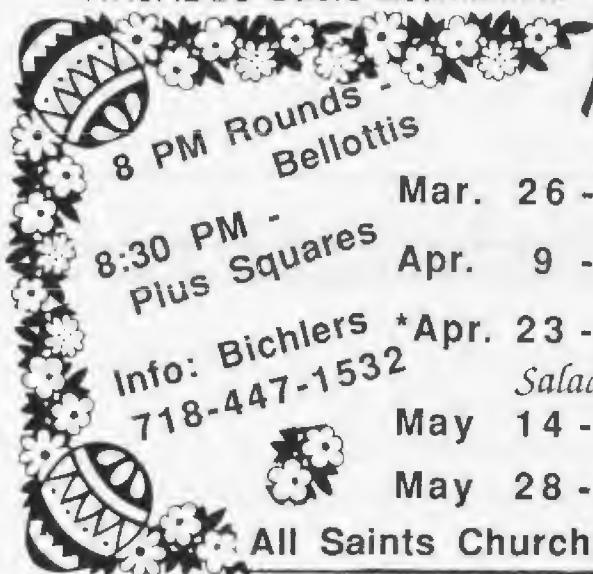
