

Like knights in the days of the crusades, "You have done your work well" and indeed, Doc and Peg, "You have won your spur."



THE SEWING Mananes CIRCLE

September, 1995

It is the beginning of a new dance year, and time to go through your closets and review your square dance wardrobe. You probably do this periodically. Let us use some sort of system this time, a system that will also give your old wardrobe a boost without a great deal of time or money invested.

Start by taking your outfits from the closet and making 2 piles, one for those things you like, and one for those you don't enjoy wearing. For each outfit in the second pile, ask yourself the following question: "I/we would wear this outfit more often if it (fill in the blank...)" Some of the "wishes"may include: • "Had a matching shirt..." We looked at several ways to solve this one last

time, without making a whole shirt. Yokes and trim on pre-made shirts are easy solutions. • "Had comfortable sleeves..." Maybe the sleeves are too short or tight. Add a row (or two) of 3" or

4" lace or trim on the bottom, and move the elastic down to a comfortable position for <u>your</u> arm. If the sleeve is too tight, slit it down the center from shoulder to hem and put in an inset of lace or other fabric. Total cost--less than \$5 for the fanciest lace.

 "Wasn't so plain..." Whoopee!!! Here is where you can really make a difference, and have a ball! Start by wandering through the local sewing-and-crafts shops; there are more than just sequins and jewels there; check each aisle and picture what any of those items could do for a square dance outfit.
 Spaghetti ribbon, small pre-made bows, rosettes, florals, etc., are great; just make sure they won't snag on a crinoline. The washability of a decoration is not critical--it can be applied with a tiny safety pin on the underside; it can be removed when laundering the outfit, or changed for a new look at the drop of a whim. Add them around a skirt, on a bodice front, and/or a sleeve edge.

2. Add lace or eyelet under the hem edge, and match it on the bodice.

3. Look for the marvelous fabric paints, available with and without printed patterns for applying them. The best I have found for washability is the Tupil ColorPoint line; they love washing. (We have one painted outfit that has been washed and tumble-dried 25+ times over the past 4 years, and the only difference is that the paint is not as "pearlized" or shiny as it once was.) There are two types, ColorPoint and ColorStitch. The ColorPoint was designed with a tiny applicator tip for droppping tiny "pearls" of paint on the many iron-on patterns available. One nice thing about it is that if a mistake occurs, it can be "picked off" after 24 hours and re-done.

This same tiny tip allows the paint to be applied in a fine line, and these pearlized paints are lovely. Pull out some of your old iron-on embroidery patterns and go to town. Repeat the design on your partner's shirt and you will have a true "outfit." Iron-on patterns do not always wash out from under paint, so use a light pattern, and be sure the paint covers the lines.

The ColorStitch paint is designed to "puff up" when ironed, and I have no experience with this as an embellishment for square dance outfits. I have also tried other paints, but some require special laundering that makes me avoid putting them on items that need to be washed frequently. Your comments are welcomed. I have had bad luck with the iron-on appliques sold in the stores; they all shrink off the fabric after a single wash, no matter how I "paint" them down; make your own from pre-washed fabric, and they are lovely and stay put.

Note: Be absolutely sure a fabric has been pre-washed before applying any fabric paint. Secondly, take care not to touch any painted areas with an iron. Finally, do not hang these so the painted areas touch each other until they "cure" for 2-3 months; the paint may stick a bit when left in direct contact with each other. If this happens, just pull it apart gently; we have never had the paint actually pull off. We just make sure to hang these items between other non-painted things, or inside out, for the first 2-3 months.

• "Was shorter, or longer, or had a new waist-band, or had a better crinoline, or a nicer blouse, or" So stop pushing it around the closet and fix it!! If you really can't/won't/shouldn't wear it any more, donate it to your club's "Poor Annie" or "Second-Hand Rose" sale. (Repair any obvious defects; things that are too worn to wear are an embarrassment.) The clubs who have these in December find they are a great money-maker, expecially when held in time for the new dancers to buy things for the Christmas student-level dances. Some clubs may also take more expensive outfits "on consignment", with a percentage of the sale price donated to the sale fund; in this way, those lovely (expensive) custom outfits can be recycled more cost-effectively.

What about the second pile of things--the ones you love and enjoy wearing, but that may be getting "old-hat"? Hey, these are only "old-hat" to the friends who see them often, right? So put them on, and go to a club you haven't visited before!! Then they are new again--and so are you!!

OXYMORONS: FASHION AND COMMON SENSE

In this issue we venture into the crocodile infested waters of personal fashion and common sense, a pair of paradoxes if ever there were such things.

First of all, we attack the crinolines. A little history: in 1820, Fred Nobel applied for a patent for an explosive he called dynamite. He almost didn't get his patent. Just weeks before, Ernaldo Ewanowitz had applied for a patent on an explosive form of cotton waste: vast amounts of cotton were compressed into a small bag. Upon loosing the bag's strap, the material expanded with explosive force to eighteen times its compressed size, usually rendering the unstraper unconscious.

It didn't sell well to miners, but their wives immediately saw the advantage of being able to pack 20 pounds of clothing in a 5-pound bag. The crinoline was born.


Even today, it is a much misunderstood garment. For example, men continually complain of sore knees and legs after a square dance. Prevailing wisdom has it that they are just getting old. But researchers say, "Nonsense!" The pain and bruises come from being constantly assailed for four hours or so by flailing crinolines!

Henry Food invented square dancing, and discovered the automobile. To this day, we would be using a tiller bar to steer with it hadn't been for Mrs. Ford and crinolines. While driving to dances, she found that her crinolines continually popped up over her face. Needing something to hold it down, she had Henry invent the steering wheel, thereby allowing women with crinolines to drive, while also providing a place for an air bag for those who do wear crinolines.

We explore this next item as a public service: the retractable towel bar that men wear. Since the dawn of time men have felt more macho wearing a holster. In the little-known "Autobiography of the Piltdown Man" early cavemen compare decorated leather holsters for their clubs. For modern man, usually no longer allowed to openly carry weapons, the towel holder serves the same psychological needs. But beware. There have been several severe injuries reported among devotees whose apparatus got momentarily caught on a lady's crinoline, and snapped back making an injurious impression upon male anatomy, not to say ego.

Belt buckles, originally adapted from straps used to hold down crinolines, have evolved a life of their own. Callers, in particular, seem afflicted by the need for this chromium counterweight. During the Second World War, Chrome was needed for the war effort. Today, war is probably impossible since all the chromium that went into bumpers, when they used to clang instead of thud, is

Dot Loewenstein, in the Summer Issue of Grand Square discusses how to save square dancing. Her suggestions are fair ones and to the point, but none of them addresses the principal reason why clubs are failing and dancers disappearing.

In one word, the answer is "expense." We are discovering that there is a population of square dancers who belonged to 2, maybe 3 clubs, and danced at least twice a week. Dancers circulated in overlapping circles in an area so they became casually acquainted with a large group. As the rise in cost to the dancer over the past 5 years has escalated, that same population is dropping its multiple club membership and is dancing 2-3 times a month.

New dancers look at the expense of a wardrobe, the weeks of lessons to become expert, and the cost of the dances and decide to go country western. We've been dancers for over 40 years. Before retiring, we danced 2-3 times a week. After retirement, it was 5 nights a week. No more. Who can afford nearly \$50 a week for recreation?

Maybe when enough clubs close down, callers will begin to get the message to do something more than wring their hands and pass out flyers on "saving square dancing." There are callers who want to take the money and run and act insulted if asked for help in meeting this problem, but it is going to take the combined effort of all of us who love dancing to keep it going until younger people decide that square dancing is more fun than country western.

After 40 years of dancing, calling, and cueing, we had to retire from the square dance world due to poor health. At this time I am completely disabled and my eyes are failing, so I will not be renewing my subscription.

Square dancing has been my - or should I say our whole life and it has given us pleasure unmeasured. We are thankful to our friends for their participation and loyalty all these years. God bless them all. Sincerely,

now safely residing under the overhanging bellies of callers.



AS I SEE IT

Well folks, this it. This is my last editorial as editor and publisher of **Dance!**. It is my last plea at sanity for our hobby.

Square dancing will never die completely, but is heading for obscurity at a rapid clip. Why you ask? Because as a group, square dancers are much too conservative and resistant to change. Consider these points:

• Dancing can no longer be considered a cheap form of entertainment. Cost for halls, callers, and cuers continues to climb. The day of the \$5.00 evening of entertainment is fast disappearing. The era of the \$10.00 dance has come and will continue to grow. The better local cuers are getting between \$60.00 and \$70.00 per dance. The better local callers are getting between \$120.00 and \$175.00 per dance. The average hall rental is between \$60.00 and \$100.00 per use. Fewer and fewer clubs can find a "free ride" from our schools.

• The era of casual clothing is here. As much as I like the square dance look, people today don't seem to have the kind of money needed to have two sets of clothing, one for every day use and one for dancing. In addition, people like to feel relaxed in our tension-filled 1990s. Part of feeling relaxed is to dress relaxed. Just look how many people dress even in dinner situations.

• We are as a group an aging population. It is hard to sell to younger people when all they see is gray-haired dancers in "funny clothes."

• Our approach to marketing our hobby has to change. The fun of dancing has to be emphasized. Training programs that take far too long have to be broken up into manageable segments, with each offering plenty of time to dance before going on. We have to offer the opportunity to learn to dance at different times during the year. The 10-10-10 program offers much promise. The practice of trying to integrate new dancers into Plus clubs in the space of one year has to stop. It pulls down the level of Plus clubs and produces weak new dancers.

Our governing organizations have to get involved in truly supporting the clubs in education, club interaction, officer training, and uniform practices.

• There are too many inadequate publications that don't give a true picture of dancing today. Everything is pictured as being rosy. Complete schedules are sorely lacking. Clubs that don't meet the criteria of belonging to the "organization" are somehow left out of the publications. Lead times to get information printed are up to nine weeks! Technology to solve this problem is here today. We must learn to use it.

But enough from me; it is time for others to fill my shoes. Good-bye for now and happy dancing.


