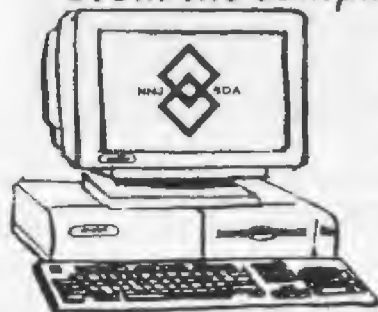

Dear Readers. . .

It seems that publishing *Grand Square* only three times a year has been a success, both for the clubs and for your Editors. Such a success, that we are pleased to announce that we will remain on as Editors until May 31, 2000. On that date we will have completed 14 years of service to *Grand Square*, 10 of them as Editors. We will NOT continue beyond May 2000 as Editors.

We love *Grand Square*, and it certainly has become like another one of our children. But children grow up and go out on their own. The same should be said of *Grand Square*. It's time for *Grand Square* to move on. It needs someone with new and fresh ideas. Someone with a different perspective. Is it a big job? On more than one occasion, we have advanced in our careers after showing a copy of *Grand Square* while in pursuit of another position. It speaks volumes about computer and organization skills, attention to detail, consistently meeting deadlines, cost

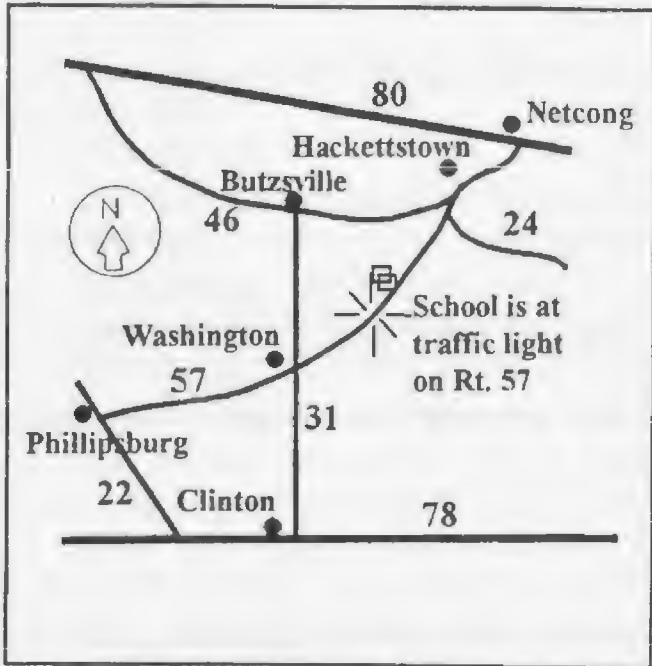
Following is a letter received by the NNJSDA:

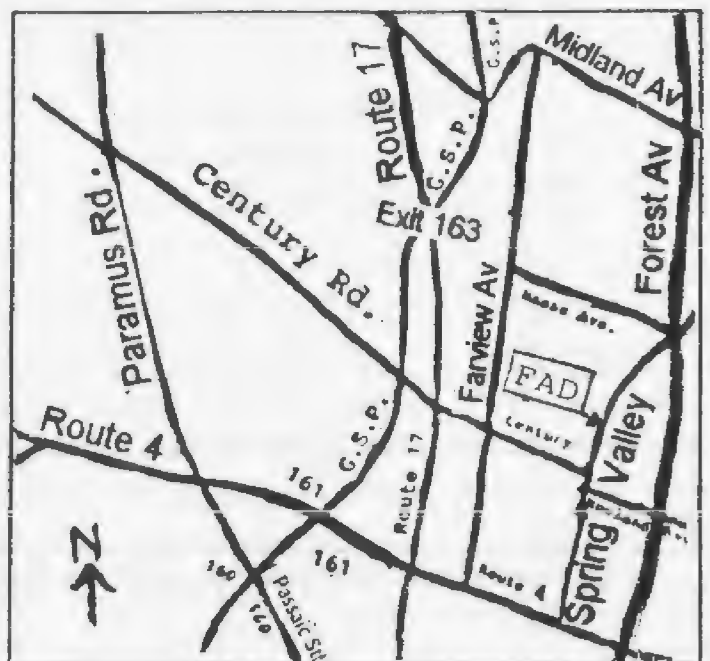

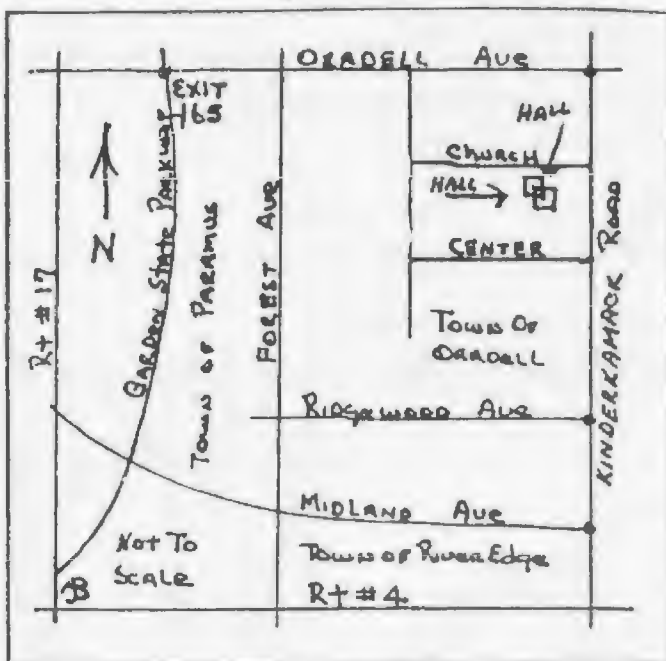

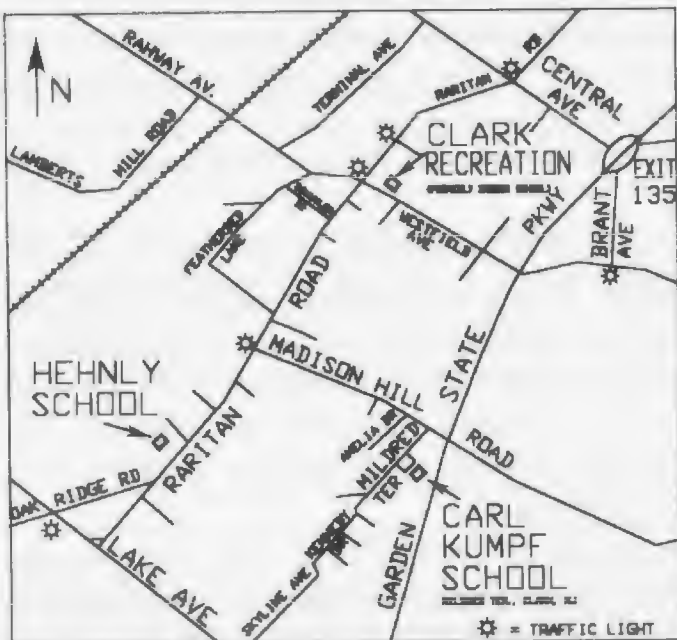

Callers Council of New Jersey is the organization for your local callers. CCNJ at present has 44 caller members. Our membership has callers with one year of experience, callers with over 50 years of experience, and everything in between. Your local callers number two

present and two former members of the Callerlab Board of Directors, and three certified Callerlab coaches (out of about 30 world wide!).

You have callers working mainly in MWSD (Modern Western Square Dance—our current Basic, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and Challenge programs), line dance leaders, traditional or Eastern style square dance callers, contra, and traditional dance leaders. We call, lead, or prompt anywhere from one dance month to 15-20 dances a month. Our members call in the NJ, NY, PA, and CT areas mainly, but also call in Germany, Scotland, Australia, Sweden, and other countries as well as all over the US and Canada.

Your callers call for anywhere from \$0,000.00 on up. They call club dances, Girl Scout father-daughter dances, retirement community dances, party nights, nursing home entertainment, and school classes. They teach. Your callers call the Callerlab Basic, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and Challenge programs.

They contribute articles to Callerlab publications as well as square dance publications. They run callers' colleges. They attend workshops at our meetings, at special meetings, Callerlab conventions, National Square Dance Conventions, and Canadian National Square Dance Conventions. They contribute their time, talent, and efforts to nursing homes, introductory dances, demos, and support dances like the Docking Dance in support of Baltimore's Year-2000 National Convention. They have run almost all of the last NJ State Conventions as well as been active in organizing other large conventions.

At almost any large square dance convention or activity, you will find your CCNJ callers represented. One of the really nice experiences a caller can have is to go to a national convention, or other large square dance gathering, get ready to call, and look out to see a couple (or more) of local friends smiling back supporting your efforts.

Our biggest problem, both for callers and dancers, is coming up right now. We need to cooperate and work hard to recruit dancers for classes this fall. At our recent CCNJ meeting, we discussed some innovative programs for running classes that might make it a little easier to recruit. More about that later. Right now, we need maximum effort on the part of ALL of us to try anything we can think of to entice dancers into this wonderful activity. Best wishes to all,

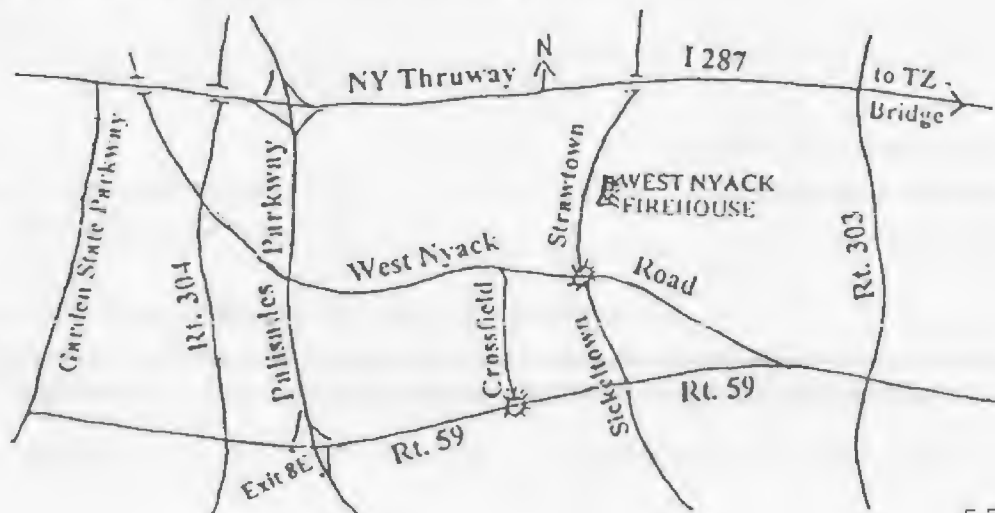

NORTHERN NEW JERSEY ROUND DANCE LEADERS COUNCIL

How often have you watched two couples doing a round dance and noticed a difference in the appearance of the routine, although both couples were executing the proper steps? One couple may be simply "walking" the routine; the other twosome is dancing it. That difference is what is meant by styling.

Styling in round dancing is an individual thing. It's the expression on your face, the way you move your entire body (not just the feet). It is determined by the manner in which you carry your weight, by body control, by the ease of with which you execute the steps. It is influenced by your attitude and the "mood" of the particular dance.

There are a few rules in round dancing that are important to good dancing. "Stand tall" is the admonition given to new dancers. Get rid of the slumped shoulders, the caved in chest and protruding tummy. "Keep the head erect." Good posture by the dancers can make the difference between a dull, uninspiring routine or one that conveys a sense of beauty and grace.

Above all, dance smoothly. A two-step can be done with such smoothness that the dancers appear to be gliding over the floor with no up and down movement. Avoid excessive bouncing and leaping from one step to the next.

Try to keep your footwork precise so that your partner and any spectators will know what you are doing. Don't shuffle—glide over the floor. Every round dance calls for good balance, good timing, and smoothness. Keep in mind that the faster the step, the shorter it should be, but don't overdo this and make the steps too short; don't be an "in-place" dancer unless the step calls for it.

Many dancers watch their feet as they dance. Keep your head up and don't look at the floor. Watching your feet will not help to make the correct moves. Avoid staring at your partner, but remember that an occasional glance or smile is part of round dancing. Some steps and routines call for a definite "look."

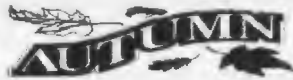
Proper weight distribution is most important in any form of dance. The weight should be centered over the ball of the foot and slightly forward rather than back on the heel. Often we see dancers doing a rock with their body tilted at a 45-degree angle to the floor, either forward or backward. A rock should only be a change of weight with a flexed knee, using a checking action, keeping the free foot in place and the body straight with no tilt or lean.

Dance with the knees relaxed, but avoid an extreme bend. Never keep the weight on both feet. Keep the weight on the supporting foot will leave no doubt as to which foot is the "free" one—the one to be used next. Keep the feet close together when standing or when one foot passes the other in executing a step. When dancing in closed position, don't worry about stepping on your partner's feet. If she is moving with you, her foot should be out of the way before you take your step. Unless one of the partner is doing the step incorrectly (using the wrong foot, for example), no one should get stepped on. If the lady's steps are shorter than the man's, she must compensate by lengthening hers to match those of her partner.

Ankles are important too. Keep them flexible so that you can turn your foot. When doing a point, a corte, or a back balance, etc., the leg should be turned out from the hip. This is especially true in such figures as the corte, since this "turn out" will prevent the man's foot and leg from getting in the lady's way as she steps forward into the corte.

In most cases, the fingers should be kept together and extended, but not stiff. There may be time when a routine and the type of music calls for an angular

movement of the hands and arms, but this doesn't happen often.

Don't let the arms dangle awkwardly at the sides. Extend them slightly but keep them curved rather than bent at the elbows.

Have you ever danced with a partner who assumed a "death grip" on you and held you so tight you were unable to move on your own? Hand and arms clasps should be firm, but not so tight that the movements of the partner are restricted. The ladies should never hang or pull down on the partner's arms or hands—you are supposed to be dancing too, so don't expect your partner to carry you. On the other hand, don't be a jellyfish. Offer a little resistance, but in a gentle manner.

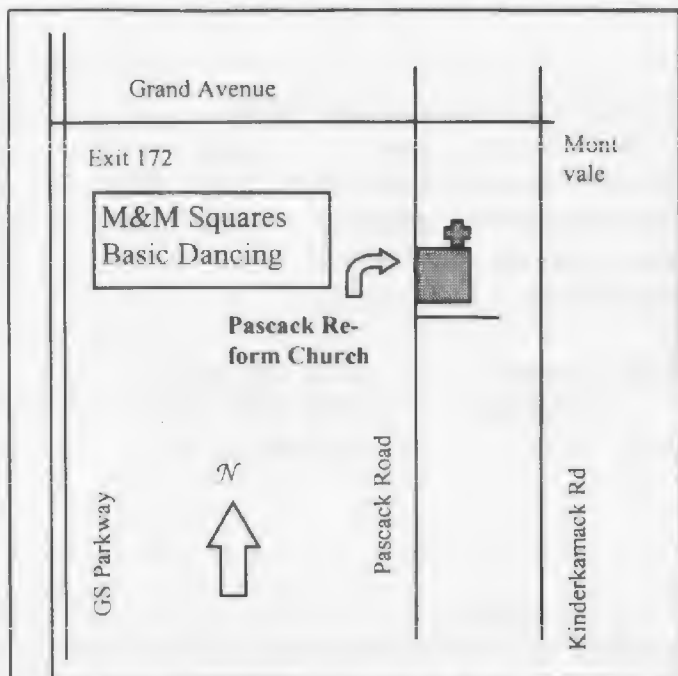
Many dancers confuse styling with technique. There are many steps and figures, particularly in international ballroom, that are designed to be done with certain and precise footwork. (Heel turns in the natural turn, reverse turn, impetus, etc. are some examples.) These are so constructed to make the couple's turns compact so that the dancers end in proper partner position. But they are not styling; they are the manner in which movement is to be executed to maintain the proper position and not force one of the partners to travel a greater distance around the other. When you are learning figures such as these, listen to your instructor and try to do them as they are presented—right from the start. They will become natural and you won't have to "unlearn" bad habits later on.

Styling is an individual thing. Attitude is important. If you are smiling, dancing with ease, and appear to be enjoying it, you can make a simple routine look interesting and pleasant. If the routine or the music make you want to "live it up," do so. That is your own styling. Round dancing should never be so regimented that each person on the floor is a carbon copy of all the others. Of course, this would be impossible since we all have our own physical and emotional characteristics.

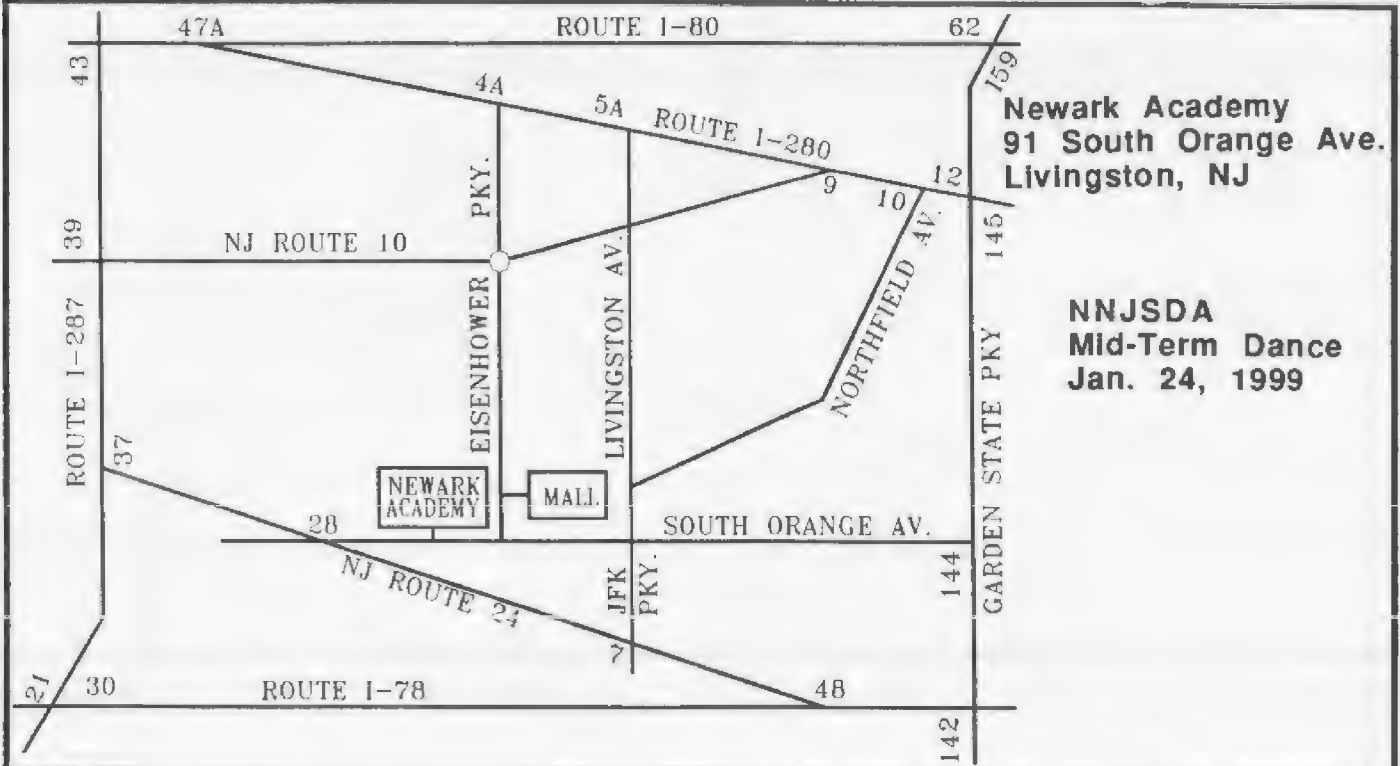

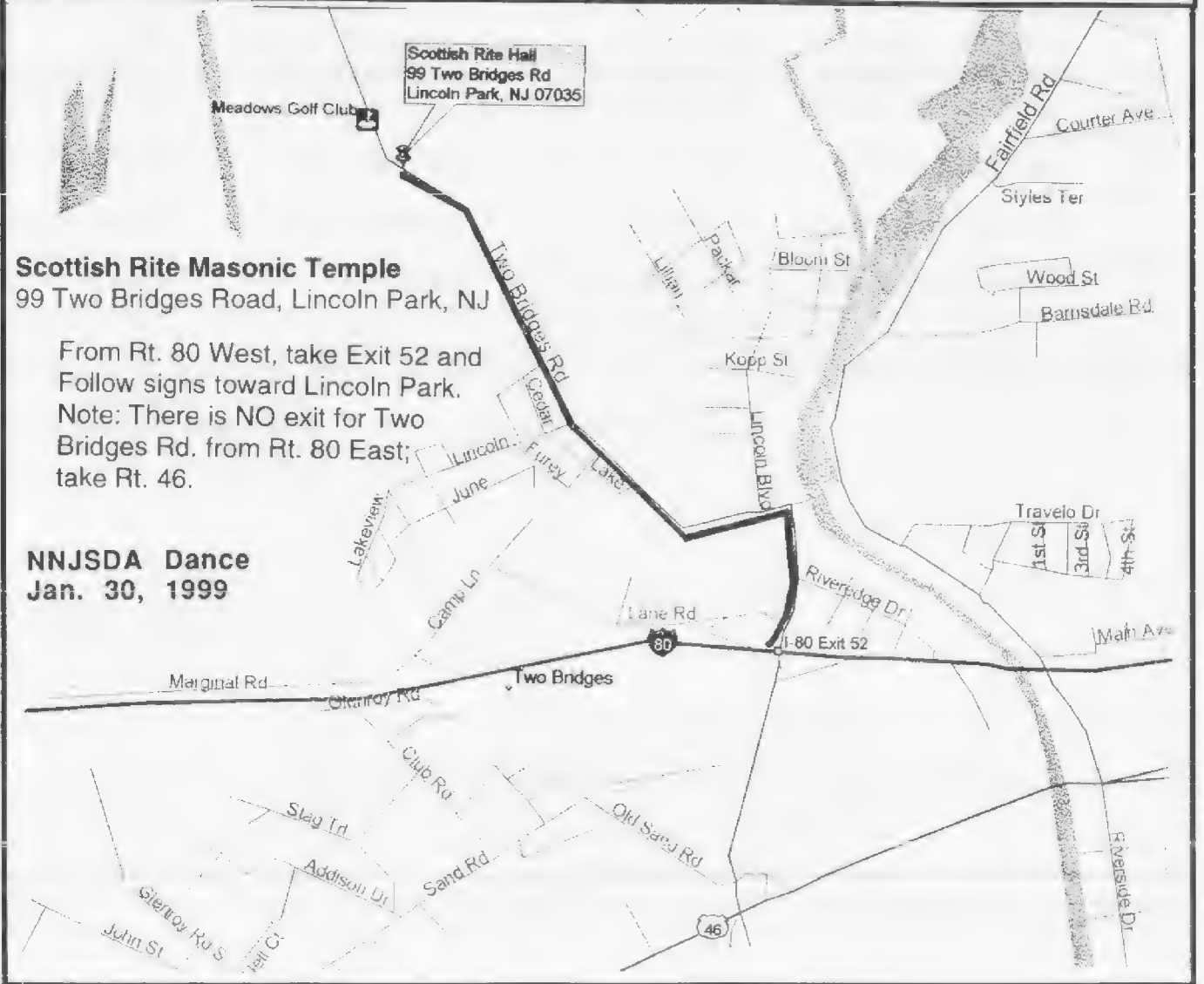
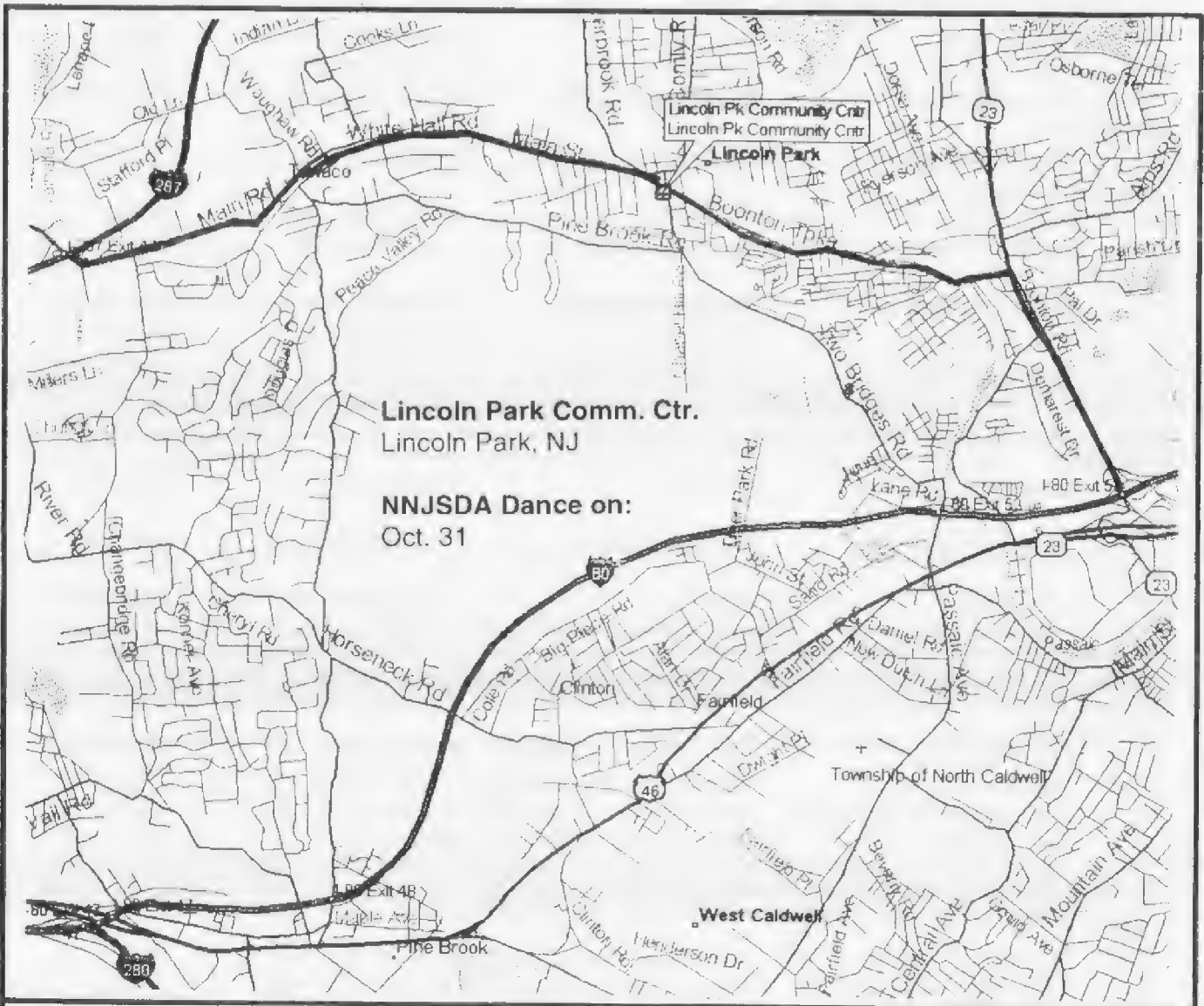
