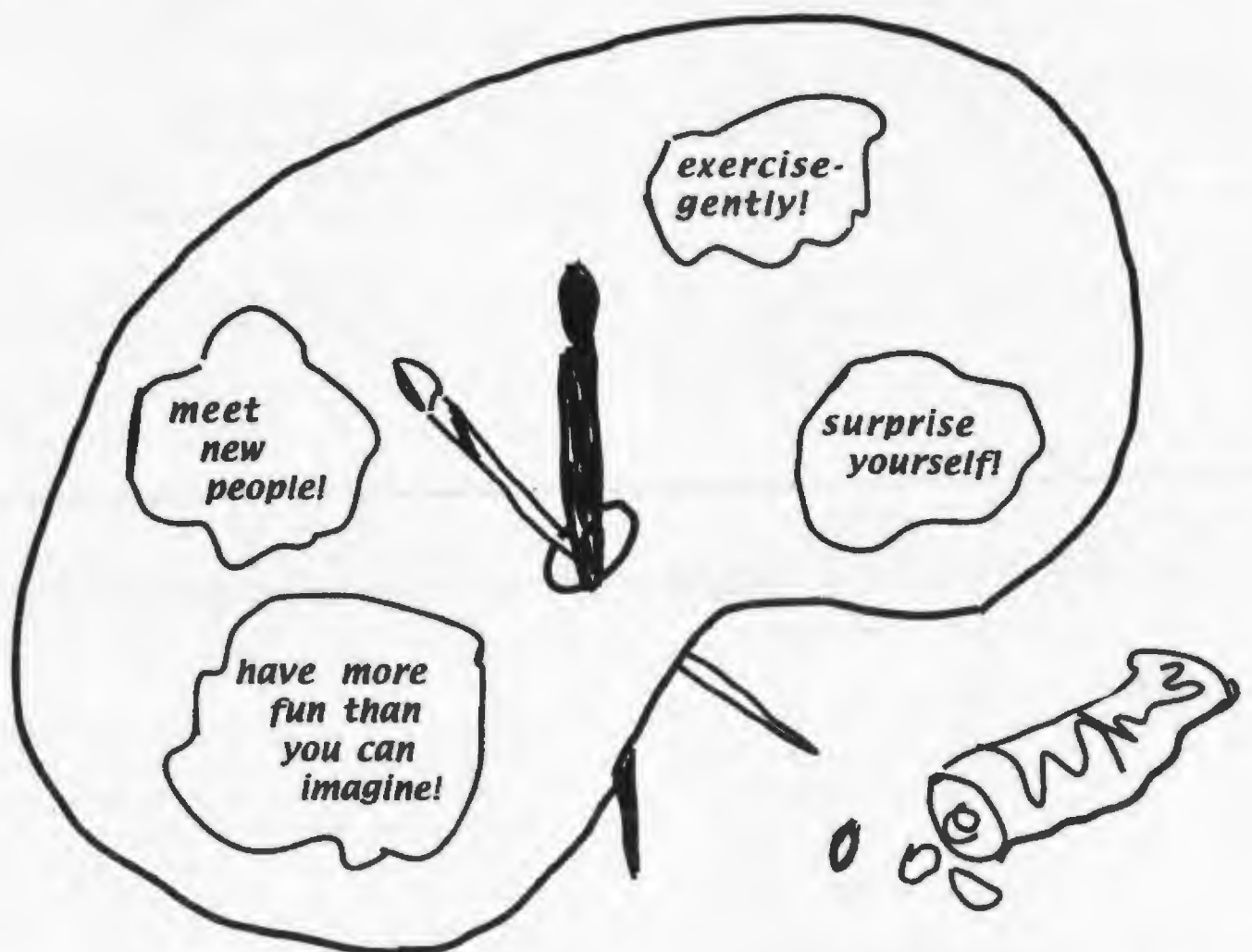

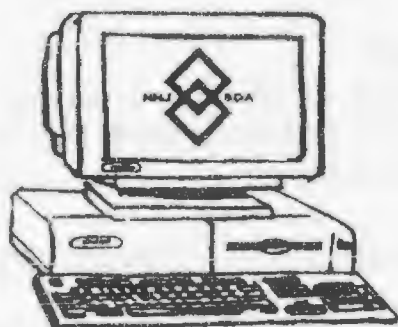

Betsy Gotta Receives CALLERLAB's Highest Honor

CALLERLAB awarded *The Milestone Award*, its highest honor, to Betsy at their convention in April. She more than met the five requirements for the award.

The recipient must have made an outstanding contribution to the field of square dancing, showing leadership in uncharted fields that has stood the test of time. The contribution must be divorced from personal gain, demonstrating an attitude that thinks of others first. The recipient must maintain a high standard of professional leadership, exercising broad influence in the square dance activity. The excerpts that follow are from the award presentation by John Kaltenthaler.



Betsy is a second-generation caller. She first attended a National Square Dance Convention (NSDC) in 1961 and hasn't missed one since. Betsy called her first tip as a ten-year-old and was successful. Her credentials include the following: Called at the 1963 NSDC and at every one since that time; has participated in clinics, panels and seminars for Legacy, CALLERLAB, and NSDC; in 2002 was honored in St. Paul for calling the 40th consecutive NSDC. Betsy feels that all callers, especially the more popular and/or full-time callers, should try to call at as many nationals as possible to give back to the dancers some of the pleasure earned from them.

Caller Don Coy's Million Dollar Dance

When Mark and I recently heard a radio jingle for the New York Lottery with a square dance theme, we felt sure that the caller was for real – not an actor imitating a caller. It turned out that not only was the caller for real. He was our own local Don Coy.

Don was chosen because the producers needed someone connected with square dancing or a western theme and went on line to search for a subject. They contacted Don and asked for a sample of his music. Shortly afterwards, they called and said that they were going to use him.

The producers mailed him a script, which Don practiced over a weekend. He did the calling segment and Dot, his wife, took the announcer's part. Unfortunately, the first thing the receptionist handed him when he came in to do the recording was a rewritten script. In the studio with Don were a producer, a script writer (who kept making changes), and a production manager. It took two hours to make the one-minute commercial.

She joined CALLERLAB in 1974 and hasn't missed a convention since. She is a CALLERLAB Accredited Caller-Coach. Her credits include the following: the first American woman to be elected to the Board of Governors, serving for twelve years. She serves on the following Committees within CALLERLAB: Women in Calling, Caller Training, Challenge, Contra, Youth and Caller-Coach. She responds to all of her E-mails from CALLERLAB. Just recently she spent more than 250 hours editing the Best of CALLERLAB Tapes. This last item certainly shows her qualification for outstanding, unselfish contribution.)

She was a member of LEGACY from 1981 through its end in 2002. She served on the Legacy Executive Committee. She has been a member of ROUNDALAB since 1985 and a long time member of CONTRALAB and of the Lloyd Shaw Foundation.. She calls all recognized dance programs from Contra thru C3B.

Betsy has called for one club, Rutgers Promenaders, for more than 36 years. She is one of the founders of the Callers Council of New Jersey; a charter member of the Square Dance Council of New Jersey; a member of Northern New Jersey Round Dance Leaders Council; and has served the New Jersey Square Dance Council Convention in the capacities as Education Chairman, Program Book Chairman, Registration Chairman, Program Chairman, Vice Chairman and General Chairman.

She has taught more than 50 sets of beginner classes as well as numerous Plus, Advanced and Challenge classes. Since retiring from her day job she has started two Intro to Square Dance programs for senior groups. In 2001, she was recognized at the International Association of Gay Square Dancers Convention with the *Golden Boot Award*, their highest award. She was recognized for her efforts to help bridge the gap between the gay and straight square dance communities. (Betsy is the only person ever to receive both the Golden Boot and the Milestone Awards.)

Betsy Gotta has more than met all of the requisite categories in her activities over many years and is extremely well deserving of the 2006 Milestone Award.

In Memoriam – Fred Hill

Fred Hill, long-time and beloved member of the square dance community, passed away on May 12, 2006 at age 95. Fred and Kathryn, his wife of 65 years, were featured in the May-September 2005 issue of *Grand Square* (page 18). They were subsequently honored at the November 2005 Mini-Festival for their numerous contributions to square dancing, including serving as NNJSDA Insurance Chairman for a quarter of a century.

Fred's life was one of service: an Army lieutenant during World War II, a captain in the NJ National Guard, a 20-year member of the Bogota Board of Education, and a 53-year member of Lions International (recipient of the organization's highest award). Having played with the Liverpool School Boys Soccer Club in England as a teenager, Fred was happy to volunteer at the 1994 World Cup of Soccer.

FROM THE EAST: Take Route 80 West to Exit 34B (Route 15 North). Go about 10.6 miles to the second Sparta exit. Route 517 South (the first is the business district exit). Turn left onto 517 South. FROM THE WEST: Take Route 80 East to Exit 19. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp onto Route 517 North. Route 517 bears right at the blinker light 2.5 miles from route 80. Stay on Route 517 North for another 4 miles until you get to the junction of Route 206 in Andover. Turn left onto Route 206 North. Proceed about one mile to the Exxon station on the right. Turn right onto Limecrest Road (Route 669) and follow for 3.7 miles to the next light. Turn left onto Newton-Sparta Road and go about 1/2 mile to Florence M. Burd School on the right.

FROM THE SOUTH: Either come north on Route 287, get on Route 80 West and follow "FROM THE EAST" directions or come north on Route 206, get on Route 80 West for a very short distance, take exit 25 (Route 206 North). From here, go 6.5 miles to the Exxon Station in Andover on the right, turn right onto Limecrest Road (Route 669) and follow for 3.7 miles to the next light. Turn left onto Newton-Sparta Road and go about 1/2 mile to Florence M. Burd School on the right.

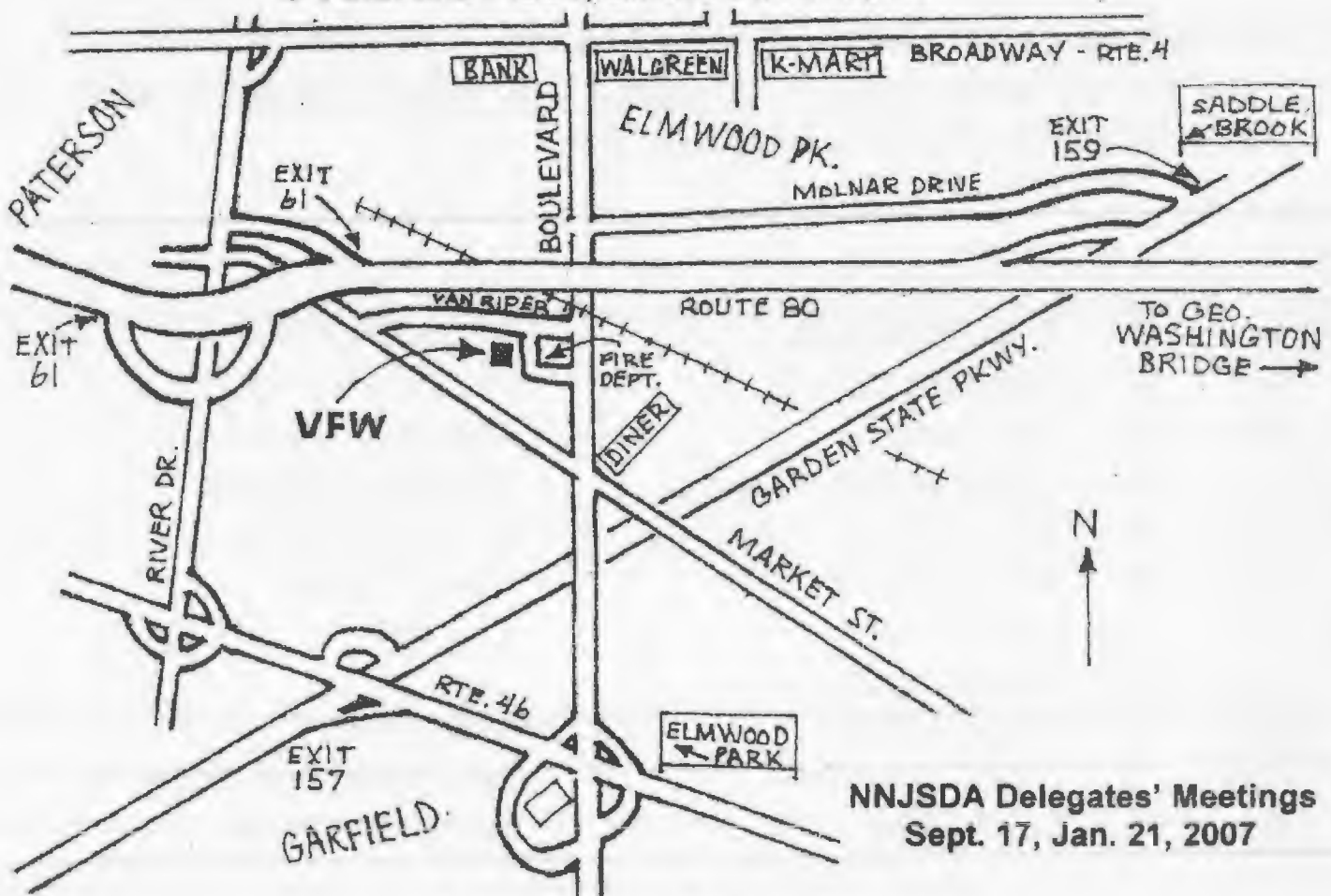

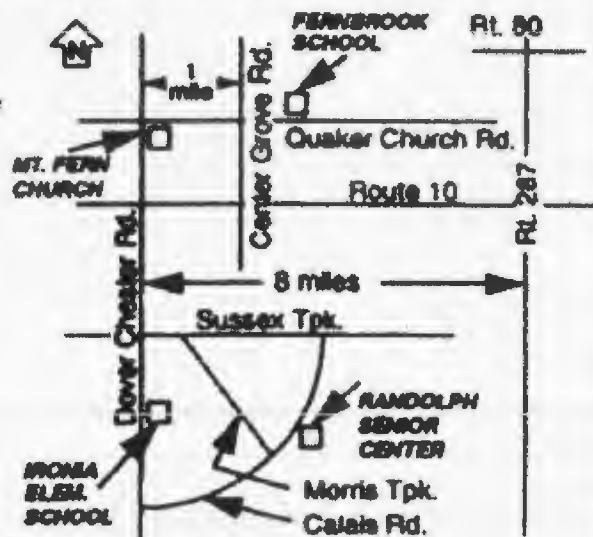
