Hello, everyone. It is a very exciting time to take over the reins of President. We are following in the footsteps of Donna Poyer and Mike Szekula, whose belief that "the NNJSDA should be in the business of providing services to the membership that they can't provide for themselves" has had a big impact on the look and feel of the NNJSDA over the last four years. (We share that belief, and we hope you will see that even more in evidence as time passes.)

As vice presidents, Donna and Mike spent a great deal of thought and time seeking callers and cuers for NNJSDA dances that the clubs aren't usually able to have on their own dance schedules. Since these callers and cuers are booked over two years in advance, we are even now moving into an exciting dance schedule with a lot of new names and faces. Suggestions from our members are always welcomed, too. (As is someone who wants to take on the role of 1<sup>st</sup> VP in charge of hiring callers and cuers – the position is still open.)

The NNJSDA had a history of holding education/leadership seminars every two years until 1996, after which the treasury wouldn't support them. Another of Donna's goals was to re-start the tradition, and that was realized at The Gathering in May with nearly 200 attendees from as far away as 350 miles. (Two NNJSDA clubs, AleMo and Circle Eights, had 15 and 14 attendees respectively.) We felt privileged to chair that event with a great committee, and we have passed the idea along to others at the National Convention and received great responses. **Continued on page 12**

[This is the sixth in a series of articles highlighting people active in the NNJSDA.] Helena & Ken Robinson

A boy named Ken and a girl named Helena lived about 20 minutes from each other, but it would take more than 20 years before they met. Their tale begins as a traditional Jewish love story, and then becomes a moving chronicle of devotion.

Ken's parents were square dancers. At a Star Thru dance, his mother spotted a "nice single Jewish woman" and asked for her phone number to pass along to her son. Ken and Helena met on Christmas Eve 1977 and married in 1979.

Though Ken had tried square dancing once, he hated it. Helena loved it. Ken loved Helena. Ken took lessons at Rutgers Promenaders from Betsy Gotta. The Robinsons immediately assumed the post of refreshment hosts and later held many other leadership roles in the club such as secretary, *Grand Square* reporter, NNJSDA delegate, and president (a position Ken has held for 10 years). Ken is also the NNJSDA webmaster (www.nnjsda.org). Having first written the code, he now hosts the site. "A website is only as good as the information provided." Updates, corrections, and suggestions may be emailed to Ken: website.updates@nnjsda.org.

Ken's most memorable dancing experiences are the first dance Helena took him to after he finished Mainstream lessons (a full Plus dance!), his first National Convention in Memphis in 1980 with over 30,000 dancers, and their first National Challenge Convention in 1982 when they were halfway through C1 lessons.

The Robinsons eventually reached the C4 dance program, but they always considered themselves *square dancers*, not C4 *dancers*. Rutgers Promenaders, with Ken as president, has remained a Mainstream club so people who have dropped out of the activity can come back fairly easily and rejoin.

Helena and Ken were definitely supporting square dancing, and then it was square dancing's turn to support them. A few months after their marriage, Helena was (mis)diagnosed with a "rare benign growth." In 1981, it was correctly diagnosed as Adenoid Cystic Carcinoma and she underwent her first cancer surgery, followed by five weeks of full-brain radiation. She was indomitable, heading off to work in New York after the early morning radiation and continuing to square dance.

It hadn't been tried for over 10 years. There was uncertainty as to whether people would attend anything other than the evening dance. It was being held in an untried location. The financial obligations were cause for great concern. And yet, The Gathering was a rousing success.

On May 12, the Gathering was held at the Douglass College Center in New Brunswick, NJ. Almost 200 dancers participated, with approximately 160 attending the afternoon educational sessions and 22 squares dancing in the evening. Participants came from as far as Rochester, NY in addition to NJ, PA, NY, CT, MD, and DE.

The afternoon consisted of a keynote address by Tom Miller, internationally known caller from Chest Springs, PA, followed by 15 breakout sessions addressing 56 different issues related to the square dance activity. A common complaint was: "There's so much good stuff that I can't attend all the sessions I want to!" The presenters were well prepared and provided handouts so the information could be taken back to the attendees' home clubs. In his captivating keynote address, Tom Miller challenged the attendees to be flexible in their thinking and tireless in their efforts. He acknowledged that their presence at The Gathering indicated commitment to the preservation and promotion of square dancing. He encouraged them to recognize that just because something didn't work somewhere else or for them at a previous time, it didn't mean that it wouldn't work for them now. He talked about successes where clubs weren't afraid to try new ideas, and he urged the audience not only to continue their own efforts, but to get others involved as well. The evening dance was a huge success. Tom entertained the dancers with his unique blend of choreography, humor, and exceptional singing, and Roy Gotta cued the rounds [doing a fine job as usual – Editor].



Keep dancing, and have fun! Rusty & Richard Ball, NNJSDA Presidents





Fran Wadel will be starting another class in the fall. We happily welcome our 16 new members from last year's class. We're looking forward to sharing the fun with a new crop of dancers.



"Dancing was our life, and she wasn't going to let her illness get in the way," said Ken. "The major adjustment she had to make was squaring up so she could hear, since she lost her right ear in the surgery. For Challenge dances she wore a badge on her back that said OUCH. This was because the surgeons used a section of her upper back to cover the area where the ear had been. The back stayed sensitive for years."


When the cancer reoccurred in 1991, Helena endured about one surgery per year, but she kept dancing until cancer claimed her life on July 25, 2005. Helena's courage and humor were an inspiration to everyone who had the joy of knowing her.

Professionally, Ken is an Open VMS System Manager (a "computer guy" to the rest of us). He enjoys cooking, baking (his "Supernatural Brownies" are incredible), wine tasting, and meteorology. He credits Toastmasters International with helping him conquer his fear of public speaking. He has traveled to Canada and about 75 percent of the 48 contiguous states, mostly for square dance events. Ken's birthday is June 1, 1951 ("I'm proud of my age"), and Helena was born on June 27, 1955.

#### Hear2Dance<sup>SM</sup> System Becoming Available for NNJSDA Area




Every dancer (squares, rounds, or country western) has been at a dance where it was difficult to hear due to bad acoustics, dead spots, distractions, or noise level. The problem can now be remedied by Hear2Dance<sup>SM</sup>, a system that lets a dancer hear inside the dance hall *and* in the outside hallway.

A transmitter (supplied by the club) is attached to the caller's amplifier and set to an unused FM band. Dancers who want to have a private PA system at their own ears wear an FM Walkman-style radio and earphones (under \$50) set to the selected frequency. Gardner Patton found the system, which is now being used at Bee Sharps and several other clubs. Now our own NNJSDA will have a transmitter available for dances. Look for the Hear2Dance<sup>SM</sup> logo on flyers/ads, and bring your radio and earphone/buds. (The NNJSDA has a radio to try if you inquire.) For more information, see *Hear-2-Dance.com*.

Our deep sympathy to Mal and Dotty Blotner and family on the loss of Mal's sister.



Roy and I get calls and emails for callers on a regular basis, as do members of the Callers' Council of NJ. Many requests are for square dance beginner parties, sometimes called "barn dances." Often the active members of the CCNJ are already booked and cannot help the group get a

caller. One of our members said, "If the activity is dying, why am I busy every day?"

At our June meeting, we had an animated discussion regarding the declining number of callers in our area. In the last 15 years, more than 15 callers have moved, retired, or been lost to health problems while only two new callers have been added in the same period.

Realizing that callers come from the dancer community, the CCNJ is offering a free caller's school to interested dancers. It will use the approved CALLERLAB Curriculum Guidelines and will be taught by Accredited Caller-Coaches and selected members of the CCNJ. The school will be held on Sunday afternoons beginning on October 7, 2007. The initial series will go for six weeks. It will be held at the Fairfield Reformed Church on Fairfield Avenue in Fairfield, NJ, beginning at 1:30 pm. We will pause for several weeks to allow for inclement weather and, if there is enough interest, we will resume classes in March.

The course is designed to teach dancers the basics of square dance calling with correct terminology and definitions. There will be practice microphone time and limited homework assignments. It is hoped that this course will lead to several new callers becoming available to teach and call for new dancers throughout the New Jersey area. The course is being offered by the Callers' Council of New Jersey at no charge as our commitment to the activity.






