





Lise Greene and Mark Bippes



Two ideals, learning and serving, weave through the lives of Lise and Mark. Lise, who grew up in Nutley, NJ, graduated from Montclair State University with a BA in English. Mark, raised in Rochester, NY, completed a BS in Mathematics at Albright College, and then spent five years in full-time Christian youth work. Their lives intersected at Moody Bible Institute, where they had both enrolled in the graduate school. They ended up in the same five classes in the first

semester! They married the following year. Both later completed an MA in Counseling at MSU.

After completing their master's degrees, they thought it would be fun to continue taking courses for pleasure instead of a degree. In 1981, they took Mainstream lessons sponsored by Warren Wheelers (a club they joined), followed by NNJSDA-sponsored Plus lessons over the summer. In 1988, they began round dance lessons with Al and Gale Spinks. Upon moving to Lake Hopatcong, they joined Sussex Spinners. Mark and Lise joined Reelers in 2001, where they have served as refreshment chairs, raid chairs, treasurer (Mark), secretary and newsletter editor (Lise). They are also members of Kittatinny Rangers, where Lise was reporter and ad maker. For the NNJSDA, they served as 3rd VP for Publicity for two years. Lise is currently in her second term as Co-President. However, Barbara Kanter, former *Grand Square* editor, has noticed, "Mark might not have his name up there, but whenever I see him, he's working."

Lise cites the first Kittatinny Rangers dinner dance she attended as her best dance experience. She enjoyed Johnny Preston's outstanding calling and mini-concert, as well as the delicious food, decorations, and tricky tray. Mark's favorite dance experience was at Western Wheelers this past season. "Howard Williamson was calling a very challenging Plus. There was one fun square in particular; we didn't break down, and it was the best tip ever!"

Just before they married, Mark took a summer job as a window installer, which eventually led him to establish his own construction company. He started volunteering with Habitat for Humanity in 1987 and became a full-time employee in 2000. After one and a half years in North Carolina, he became Construction Supervisor and Volunteer Trainer for Morris (County) Habitat for Humanity in New Jersey.

Lise went on to earn a PhD in Higher Education Administration at New York University. She was employed at Montclair State University for 25 years, the last 18 as Executive Assistant to the President. While Mark was in North Carolina, she spent a year in Denmark learning her mother's language in order to translate family diaries and letters into English (an ongoing project). Upon leaving MSU, she returned to Denmark to teach English for a semester, and then spent the following year in a graduate program to earn certification in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages. She also spent two years as a newspaper journalist and photographer. Currently, she is at Lehigh University in Pennsylvania as Presidential Writer.

Summer Square Dance Demos

Belles & Beaux performed a lively square dance demo at the Bergenfield Library in May with caller Fran Wadel. Participants included Bob Bachmann (Circle Eights), Barbara Berger, Brenda and Wayne Sherman, Rosann Flynn, and a member of John Callahan's senior group in Tenafly.

Fran explained to the audience how modern square dancing includes non-traditional music and songs, such as Broadway melodies, Disney songs, and other popular tunes. She then called in her sweet, lovely voice.

Some of her singing calls included "Walking My Baby Back Home," "Rocky Top," a Disney musical selection, and "Solomon Levi" ("Umpsy Daisy").

Fran had audience members participating in some of the tips. The audience included several pre-schoolers, ages 4–6, who had a great time dancing — especially when Fran directed them to "give a high-five" to the other dancers. And of course, the kids knew exactly what to do!

Other NNJSDA clubs also participated in demos over the summer at parades, festivals, the Monmouth Park racetrack (see article on page 54), the New Jersey State Fair/Sussex County Farm and Horse Show, and the Richmond County Fair.

What Moves Us?

Several NNJSDA dancers had the opportunity to dance and act in a commercial for an arthritis pain reliever following a casting call for square dancers from a professional agency. On short notice, dancers from New Jersey as well as New York and Pennsylvania auditioned in July at the agency on Madison Avenue in New York. Two Association dancers were hired – Paul Ingis (Belles & Beaux) as the caller and Hal Stoller (Reelers) as a lead dancer. Others were hired later as background dancers, but the featured square consisted of four actresses, two actors, and only two experienced dancers (Hal and a man from Philadelphia).

Paul said, "It was a lot of fun. In less than an hour, the actors and actresses were able to do a dozen calls quite well and they looked pretty good. I included Couples Promenade Halfway, Square Thru, Right and Left Thru, Veer Left, and Ferris Wheel, to bring them back to their corner. Thus, they were able to do a full singing call with only a small percentage of the Mainstream list."

The actual commercial was filmed on July 28 from 8 am to 4 pm. Paul described the commercial's three scenes. In the first, a woman is able to practice square dancing early in the day. In the second, she attends a dinner party. In the third, she enjoys an evening square dance. All of this is possible because of her pain medication, Vimovo: "What moves me," as she proclaims.

In addition to the featured square, extras were hired to sit at tables, and two squares danced in the background. That group had enough experienced dancers – including Hal's wife Irene and Paul's wife Joanne – to help the actors. In addition to calling, Paul was filmed teaching the main character some fine points of dancing.

"The number of people needed to produce the commercial was astounding," said Hal. "There were electricians, cameramen, wardrobe and makeup people, production and marketing people, and someone who sat outside in a truck running a generator."

Square Dance Competition

An open Mainstream square dance competition was held on Thursday, June 24, 2010, at the 59th National Square Dance Convention in Louisville, KY. Tony Oxendine and Randy Dougherty called for the 37 squares that had signed up to compete. We had the pleasure of being asked to fill in a square with dancers from the Buckaroos Club from PA. After a brief warm-up in which errors were not penalized, the competition began with one judge assigned to each square.

The judging was not on styling but on completing the execution of the call – being in the correct position with the proper partner. If the square broke down after a call, it was allowed to remain in the competition if the dancers repaired the square within 10 beats of the music. If unable to do so, the square received a yellow warning flag. A second mistake not repaired within 10 beats resulted in a "black flag," and the square was eliminated.

Spectators from our club who were watching the competition said that we were in one of the last six squares on the floor; we were elated to have lasted that long! It was one of the highlights of the Convention for us. The winning square put on a fine show of expert dancing, and it was a delight to see them finish.



Youth Square Dancing

CALLERS'

"We need more dancers on the floor" is the refrain that we have been hearing for decades. The short-term solution is to recruit younger dancers, ages 30–50. The very long-term targets are the youth that will dance for a few years now, then possibly drop out and return later in life.

Historically, youth have been introduced to square dancing through family, 4-H, or schools. Decades ago, many of our clubs had youth groups. Many of our club members had teen and pre-teen

children. Some were campers whose whole family square danced on weekends. Rutgers Promenaders was established for students on the college campus. Cross

Trail Squares had a youth division that held its own dances. The popular misconception in the greater New York City area is that square dancing is for seniors. We gave up on the youth; they grew up and moved on, without being replaced. Our fault!

Many callers across the country are working very hard to keep their youth groups or establish new groups. The Northwest Youth Competition has been drawing 400–500 youth each of the last 40 years. Here in the Northeast, Betsy Gotta (NJ), Mike Callahan (NY), and Tom Miller (PA) currently have middle/high school programs. Each of them got started with a personal contact.

In pockets all across the country there are "Home School" groups that have discovered square dancing as an enjoyable way to satisfy the physical education requirement. California has required each middle and high school to have a music and dance unit as part of physical education. Materials available to them are not interesting to the students; thus several callers are developing packages of music and instruction suitable for today's youth.

It was discovered that introducing competition generates interest and enthusiasm similar to the "Dancing with the Stars" TV show. Currently, a committee in CALLERLAB is looking for

> schools that could be interested in a pilot program of competitive youth square dancing.

> If you have contacts in a school, 4-H, or the Home School community, please send

me their contact information and we will try to start such a program in this area.

Tom Miller has expanded from one to four schools in Pennsylvania and was told that he has now introduced 5,000 kids to square dancing. Some of their parents asked him to help them start a new adult club so that they could join the fun.

Consider: Tom Miller, Tony Oxendine, Tim Marriner, and Betsy Gotta all started as youth dancers, then youth callers. The internationally known callers of the future will be from the youth dancers/callers of today and tomorrow.

Join us at the September Delegates meeting to talk more about this important subject.

Hal and Paul agreed that the producers had a genuine concern for authenticity. "They wanted square dancing to be represented as accurately as possible and were willing to make changes to their plans and costumes to accomplish that," said Paul. "I and the other dancers answered their questions and gave them advice and they listened intently." Hal noted that the producers supplied new square dance outfits from a western wear store to ensure a good variety of colors and styles.

Hal described the filming: "There were large spotlights adding to the heat in the non-air-conditioned hall. We would dance for a minute or so, and then someone would holler 'cut' and everything stopped. After they moved some lights, cameras, or people around, we would repeat the process. Paul managed to mix up the calls to keep it fun and interesting. The most exciting part was when a cameraman got in the center of the featured square and we had to dance around him." Paul then amused everyone by calling, "Heads promenade go half way round, down the middle with a right and left thru, turn that girl as fast as you can, don't trip over the cameraman."

Except for the extreme heat, the dancers were excited about being in a commercial. It will be shown on the Internet by the pharmaceutical company Astra-Zeneca. "In addition to promoting the new drug, maybe the commercial will promote interest in square dancing," noted Hal. Yes - that 's what moves us!
