Letter to the Editor

"Challenge to Callers (and Dancers!)" was published in the May 2012 issue of *Grand Square*. Written to pass along a dancer's suggestion, the article challenged the callers: "How many different calls can you include during one dance? All 68 at a Mainstream dance? All 30 at a Plus dance? How about all Advanced and Challenge?" It also reminded the dancers that they "need to be prepared to do their part."

I agree with the challenge, but I do not feel it goes far enough. The Plus program is not 30 calls, but 68 + 30, or 98 calls. I believe that at a dance of whichever program, the caller should attempt to include as many of the calls through that program as possible. In return, dancers with a sound foundation should be able to execute all those calls. It is reasonable that there be an emphasis on the calls of the latest program mastered, but let us not forget the Mainstream program where we all began.

[Editor's note: We agree! While the point of last year's "challenge" was to encourage callers to use, for example, the 30 Plus calls during each Plus dance, it would be great to include all the Mainstream calls as well ... and so on for each dance program.]

Square Dance Festivals: Expanding Your Horizons

The NNJSDA, our local association, does an excellent job supporting dancers and clubs in our area. The Patron and Raid programs encourage dancers to visit clubs other than their own. The Association's special events, including our Mini-Festival, give dancers the opportunity to enjoy talented callers who are not usually in this area.

You can expand your dancing horizons even further when you venture outside the NNJSDA. Many events within driving distance of northern New Jersey advertise in *Grand Square* and put flyers on tables at our clubs. We are lucky to have two such weekends in New Jersey, Peel the Pumpkin (Asbury Park) in October and Harvest Moon Classic (Iselin) in November. The selection greatly increases if you are willing to travel to other states and Canada. My husband, Louis, and I travel to New York, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, Washington DC, Ohio, other states, and Canada for square dance festivals and conventions annually.

The rewards are tremendous: developing new friendships, exposure to national and international callers who use different music and choreography, enjoying entertainment at after parties, building confidence in your dancing ability through concentrated floor time, attending workshops or an introduction to the next program, and taking advantage of DBD and "specialty squares" time slots, *all under one roof!* Many dancers view traveling to festivals as an opportunity to visit other cities and sightsee.

We all know how important attendance is to keeping a club healthy. The same is true for festivals, but on a much larger scale. Holding a square dance weekend or festival is a very expensive undertaking – publicity, hiring a staff of up to 10 callers and cuers, renting ballrooms at a hotel, and printing schedules and festival books. Committees of dancers generously volunteer their time and energy, but the financial costs remain.

Unfortunately, insufficient attendance at some festivals has resulted in their down-sizing and, occasionally, cancellation. What a terrible loss of some exceptional opportunities for fun! Do yourself a favor; give yourself the gift of a square dance weekend. Try the setting that so many of your fellow dancers look forward to all year round. Enter the world of square dancing outside of the NNJSDA.

Tips for Your Tips

A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer

The Sound of Music

To borrow from a famous song, the dance floor is alive with the sound of music. Music is what makes our activity *dancing*, not merely a caller moving human chess pieces around the floor.

First, there is the flavor of the music. Peppier tunes give a bounce to your step, while smooth tunes make you feel like you are gliding across the dance floor. Sometimes, familiar songs entice you to sing along with the lyrics.

Square dance music has a consistent beat. The beat helps keep you and your fellow dancers stepping at the same time. This is particularly evident during a Promenade; there is a rhythm and feeling of togetherness when everyone in the hall steps "squarely" on the beat.

Part of the mission of CALLERLAB, an international organization of square dance callers, is to maintain a list of the calls that are used in the various dance programs. For each call, there is a definition (how to execute the call) and a timing note (suggested number of steps to complete the call). Squares move more smoothly through the calls when dancers do not rush, but instead spend the full count for each part of the call. A perfect example is Grand Square, where four beats/steps are allotted for each "side" of an individual's square. When executed accurately, nobody gets stepped on. This is particularly important if Grand Square is called from a starting position other than your standard static square. Interesting note: When Grand Square is called from a standard squared up set, you will have two facing lines after six steps, if done accurately! The proper execution of calls becomes even more necessary with the more intricately timed calls (such as Relay the Deucey and Teacup Chain, in the Plus program). In these cases, proper pacing helps to maintain the square's symmetry during the execution of the call's various parts.

Not all dancers are aware that singing calls have a structure to their choreography that corresponds to the structure of the song. A singer's structure is break, figure, figure, break, figure, break. The break (frequently starting with Circle Left, Grand Square, or Ladies Chain/Promenade) is the "chorus" of the song. The figure (frequently starting with Heads/Sides Promenade Half, or Square Thru Three) is the "verse." A woman should be with her opposite man when the middle break is called, and should be back with her original partner for the end break. So, if your square breaks down during the figure choreography, the breaks are your opportunity to straighten things out, if you so choose. Also, since the breaks are during the song's chorus, they are opportunities for dancers to sing along during a Circle Left or Promenade home, which adds to the enjoyment of the dance.

Let the beat of the music guide you. Let the "feel" of the music move you. Enjoy the *dance!*



CCNJ President's Message

The CCNJ Mid-Winter Mania dance was a big success with nine squares participating. My thanks to dance coordinator Pat Push, the ten callers, and all the dancers for their lively participation. The next CCNJ dance, Mid-Summer Mania, is scheduled for July 28 at the PeopleCare Center in Bridgewater. Mark your calendars now.



At its March 9 meeting, the Callers' Council of New Jersey elected new officers: President Ron Kapnick, Vice President Rich Delgado, Recording Secretary Wayne Applegate, Corresponding Secretary Mike Winnick, and Treasurer Don Coy.

Square dance history can be very interesting and informative. In addition to the archived issues of *Grand Square* (<u>nnjsda.org/grand_square</u>), which provide a history of square dancing in New Jersey, there is now an archive of *Sets in Order*, an international square dance magazine published from 1948 to 1985 by Bob Osgood.

Sets in Order started as a southern California square dance magazine, and after a few years became an international publication for square dancers worldwide. It contained instructions, illustrations, and information on how to do the calls, places to dance around the world, style tips to make one's dancing better, and dance etiquette. There was also help for square dance leaders on topics such as how to plan theme dances, organize a club, and recruit and keep new dancers. There were articles for callers on how to use the new calls that were being introduced and reviews of new square and round dance records. It provided a venue for callers, record producers, and others to advertise square dance products. Of course, it had reviews of square dance events such as the national conventions and even short paragraphs and letters describing state and city special dances.

Much of this information is still relevant today, especially on how to lead a club and ideas for special theme dances. Some of the articles are just for historical interest, such as how women's fashions changed over the years, or how square dance travel and vacations changed as methods of transportation evolved. Regardless of how you use the information, it's worth a look.

Digital versions of the magazine are archived in Penrose Library at the University of Denver; they are also available online. To view the issues, check the index at newsquaremusic.com/sioindex.html. You can also purchase a two-DVD set of all the issues from lloydshaw.org/Catalogue/CDs&Cassettes/CassettesCDs.htm (the Lloyd Shaw Foundation). In addition, a Google search on a square dance topic should result in several references to information in these magazines. Have fun!



Where's the Dance?

Have you ever planned a trip and wondered if there were square dances taking place at your destination or traveling to/from it? Have you been on a trip, found yourself with a free afternoon or evening, and wondered if you could find a square dance to fill the time?

Until recently, you would have had to find a local website or publication and spend many hours researching. But now, there is a "one-stop" website to find dances all over the United States and in other countries: <u>wheresthedance.com</u>.

You can search for dances by zip code, address, type of dance, event type, and date range. The results can be viewed in list format, on a calendar, or on a map. This is a very powerful asset to dancers who travel. If you find any errors, you can report them and they will be quickly corrected.

There is a link to the "Where's the Dance" site on the NNJSDA homepage, along with links to many other useful sites for square dancers including animations and videos of various calls. Check out the website – and watch for a new design coming soon.
