Where in the World Have Our Dancers Been? Memorable Dance Moments Submitted by *Grand Square* Readers

When I lived on Ærø, a small island in Denmark, I danced with a local club. Although the caller did not speak English, he used the standard English calls, albeit with a Danish accent. The club members were fully accustomed to his pronunciation, and I usually understood him, too. However, during one tip, I heard him call: "Right and Left Thru, and Cover Your Face." I started the Right and Left Thru, and then, stumped by the next part of the call, stopped abruptly – as it happened, right in front of the caller. He stopped calling and stared as the entire square came to a halt behind me. I whispered: "Cover my face?" He enunciated a bit more clearly: "Wit' de cuppa you face." With the couple you face! Then I really did cover my face with my hands to hide the redness of embarrassment as the other dancers roared with amusement over the American who didn't understand English. We followed a family tradition by taking lessons with the Middletown Ramblers in 2013. Lori's parents, aunt, and uncle were dancers, and the latter two enjoyed visiting clubs when they traveled. So last April, before completing Mainstream, we looked for dances during our southwest vacation. Lori checked links to clubs' websites, maps, event calendars, and contact information. Good starting sites were wheresthedance.com and dosado.com/clubsorgs/default.htm, which lists clubs in all 50 states and worldwide.

In the Las Vegas area, only one club potentially meshed with our availability on a Sunday night, when they hold classes. Even though it happened to be Easter, the club held a lesson, and we served as angels for the first time. Score one! More good luck followed with a club in Utah having a special dance with Mike Sikorsky calling. The club is far from callers' travel circuits, so it was a treat for them to dance to a live caller. It was no surprise that both clubs were hospitable, but the fun extended beyond dancing. Dancers shared pointers on restaurants and even retirement planning.

We received our very first dangles from one of the clubs, and learned that the USDA's Traveler Program (*usda.org/traveler.htm*) offers awards for visiting and dancing in a certain number of states. Given our positive travel-and-dance experience, we are eager to continue exploring square dancing in the good ol' USA and beyond. No question about it: Square dancing *is* "friendship set to music."

Although the venue was quite far for some dancers, and the halls were not within walking distance of one another, the rooms were spacious and very clean with plenty of seating. The Plus hall drew the largest crowd, and was the setting for a huge finale with all dancers.



Cuers include Randy Preskitt (Washington), Debbie Taylor (Washington), and Jeanine Norden (Oregon). Tim Marriner will also be teaching line dancing.

Local Portland clubs will host a trail-in dance on August 28, featuring Portland's finest local callers. For those who can stay awake, there are legendary after parties.

RAID AND OSIF PROGRAMS – UPDATED

In response to suggestions from dancers, the NNJSDA Raid and One Square Is Fair programs have been changed. Beginning this past January, clubs can complete each program twice in each dance season.

<u>Raid</u>: The number of points remains 200. Clubs may complete the program twice by earning at least 400 points, using two separate forms.

OSIF: The number of NNJSDA dances at which a club must have at least one square of official members has been reduced to 50% (rounded down). Clubs can complete the program twice in one season.

Completing either program once earns a club a 50¢ per member reduction in NNJSDA dues for the following season. Completing both programs once, or either program twice, earns a \$1 per member reduction (which currently equates to *no dues at all*). The current dance season began on June 1, 2014.

We celebrated our 60th anniversary! We were privileged to have wonderful live music, which was provided by a group called Ruckus. More than 200 dancers were in attendance, and we were raided (albeit without the usual ceremony) by Lakeland Squares, Reelers, and Y Squares.

Lovingly produced scrapbooks and photo montages were provided by the talented Koft and Platania clans (specifically Kathy and Julie Koft and Ginny Platania). Your effort, talent, and devotion to making this day such a success were greatly appreciated.



Rosemary Biggs, a longtime dancer and friend of the club, provided a wonderful custom-made cake decorated in the club colors - and looking almost too good to eat!

Another milestone occurred: president Ken Robinson's birthday, which coincided with his official last day in this role. He was presented with a plaque and many words of appreciation.



Dance the Year Away ... to 2015!

Happy 35th Birthday, Belles & Beaux

1970s – Belles & Beaux held its first class at Waldwick High School in 1978, with Ken and Edna Franz as students. In 1979, the class graduated and started dancing at Glen Rock Community Church, but the club still held classes in Waldwick for a while.

1980 – The club moved to Hamilton School in Glen Rock and joined the NNJSDA. Lynn and Bob Gordon cued round dancing, followed by Jeanne Brody. Publicity flyers included a picture of a fish to signify that the club was Main*stream*.

1991 – We (Rusty and Richard) were part of three squares in a class at Glen Rock High School with Dick Mazziotti, who was also the club caller. He had taken over from Paul Brody, who had recently passed away. To pay for the graduation party, we held a 50/50 at each class. As Dick was calling at one of our first dances after graduation, Richard and another dancer wrapped him in toilet paper; everyone was laughing, and Dick did not miss a single call.

1990s through early 2000s – At the Christmas dances, Ken Franz dressed as Santa and led everyone into a maze and back out again. From January through March, the club had a student dance every month with Dick and a guest caller. Another tradition was that Ken and Edna had a soup and sandwich get-together at their house for the students and angels at the end of the second semester.

1986 onward – Mystery Bus Rides brought Belles & Beaux to clubs in various locations throughout New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Connecticut. For eight years, we were able to fill two buses. Itineraries over the years included dancing at the State Aquarium and Ellis Island. We also had our famous Five Boroughs bus ride; because of the bus size, we were not allowed to use certain bridges and roads, and went through all five New York boroughs to reach the Long Island City Festival just in time to miss dancing with Dick. On another trip, the second bus broke down. But we always had fun. More recently, the event has been called a Mystery Bus Raid.

1983 to 2000 – The club had a New Year's Eve dance with almost 100 dancers. Gradually, attendance dropped and the hall fee more than doubled, so our last celebration was in 2000 with four squares and a meal catered by Howard Richman. During those years, we learned that the club had a reputation for being stuck up. (Happily, that reputation has changed.) We almost had to fold for lack of participation and leadership. For one year, Richard Ball and Margaret Guyre shared all the officer positions. We were down to one square dancing, and one class had a single student! When our treasury was low, we had book sales and pie auctions. Richard, the auctioneer, would tell people that they wanted a pie for \$10, and they would buy it.

2000 and beyond – Rosann and Billy Flynn took lessons with Fran Wadel, the club's new (and current) teacher. They were so enthusiastic that the club began to grow again. We started our big dances and money-makers like the Murder Mystery and the live Klezmer band. Belles & Beaux bestowed life membership on people who had contributed to the club. Honorees include Jeanne Brody, Keith Douglas and family, Edna and Ken Franz, Patricia and Jim Broderick, and Lenora and David Libeskind.

Belles & Beaux has had a home in each of Glen Rock's five schools as well as the Jewish Center and Community Church. We have come a long way since 1979: from being one of the newest clubs (with problems) to being one of the most fun clubs.

As a historical note, in 1960 a club named Belles & Beaux in Tenafly joined the newly formed NNJSDA. That club no longer exists, and is not related to the Belles & Beaux of today.



A few significant differences between straight and LGBT (Lesbian/Gay/Bisexual/Transgendered) square dance conventions were highlighted in *A Guide to IAGSDC Conventions*. Here are some edited excerpts that I'd like to share with you.

Straight dancers are welcome at IAGSDC (International Association of Gay Square Dance Cubs) conventions. However, some of their customs may seem a little weird to straight dancers at first. LGBT dances are called at a faster pace. Don't be surprised to hear familiar callers using new or untraditional music. LGBT audiences generally prefer contemporary music with a faster beat.

Since genders aren't usually balanced, LGBT dancers don't pay any attention to physical gender vs. dance gender. Many LGBT clubs practice All Position Dancing (APD) and Dance by Definition (DBD). This means that callers may use more sashayed or non-standard positions for familiar calls than you're used to.

LGBT dancers dress very casually. They don't have special costumes or dresses. Because LGBT square dancing is often higher-energy than straight square dancing, short-sleeved shirts are very common, as are T-shirts. Collared long-sleeve shirts for men and full crinolines for women are usually too warm to dance in for the faster and more intense pace of an LGBT floor.

Single dancers of either gender are always welcome at LGBT square dance functions. They are the norm, not the exception. At LGBT conventions, people can square up as individuals or as partners. Each tip is an open square.

To square up as a single, walk out onto the floor (preferably up front where the caller can see you and help you form a square if necessary). If you want to dance the boy's part, stand in the boy's spot and hold up your right hand. Similarly, if you want to dance the girl's part, stand in the girl's spot and hold up your left hand. If you can dance either part, stand in the center on one side of a forming square and hold up both hands.

Just as LGBT dancers are instructed to use straight "fluff" at straight dances, it's considered polite to use LGBT "fluff" at LGBT dances. If you'd like to be shown how to do any of the fluff (such as Weave the Ring), don't be afraid to ask the people in your square or the caller, after the tip.

LGBT dancers often hug after a tip. If you don't want to be hugged, hold out your hand to shake hands.

The Northern New Jersey Square Dancers Association offers four great programs as incentives to visit other clubs as well as NNJSDA dances. In a nutshell for 2014-15:

For Individual Dancers

<u>Patron</u> – Attend regular dances at 12 of the Association clubs, and have the Patron form signed by each club. Award: a dangle and free admission to an NNJSDA dance. Earn the award as many times as you like.

<u>Freeloader</u> – Attend three NNJSDA summer dances plus the Mini-Festival in the same year, and have the Freeloader form signed by the NNJSDA treasurer. Award: a dangle and free admission to an NNJSDA dance.

For Clubs (each program can be completed twice in one year)

<u>Raid</u> – Visit other NNJSDA clubs' regular dances with at least one square of official club members during a single dance season, have the Raid form signed by each club visited, and accumulate 200 points (based on distance between clubs). Award: reduction in NNJSDA dues the following year.

One Square Is Fair – Attend at least six NNJSDA events during a single dance season with at least one square of official club members signing in. Award: reduction in NNJSDA dues the following year.
