NNJSDA Presidents' Message

This year has been marked by the passing of some beloved dancing friends. Caller John Kaltenthaler not only entertained and challenged us, but helped to develop a new generation of callers. (See page 8.)

Closer to home, we mourn the loss of Kathy Randall, who served as 3rd vice president and then

treasurer of the NNJSDA with her husband, Tony Milito. Even as she bravely endured cancer treatments, they continued to dance. Our most poignant memory is being in a square with Kathy and Tony while Tim Marriner called to "I Hope You Dance." Kathy is a light gone too soon from our dancing world. (See page 6.)

Many thanks to our outgoing Association president, Mike Szekula, for his two years of leadership, the second of which he served as co-president with Vic. We are counting on his experience and guidance during this first year of our joint presidency.

We also rely on the collective wisdom of the entire executive board (including appointees and trustee/advisors), most of whom are continuing in their positions. That stability will, we hope, make the NNJSDA ever more responsive to the member clubs' needs. As with so many worthwhile endeavors, it is a team effort; we count as part of that team not only the NNJSDA officers and advisors, but also the delegates who represent our member clubs at the meetings. Let's always remember why we are here: TO DANCE! And to do that, we must keep our wonderful activity alive and thriving.

As we go through the coming year, the Association board wants to do what we can to make your dancing more pleasurable and accessible. We often make changes to how the dances are scheduled and conducted in response to input from our clubs.

Recently, the Association responded to requests from the delegates by reducing the number of dances from 13 in 2015-16 to 11 in 2016-17. We also scheduled a dance in 2016 alternating Plus and Advanced, which was well attended. In 2017, we will again offer this format, but without rounds and with early Plus so that Plus dancers get more floor time. These changes are part of our effort to meet the different preferences of our Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and round dancers.

During July and August, the NNJSDA held four Mainstream dances to provide new graduates and others enjoyment at their comfort level. We experimented with alternating Mainstream tips and rounds throughout the dances, rather than early Mainstream or early rounds. If this program is deemed successful, we will repeat it in 2017.

From September 2016 through June 2017, the NNJSDA will hold eight more events, including the Mini-Festival in November and the Midterm student-level dance in January. All of these events will have great callers and feature several different formats in various locations around the state to suit all of our dancers.

We need your input and constructive suggestions. The Association doesn't function for itself; its whole purpose is dancers serving dancers in the northern New Jersey region. Tell us what you think. Give us ideas about venues for new dance halls for our regular events and for the Mini-Festival. Tell us about callers from out of the area whom we may be able to bring here. (Several recent highly praised Association callers were suggested to us by club members.) Do you have any information on ways to improve recruitment and retention of square dancers? All the clubs would appreciate it. The more we hear from you, the more responsive we can be to your needs.

We look forward to seeing you in a square. Yee ha! Nancy and Vic Ammons

In Memoriam: John Kaltenthaler

The first time I danced to John Kaltenthaler's calling, I was impressed by how he seemed to radiate good will to everyone. He was focused on giving the dancers a good time as well as making sure they danced correctly. John had served in the Army and worked for IBM, but his true passion was square dancing.

As the first Executive Director of Callerlab, John took the lead in negotiations for music licensing with BMI and ASCAP. The sponsoring facility (dance hall or square dance club) was actually responsible to be licensed to play copyrighted music; but in fact most sponsors were unable to do this, and the clubs had no strong group to negotiate for them. John carried the burden of negotiations for Callerlab, and now it is the callers who assume responsibility for licensing.



John, one of the first Callerlab Accredited Caller-Coaches, served for many years as chair of the Caller Training Committee, and the papers he wrote are still used. He was active in the Callers' Council of New Jersey, driving from his home in Pocono Pines, Pennsylvania, to work with new callers in schools sponsored by the CCNJ.

John and his wife, Freddie, were married for 64 years. In addition to Callerlab and the CCNJ, they were active in Legacy (a leadership training group) and the Overseas Dancers Association. John received the Sets in Order American Square Dance Society's Silver Spur Award, the Callerlab Milestone Award (service to square dancing), and the Callerlab Gold Card (service to Callerlab).

On May 9, 2016, John passed away. We in the northern New Jersey area were lucky to dance to John K's calling. We in the CCNJ were privileged to learn from John and to work with him. *Betsy Gotta, Caller*



Starting with two-step so you can get some practice at square dances

Tips for Your Tips

A series devoted to helping you become a more confident dancer Playing with Ocean Waves

Many calls in the Basic and Mainstream programs are defined with a starting formation of facing dancers. However, to make choreography more interesting and challenging, some callers will use a mini-wave or an ocean wave as the starting formation for those same calls. The facing couples/ocean wave rule states that any-thing that can be done from facing couples can be done from an ocean wave and vice versa. Thinking quickly and knowing how to proceed from your formation will determine whether your square is successful or not.

<u>Pass Thru</u> – The majority of the time, Pass Thru is called when you are facing another dancer. From this position, imagine the call has two parts: (1) taking one step to be side-by-side with the person (right shoulder to right shoulder), and (2) taking another step to move past him, thus completing the passing action. However, if you are in an ocean wave when Pass Thru is called, quickly think to yourself, "I have already done the first part. Now I need to take only one more step to complete the call." In short, ocean wave = half of a Pass Thru or Pull By.

This thought process can be extended and applied to other calls. In each case, regardless of whether the starting position is facing dancers, a mini-wave, or an ocean wave, *the end position is the same*.

<u>Right and Left Thru</u> – The step that completes the passing action is followed *immediately* by a Courtesy Turn. Note: The Courtesy Turn comes a lot faster than you think.

 $\underline{\text{Dosado}}$ – The step that completes the passing action is followed immediately by taking a step to one's right to pass back-to-back with the other dancer.

<u>Square Thru</u> – The step that completes the pull by action is followed immediately by turning one quarter (90°) into your box, followed by extending your left hand for the next Pull By. Note: You will be working with the dancers from your original wave.

 $\underline{\text{Turn Thru}}$ – From a right-handed ocean wave, the Turn Thru is with the person whose right hand you are holding.

<u>Slide Thru</u> – The step that completes the passing action is followed immediately by men turning one quarter to their right and ladies turning one quarter to their left. Note: Do not assume you will end in facing lines; follow the definition.

<u>Right and Left Grand</u> – Imagine your square is in a thar position, which is really two ocean waves crossing each other in the middle. Following the same thought process, it requires taking only one step forward to complete the first right hand Pull By (usually followed by left, right, and left Pull Bys). In the case of <u>Weave the Ring</u>, the first step forward completes the first right shoulder pass.

Load the Boat (Plus) – When starting from a tidal wave, frequently the caller will helpfully suggest that dancers rear back before they begin to execute the call. When you rear back to momentarily "become" two facing lines, it is easier to recognize whether you are a center or an end, and to see which dancer you are "facing" and thus with whom you will interact.

Go ahead: Get your feet wet, and have fun playing with ocean waves!

What Part of "No" Don't You Understand?

A man walks into a bar and sees a very attractive woman. He asks, "May I buy you a drink?" She replies, "No, thank you."

He tries again: "I've got reservations at a very expensive restaurant. Would you like to have dinner with me?" "No, thank you."

Not willing to accept defeat, he tries yet again: "If I buy you a car, will you go out on a date with me?" "No, thank you."

The man in this story brings to mind the Lorrie Morgan hit song "What Part of No." He would fail a course in basic salesmanship, where one is taught the three possible answers to any sales transaction: Yes, No, or Maybe.

If the customer says Yes, sign the paperwork. *Then stop talking and walk away*. You'd waste the person's time by continuing to tout the benefits of owning your widget.

If the customer says Maybe, use your product knowledge to highlight the benefits of your widget over your competitor's, and use your psychological skills to help counter any reservations of the prospective widget owner.

But if the customer says No, *stop talking and walk away*. The person is not open to what you're selling. Continued pressure will turn the customer off to both you and your widget. You risk having an irate person warn colleagues against dealing with you.

How does all this apply to square dancing? When selling your lessons, you'll be met with the same possible responses. If people say Yes, stop selling. Take their name, number, and email; tell them about barn dances between now and the start of lessons. If people say Maybe, encourage them by pointing out the mental, physical, and social benefits. But if people say No, stop talking and walk away. *You're not bad because you enjoy square dancing, and they're not bad because they don't want to square dance.*

For years, leaders have been racking their brains to figure out ways to lure people into lessons. The most recent attempt at getting commitment-phobic people to commit to square dancing is Callerlab's Condensed Teaching Order. The program consists of the most-used Mainstream calls; the intention is to get people dancing after 12 weeks.

But more and more people have become happy living life online in the comfort of their homes – texting, emailing, tweeting, and checking Facebook. It's hard for many square dance leaders to accept this fact, and look for creative ways to find (and cut the costs involved with teaching) those who actually want to learn to dance. Like the man at the beginning of this article, they may be spinning their wheels trying to convince people to commit after they've told us very clearly they don't want to commit.

Would you sign up if we do away with the country music and cowboy clothing? If we shorten the number of calls? If we shorten the lesson time? "No, thank you."

Once again, what part of "No" don't we understand?

There's good news: Trends change. After square dancing experienced an upswing, we're now on the downside of the curve. Eventually, people will tire of sterile electronic interactions and seek the social, mental, and physical benefits of in-person activities. Our main job is to keep our clubs financially viable so that when the tide turns again in our favor, the new people drawn to square dancing will have a place to dance.

Two points in closing: (1) If you try the Condensed Teaching Order, you *must* offer club dancing at this level or risk losing your graduates. (2) Don't assume that people who sign up for 12 weeks to learn 50 calls will want to continue lessons to learn full Mainstream. You've sold them the 12/50 program. Changing gears and making them feel like second-class citizens for not dancing Mainstream would not put us in a good light. *Nick Martellacci, Caller (718-624-5665)*

Breakdown!

Has your square ever broken down? (Ha-ha!) Former CCNJ president Dan Koft penned some great advice on fixing a breakdown in the May 2015 issue of *Grand Square* (page 20), and it is reprinted in part below. To help you remember this advice, Tomás Gonzalez of Hunterdon Flutterwheels has summarized it in limerick form. Enjoy!

Repairing the square during a patter call: Don't panic or argue, as this only wastes dance time; just reset and get back to dancing as quickly as possible. If you and another dancer are going for the same spot, both should look for the open spot. The closer dancer (preferably) should get there to keep the square moving. Your fellow dancers or the caller will fix the issues while you dance or when you get back home. If a correction cannot be made quickly, then everyone should square up at home. Once there, you can either wait for the beginning of the next sequence or get back to dancing faster by forming lines. To make lines, have each head lady take hands with her partner; then both slide over next to the side couple to the right to make lines at the sides. Once there, wait for the call Lines Forward and Back or something similar (such as "We've got normal lines"), and rejoin the dancing. You may have to fix things on the Promenade home, but at least you had more dancing time.

During a Patter When Something's the Matter When you break down and all goes amiss, To repair your stopped square just do this: Race back to your place, Then form lines that face, And you'll find that there's not much you'll miss.

Repairing the square during a singer: If you are not sure how to correct it, find your next corner and wait for the Swing and Promenade. For those dancers not yet aware, the normal pattern of a singer is for the lady to progress from her partner to her corner, then the next two corners, and eventually back to her original partner. Therefore, you want to look for your (next) corner if a breakdown occurs during a singer. If you can't find your corner quickly, look for the other open dancer (there will be someone else looking for a corner, I promise) and swing that person. Again, this way the square keeps moving, and eventually you will get back to your original partner. Just keep going, folks!


When Things Go Wrong to a Song

When the caller is singing a song And your square has gone hopelessly wrong, Square up and get set For a call that will let You get right back to dancing along.

Thanks to Dan Koft and Tomás Gonzalez - let's keep dancing!

EASY DOES IT

When taking another's hand during a call, please take hold loosely and gently ... and then release quickly. Never grip a hand or continue holding while going on to the next dancer or call. Very loose holds will keep hands happy and the square moving.





Diane Coffman, Curtis Kraut, Barbara and John Marlowe, and Francesca and Wes Thielke were among four squares of dancers at Cherry Ridge sharpening their skills in C1. We know that we need to allow our new dancers to actually dance at their level, which as a Plus club we have not been doing well. So our class coordinators, teachers, and the other board members are going out a limb, looking for a new way to bring our beloved activity to more people and to grow our club.

Squares and Rounds at a Dance: It's All in the Timing

Did you know that a typical square dance has the same number of tips, regardless of whether or not round dancing is offered? According to our callers, they need about seven or eight minutes to rest their voices between tips. Whether dancers use those minutes for socializing or round dancing or another type of dancing, the amount of square dance time is not affected.

Square and round dancers: Let's work together to ensure the most dance time possible! When you hear dance music, that's your invitation to get on the floor. When dancers get on and off the dance floor guickly at the end of a tip or rounds segment, the next type of dancing can begin promptly. That means more dancing fun for everyone.

Non-round dancers, please socialize on the sidelines to enable the cuer to be heard easily. Everyone, let's respect the time allotted to each type of dancing to ensure a great event for all dancers. Jan Thompson
