

NNJSDA Presidents' Message

Dear Dancers! Many of you reading this magazine are NEW dancers, having recently graduated from a local class. We hope you will use the information in this issue of *Grand Square* to attend many dances. We welcome you into an activity we cherish, and into our square!



You know the phrase "use it or lose it"? Well, that applies to your newly gained skills. Dancing in a class with people you have come to know well and a caller you have grown used to is the first step. The next steps start this summer: Dance with as many callers and new people as you can. If you attended any class-level dances, you know it's a bit more challenging than in your weekly class. Some call fast, some are slower; some may be difficult to understand at first because of enunciation or a little twang. Don't feel discouraged! As you become more familiar with how calls flow together, you will come to value the unique talents of our many callers.

You are welcome and appreciated! You are the future of square dancing in our area, and we want you to succeed and to have FUN! When that new tip starts, please get up right away to fill an existing square or start a new one, holding your hand high to signal others to join you. Solo dancers: There are plenty of people who want to be your partner.

The NNJSDA has four summer Mainstream dances (see cover and page 4 in this issue). Through our Freeloader program, you can even earn a dangle and a free ticket for a future dance by attending at least three summer dances plus the Mini-Festival on November 12 (see page 33). Check your graduation packet for the Freeloader form, or pick one up at an NNJSDA dance.

Now a word to our experienced dancers: We are all impacted when clubs close or struggle to stay active. One solution is improving retention of our graduates (more than 70 this spring). Many will not be dancing a year from now if we (that means you, too!) do not encourage them. Invite your graduates to carpool to summer dances; invite them into your square if you see them sitting on the sidelines; and smile when you are dancing! Newer dancers are often reluctant to get into a square at the beginning of a tip. Be proactive.

At a recent event, a new dancer was so disappointed that she could not get into a square. How nice it would have been for an experienced dancer to notice her sitting out and make room for her in the square. Of course, we got her into our square for the next tip. Was it perfect? Nope, but we laughed and had fun.

Do you want your club to survive and, even better, to thrive? Then let's all be part of retaining the members of the Class of 2017 by helping to ensure they have positive experiences. It's a simple formula. The more we dance, the better we become, and the more enjoyable the experience for everyone in the square. And, possibly, the more the new dancers will stay involved.

Suggestion from a caller, for experienced dancers: *Invite* new dancers to ride with you to a dance. Switch partners with the new dancers a few times and go to different squares. This will help them become more confident, more quickly.

Bio: Sigrid Eisele

Square dancing has provided three decades of enjoyment for Sigrid Eisele, assistant treasurer of the NNJSDA since 2009.

Sig was raised in Newark, spending summers and weekends at her family's home in Towaco, where she eventually lived full time. Active as a teen and adult, Sig roller-skated at the Florham Park rink, rode her bike, and swam. She also danced at what were then called hoedowns. 

To Your Health: Salutes to the Benefits of Square Dancing

This is the first article in a feature dedicated to the benefits we derive from square dancing. More than just for fun and as a recreational activity, square dancing has long been touted as providing beneficial effects on one's physical and mental well-being. For example, the *New York Times* recently reported on a study of **decline** in the brain's white matter through aging (<u>nyti.ms/2opXvsf</u>). However, among older research subjects, those who did contra and country dancing (versus brisk walking) actually **increased** their brains' white matter, presumably through a combination of cognitive, physical, and social stimulation.

In this space, you are invited to share: "What square dancing has done for me." In addition to anecdotal, personal accounts of square dancing's health benefits, we hope to post the opinions and comments of our members who have had professional experience in such areas as medicine, physical therapy, physical education, rehabilitation, and other fields in which dance may have had a role in improving the quality of life. So, let us begin with this invitation:

Request to Attest

Can I get a shout-out or witness
Who says dancing improved your fitness?
Has the square dancing act
Had a greater impact
Than to merely have made you sit less?

Let me be the first "witness" to what square dancing has done for me. After six weeks of cardio-rehab following a heart attack, I wondered, "Where do I go from here?" I knew that a rigorous regimen of exercise would be required, and looked for a painless way to incorporate it into my life. Recalling how much I had enjoyed square dancing almost 40 years earlier, it was just my luck to find a club about to start a Mainstream class the next weekend! In the beginning, I might as well have been sleepwalking, but gradually I returned to the land of the living. Square dancing was a great way to advance my recovery, and has been an ongoing way to maintain an active lifestyle as well as to meet new and interesting people. Life is good ... square dancing makes it better.

Another testimonial: My mother-in-law, "Bunny" Fischman, has been a dancer all her life. As a young woman, she was actively involved in folk dancing in the New York area. When she heard that a dance entrepreneur named Arthur Murray had gone out west in search of a folk dance instructor, she contacted him. There was someone in New York who could do the job, and *she* was that person! Among the dances she taught was a form of square dancing that predated the codified western style we know today. She went on to teach ballroom dancing through Murray's studio and then, for many years (even through the "disco era"), as part of Parsippany's continuing education program. Many factors contribute to longevity, but Bunny has no doubt that dance has played a major role in her enjoyment of a long and healthy life. She looks forward to celebrating – and dancing at – her 100th birthday this July.

Caller Crowd-Pleasers

<u>Todd Fellegy</u>: Five couples wanted to square up for the last tip — not enough for two squares, but too many for one square. Todd offered to call the tip for six couples, so we persuaded two dancers who were on their way out to stay and join us. The formation was a rectangle rather than a square, with two couples in each head position and one couple in each side position. That was the smoothest and best tip of the night.

<u>Betsy Gotta</u>: Betsy always uses music that speaks to her, and my favorite was the Hooked on Classics she used at Rockytops – great beat to the "Toreador Song" from *Carmen* ... very exciting!

<u>Dan Tapper</u>: I love Dan's wonderful voice on rocking singing calls from the '50s as well as his friendly, upbeat, kind personality (with some gentle humor thrown in). He is also a superb teacher – organized, observant, encouraging.

Howard Richman: I recently had two back-to-back dance experiences. On the first night, a caller used the same 15 calls repeatedly, had no eye contact with the dancers, and seemed unprepared. A few nights later, it was totally different with Howard Richman calling. He was enthusiastic, organized, and had us dance a square-within-a-square. What fun! One last comment: A little humor goes a long way. The caller doesn't need to be a stand-up comic, but sharing a laugh with friends or strangers is always a good thing. \odot

<u>Dayle Hodge</u>: A man in a kilt could be the definition of confidence! Dayle combines that confidence with complex and unusual call combinations, a beautiful singing voice, intelligent sense of humor, and great interactions with dancers.

<u>Paul and Stephen Ingis</u>: We were short one man in a square, so Stephen danced while calling, using a wireless headset microphone ... what fun! And how can one resist dancing to Paul's singing call, "Cheeseburger in Paradise"?

Betsy Gotta, Howard Richman: We danced rectangle tips at two events, and both callers were absolutely fabulous at moving six couples (four heads and two sides) around the floor seamlessly. The rectangle formation could be a wonderful "special tip" at a dance or a theme for an evening.

The Association sponsors four incentive programs – two for dancers, two for member clubs. Take advantage of them!


<u>Freeloader</u>: Attend three NNJSDA summer dances plus the Mini-Festival in the same year; earn a free dance coupon and a dangle.

Let's Welcome Our New Dancers: Do you remember when you were a new graduate and how uncomfortable you were going out onto the dance floor, so afraid that you would make a mistake or two? Do you remember how friendly and welcoming most dancers were, while others weren't as kind when you met them or danced with them? We do. We remember making sure that we weren't in a square with certain people. The more nervous we were with the situation, the more mistakes we made. But we do have to thank the people who welcomed us into their square, regardless of our amateur dancing skills.

Now fast forward: You are the experienced dancer. It's your chance to welcome the new dancers and to be kind, not judgmental. Don't you want to be the person they remember fondly, and not the one they want to avoid at every dance? Try to be encouraging rather than discouraging. If they are going the wrong way, give them a slight nudge in the right direction. When forming a square, invite them in so that they will be with stronger dancers.

Be the square dancer who is kind, friendly, and helpful. Go to club and NNJSDA dances. Support the graduates from your own and neighboring clubs.

Graduations are now taking place, and new dancers will be on the floor. Let's welcome them with open arms. They are the future of square dancing. Make square dancing enjoyable for everyone.

After the first half hour of Challenge 1, a quick count of the room put the attendance at 23: frustratingly, one shy of a third square. Imagine my surprise – no, make that panic! – when Rich Baumeister came over and said, "We need you to fill out the third square." "Me? I don't even dance *Advanced*," I protested. "Don't worry, we'll get you through; you can do it," was his reassuring reply. And so, for more than an hour, I did indeed get through it. I followed the cues of my fellow dancers, not just in my squares but in others, where I attempted to mimic the movements of my positional counterpart.

I got keen satisfaction from holding my own. But it was especially rewarding, during each tip, to enable seven people to dance who otherwise would have had to sit out.

TIPS FOR THOSE WHO BOOK CALLERS

Thank you to all club members who take on the task of booking callers. What would a dance be without them?! Some tips to ensure a smooth process:

Hire each caller/cuer at least one year in advance.

facebook.com/hunterdonflutterwheels

- Suggest a fee that your club can afford, and be open to negotiate.
- Provide at least two cell phone numbers that can be used in case of emergency en route to a dance, and obtain the caller's cell phone number.
- Contact the caller two weeks prior to the dance to verify or update all details, ensure
 that cell phone numbers for club and caller are current, and provide driving
 directions if needed (especially if construction has caused detours).

Following these suggestions could save both the caller/cuer and the club from potential problems on the day of the dance.

Squares and Rounds at a Dance: It's All in the Timing

A typical square dance has the same number of tips, regardless of whether or not round dancing is offered. Our callers need seven or eight minutes to rest their voices between tips. Whether dancers use those minutes for socializing or round dancing or another type of dancing, the amount of square dance time is not affected.

Square and round dancers: Let's work together to ensure the most dance time possible! When you hear dance music, that's your invitation to get on the floor. When dancers get on and off the dance floor quickly at the end of a tip or rounds segment, the next type of dancing can begin promptly. That means more dancing fun for everyone.

Non-round dancers, please socialize on the sidelines to enable the cuer to be heard easily. Everyone, let's respect the time allotted to each type of dancing to ensure a great event for all dancers.





When I became president of Times Squares two years ago, I had ambitious thoughts that we could change the course of square dancing. Now that I have passed the torch to our next president (Warren Livesley), I have been thinking about some of the things we did in the last two years.

One of our first acts was to redo our website to make it cleaner and more inviting. A square dance club website should quickly convey to readers why they will like square dancing, when and where they can do it, and what they can expect – fun, friendship, and mental as well as physical well-being. This should be done with a few well-chosen words and video or action photos. Although we were able to clean up our site considerably, it's still not perfect.

In conjunction with our redo of the website, we attempted to increase our social media presence. Knowing how to use Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest, Instagram, and Meetup is now an essential skill. We are using Meetup fairly successfully to generate new leads and get people to our outreach activities. It's a steep learning curve, but vital for success. What we've learned is that being successful at social media takes a lot of time and effort.

We need to make it easier for people to start square dancing. One method we've used to accomplish this is to rebrand our introductory evenings as "dance parties." The best way to get people interested in square dancing is to give them a good night out. This means getting them up and dancing right away, so I ask our dance party callers to be more "dancey" and less "teachy." If participants have a good time, they might be inclined to attend another dance party and maybe sign up for classes in the future. It's better for a one-time attendee to have a good time than to try it and not like it.

Another thing we tackled was making our dances more accessible by purchasing an assisted listening system, which offers a much more satisfying experience to dancers with hearing loss. We were fortunate to have several highly motivated volunteers who spearheaded the purchase of the equipment and a supportive membership that gave generously to pay for it. I believe we should offer this service at all dances, and clubs should make the effort to have this equipment as part of their standard setup.

These are just a few examples from the past two years. In the next issue, you'll hear about some of our new president's plans for the future of our club. I hope that sharing these thoughts will enable you to use our experiences to benefit your own club and square dancing in general. If you have questions about what we've done or want further discussion, feel free to reach out to me.

NEW JERSEY STATE OUTFIT

Square dance conventions and other gatherings hold a Parade of States or Grand March, during which dancers march in by state. Dancers from a given state usually wear the same outfit or color combination. Let's have a sea of green at the National Convention in Ohio this June!

The New Jersey state outfit colors are kelly green and white, based on the "Garden State" concept. (Examples of kelly green are the *labels* on Schweppes and Seagram's ginger ale bottles.) Each dancer should also have a New Jersey emblem (see picture on left). It can be purchased for \$7.50 at any NNJSDA dance or through the website.

The state emblem consists of a 9" kelly green and white embroidered outline of New Jersey, with an embroidered gold star

(to be placed at the location of the dancer's home club) and an embroidered "NJ." The emblem should be sewn or pinned in a prominent, but tasteful, location such as:

- Back of a kelly green vest with white top-stitching, worn over a white shirt or blouse
- · Back of a kelly green or white shirt or blouse
- · Side or center front of a kelly green or white skirt or dress
- On a green overskirt/apron trimmed with white eyelet

Vest patterns (for men and women) can be borrowed from the Association's assistant treasurer. Pants for both men and women should be white, kelly green, or black. Possible outfits can be seen on the dolls on the NNJSDA carousel, which are displayed at each Mini-Festival. Photos are on the website (nnjsda.org/state_outfit).
