FOR CLUBS

One Square Is Fair benefits your club with a dues reduction when eight club members (one square) attend at least five of the scheduled NNJSDA dances. Officially registered students may be counted at the Midterm Student Dance.

Raids benefit your club with a dues reduction when at least eight club members (one square) attend other member clubs' eligible dances from June 1 through the following May 31. Program is based on the mileage between clubs, with the goal being 200 miles.

Visitations benefit your club with a dues reduction when at least five club members (who are not also members of the visited club) attend other member clubs' eligible dances from June 1 through the following May 31. Points are awarded for each visit, based on the number of club members visiting, with a goal of 60 points.

Download the One Square Is Fair, Raid, and Visitation program forms at *nnjsda.org* (see Documents for Clubs). Forms are signed by officers at the dances attended and forwarded to the NNJSDA secretary upon completion.

In 1974, the dancers formally organized as the Bee Sharps Square Dance Club, with Dick Jones as the club caller and Nancy and Max Nosker as club cuers (yes, we had rounds right from the start).



Times Squares will be celebrating its 40th anniversary this year and we are looking forward to a year of increased visibility and growth. The club has seen attendance pick up after the pandemic – both members and interested newcomers – and we hope this means people are looking for more social interaction and fun through square dancing. 




